Public Works Superintendent Matt Stoffel - Hancock Parks grant

The City Parks Department was granted \$4,000.00 in 2015 from the Hancock Parks Grant for work to be done on Riverside Park shelter house roofing in 2016. A transfer of \$4,000.00 from the Hancock Parks grant to the General Fund, project #31956700 for shelter house roof repair is requested. An add-on ordinance or resolution will be created.

City Engineer Brian Thomas - ODOT FY17 Resurfacing (PID100181), Project No. 32860600

The City is eligible for Federal Urban Allocation Funds administered through the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT). The above – referenced project is eligible for this type of funding. For the past few years, the funds have been used for resurfacing, and funds are planned for resurfacing again in 2017. The project is estimated at \$754,000 with 80% being funded by ODOT and 20% from the City. The City's matching share is included in the 2017 5-year Capital Improvements Plan. Legislation authorizing the Service-Safety Director to enter into the project agreement with ODOT is requested. Resolution No. 009-2019 was created.

PRECIPITATION & RESERVOIR LEVELS

Total precipitation recorded at the City of Findlay Water Pollution Control Center was 6.49 inches of rain and traces of snow for the fourth quarter (Oct-Dec) of 2015.

At the end of December, the Findlay reservoirs stood at 80% of capacity. This reservoir level represents a 932 day water supply at the city's current use.

Water treated at the plant totaled 503.46 million gallons for the fourth quarter (Oct-Dec) of 2015. Water treated per day at the City of Findlay Water Treatment Plant averaged 5.47 million gallons (MG).

NEW BUSINESS

Recreation Summit: Schmelzer introduced Lisa Mansfield. Mansfield has been promoted to Assistant Recreation Supervisor. She will move into the Recreation Supervisor position when Lu Draper retires. Brendon Schwiebert resigned. Mansfield reported that the Recreation Summit will be held in February 2016. All recreation partners will be invited to participate. A full session will be held and then partners will move to break out sessions for 15 minutes to brainstorm. Discussions will included existing or new facilities; additional programming what infrastructure will be needed for the additional programming. The summit is for bringing ideas, not determining cost. It was suggested that a brief survey be sent to new employees of the five largest companies in Findlay to determine their interests for recreation opportunities in Findlay.

Hunting at Reservoir: Schmelzer stated that he recently received a request for a permit to hunt water fowl with a gun at the reservoir. The Water Treatment Plant issues these water fowl hunting permits for the reservoir for the City of Findlay. Approximately 10 permits are issued each year to interested persons. Schmelzer stated that to his knowledge gun hunting for water fowl at the reservoir has not been an issue in the past. There is no criteria for issuing a permit other than proof of a valid hunting license. There is no cap on the number of permits issued each year. Mansfield stated that the Village of McComb allows hunting at its reservoir to reduce the number of geese inhabiting the area. Pruitt stated that hunting at the reservoir could cause an accident as it conflicts with those persons boating, running, walking around the reservoir. Schmelzer stated that maybe the City should implement a policy that only one corner of the reservoir be permitted to hunt not all of the reservoir. It was suggested that a representative of the Ohio Department of Natural Resources come to a board meeting to discuss and include Jeff Newcomer, Superintendent of Water Treatment.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Recreation Department Report: Mansfield reported that the James Farrel Award for Diamonds. It is an award for excellence for the complex field and concessions. ASA USA group has awarded the July 2017 U10 National Softball tournament to Findlay. Adding Lacrosse to the Recreation Department's programs is on the radar. The University of Findlay Women's coach and Athletic Director is organizing a coach volunteer assisted clinic with a Columbus area organization being scheduled for spring break timeframe. They have requested to use the football complex. Will use clinic to gauge interest in forming a league.

<u>Parks Maintenance Department Report</u>: Stoffel stated that they are still working at Swale Park. Green Waste Site is closed for the season except for Christmas Tree drop off. Stoffel thanked Pruitt and the Hancock Park District for the donation of a tree for the City's Christmas Tree displayed in Dorney Plaza.

OTHER REPORTS

<u>Hancock Park District Report</u>: Pruitt reported that if all goes well, 2016 will have good upgrades for customer service, online reservations will be available with credit card payment capability. The HPD website was upgraded.

OTHER BUSINESS

Next Meeting: The next meeting of the Parks and Recreation Board is scheduled for TUESDAY, January 19, 2016, at 4:00pm in the third floor conference room of the Municipal Building.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SERVICE-SAFETY DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF FINDLAY, OHIO, TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS WHERE REQUIRED AND ENTER INTO A CONTRACT OR CONTRACTS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF VARIOUS PROJECTS, APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR SAID PROJECTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Findlay, State of Ohio, two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1: That the Service-Safety Director of the City of Findlay be and he is hereby authorized to advertise for bids where necessary pursuant to law and enter into contracts for construction of various projects as set forth in the capital improvements program for the year 2016.

SECTION 2: That to pay for start-up costs and project construction costs there is hereby appropriated and transferred the following sums;

SECTION 3: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Findlay, Ohio, and for the further reason it is immediately necessary to appropriate said funds so that these projects may proceed expeditiously and within the construction season.
