By authorization of Ordinance No. 2020-099, a bid opening was held for this project on December 18, 2020. Bids were received from ten (10) potential contractors with bid amounts ranging from \$1,301,755.02 to \$1,908,307.92. The lowest and best bid was received from Helms and Sons Excavating of Findlay, Ohio. The bid results were submitted to the Hancock County Commissioners. The City has received funds from the Commissioners so that the City can enter into a contract with the low bidder to perform the work. Funds need to be appropriated into the project so that a purchase order can be approved and contracts can be signed. Legislation to appropriate funds is requested. Ordinance No. 2021-015 was created.

Board of Zoning Appeals November 12, 2020

Members present: Chairman, Phil Rooney; Blaine Wells; Sarah Gillespie; and Scott Brecheisen.

Mr. Rooney called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.; introduced the members to the audience and the general rules were reviewed.

The following was introduced by Mr. Adkins:

Case Number: 60411-BA-20

Address: 814 Washington Avenue

Zone: R-2 Single Family, Medium Density

Filed Patsy Wooley, regarding a variance from section 1122.05(A) of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance concerning an addition at 814 Washington Avenue. The applicant is proposing an 8 X 10 addition that will be 9-feet from the Washington Avenue right-of-way. This section states that the addition must meet a 25-foot front yard setback.

The property sits approximately 9.1-feet from the Washington Avenue right-of-way, and the property to the south is approximately 30.1-feet from the Washington Avenue right-of-way. When averaging the north and south neighboring properties building lines, the addition would need to be at approximately 19.6-feet from the Washington Avenue right-of-way. The variance request is large, however, if granted, the new building line would be in harmony with the property to the north. If this parcel were never split, the building line for the parcel would have already been established with the dwelling to the north.

Mr. Ed Kumer, 814 Washington Avenue, was sworn in. He stated they rent off of his wife's mother. He stated they currently have a small porch on the front and would like to extend it by three (3) feet long and put an eight (8) feet overhang over it. He stated he has letters from three neighbors that do not have a problem with what they want to do.

Mr. Wells asked if the new deck was simply going to be 3-feet closer to the right-of-way than the existing one?

Mr. Kumer stated that was correct.

Mr. Wells asked if that would be in harmony with the neighbors to the north?

Mr. Adkins stated yes, they are at 9.1 and would be in line with them.

Mr. Wells asked if there where any other communications, other than the letters?

The applicant has constructed a 6-foot high privacy fence in the required front yard. This section states that fences in the required front yard may not exceed forty-eight inches in height and shall be fifty percent open.

The owner's contractor begun installation prior to obtaining a zoning permit and probably would have continued had the zoning inspector did not call to stop construction. Upon the homeowners then applying for a permit, it was discovered that the front end of the fence would encroach into the required front yard. The front yard abuts the dead end of Breezewood Court and runs parallel with the rear yards of the neighbors on Amelia Avenue. Being that Breezewood Court does dead end, and will never be expanded, the request is minimal.

Mr. Burgess, 1111 Breezewood Court, was sworn in. He stated they bought their house last spring. There was an existing fence in the same location that he is requesting the variance for. This spring a storm came through and knocked over the fence that was already there. He did not realize that he needed a fence permit to put up the fence in the same location and the contractor did not tell him he needed a permit. The fence also doubles as a backyard fence for the people next to him so they can keep their dogs from escaping. The fence also hides the pile of junk and debris of the neighbors, so when they look out their front window, they do not have to see the neighbor's junk. There is also a stretch of 6-feet high fencing along there and the fence they put up is right in the middle of that.

Mr. Rooney asked if there are any communications on this case.

Mr. Adkins stated there are no communications on this case.

Mr. Wells made a motion to approve the requested variance subject to obtaining the proper permits within 60 days.

Ms. Gillespie seconded the motion.

Main Street. The applicant is proposing to construct new 67-foot tall silos on-site. This section allows for a maximum height of 60-feet.

The owner is proposing to build new silos on site for raw storage in the rear of the property, near the building. In 2017, the owner was granted a variance for 14-feet above the allowable 60-foot height requirement. With precedence for the site being set per case number 55670-BA-17, the city does not oppose the granting of the variance as requested.

Mr. Jason Johnston, a Valfilm Supervisor, was sworn in. He stated there are twelve (12) existing silos and they want to build four (4) more that will be a little larger in diameter and a little taller at 67-feet. They will actually be 61-feet tall but they are requesting 67-feet to allow room for conduit, etc. He continued to speak..... (inaudible).

Mr. Trombley clarified there are eight (8) silos at 40-feet, but what do they store?

Mr. Johnston stated they store plastic resin pellets.

Mr. Trombley asked why are they wanting them to be taller instead of larger in diameter?

Mr. Johnston stated he is unsure of why that is the company's decision.

Mr. Trombley asked is there are any communications on this case?

Mr. Adkins stated there were a couple of communications on this case. We did receive a call from two (2) different men, but once they heard the scope of the project, they were okay with it. He also read into record an email received from Debbie Mercer, whom stated she is concerned the silos will impact the lighting in her house, and she continues to experience water run off during heavy rains into her front yard, which also carry the cigarette butts from the Valfilm workers, into her yard. She states, it is her opinion that Valfilm shouldn't hinder her view from the front of her property which has already been significantly impacted.

Mr. Wells asked what her address is?

Mr. Adkins stated her address is 125 Rutherford. Her view is looking at the addition that is already there. The new silos will be behind that addition.

Mr. Wells stated the new silos will not further impede her view., correct?

Mr. Johnston stated, that is correct.

Mr. Trombley asked if there will be lighting on the top of the silos and if the light will be facing downward instead of outward?

Mr. Johnston stated the lighting will be very minimal and will face downward..... (inaudible).

Mr. Trombley stated he doesn't feel that any of the neighboring residents will be impacted by the silos and they won't even see them.

Mr. Wells made a motion to approve the requested variance with the proper permits within 60 days. He suggested that Valfilm reach out to the neighbor that has grievances and try to address the complaints with her.

Mr. Trombley seconded the motion.

Motion to approve the variance as requested, subject to obtaining the required permits within 60 days, 5-0.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Findlay, Ohio, and for the further reason it is immediately necessary to authorize entering aforementioned contract so that the City of Findlay may pursue purchasing of City equipment, materials, supplies and services at a discounted price,

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
