City Engineer Kalb – fifth Capital Improvement appropriation of 2021

City Engineer Kalb – Bittersweet Drive and Bluebonnet Drive Sanitary Sewer, Project No. 35601200

The Bittersweet Drive and Bluebonnet Drive Sanitary Sewer Project has been a well discussed project in numerous Council and committee meetings. The original scope of the project involved installing the sanitary sewer in the grass off the edge of the roadway. After construction was started, it was found that there was an existing storm line that was very close to the alignment of the new sanitary sewer. Due to the depth of the sanitary, it was decided to relocate the sanitary to avoid any conflict with the existing utilities in the area. Since this project is outside of city limits and the road is under Liberty Township's jurisdiction, the City consulted with Liberty Township and the County Engineer to determine a new location for the sanitary sewer. The Township and County advised the City that they would prefer the sanitary lines be placed in the middle of the roadway. Additional work and backfill material was needed due to the new location of the sanitary in order to complete the project because the sanitary line was now under the pavement. An additional seventy-seven thousand three hundred twenty dollars and sixty-nine cents (\$77,320.69) is needed to compensate the contractor for the additional work. Legislation it appropriate and transfer funds is requested. Ordinance No. 2021-100 was created.

City Engineer Kalb – sidewalk insurance bond

A concrete sidewalk was recently installed by Chris's Concrete for a resident that was not installed within the specifications of the City of Findlay standards. The concrete walk was inspected by the City's Street Department and the contractor was notified of the defects and what standards that were not met. The contractor was nonresponsive, therefore, the insurance bond will need to be executed to have the Street Department repair the sidewalk to the City's standards. Legislation to appropriate and transfer insurance bond funds to the Street Department so that the sidewalk may be repaired this year is requested. <u>Ordinance No. 2021-101 was created</u>.

Income Tax Board minutes – October 11, 2021.

Under NEW BUSINESS in these minutes, there is a request to waive formal advertising and bidding requirements and enter into a new contract with Scott Basinger to provide legal services (due to Roger Rader's retirement). Mr. Basinger has already been filing cases for Findlay Municipal Court for garnishment collection. The number of cases have increased, as well as Municipal Court's fees have also increased. <u>Ordinance No.</u> 2021-102 was created.

Service-Safety Director Martin – IAFF (FFD) contract renewal 2022-2024 (3) years

The current three (3) year Fire Union contract expires on December 31, 2021. Over the recent months, Service-Safety Director Martin, Fire Chief Eberle, and the Fire Union have been negotiating a new contract for a three (3) year term to include years 2022-2024. The negotiations went well, and both parties feel the contract is amicable. It is imperative to continue to collaborate with the Union to find common ground in exhibiting the City's appreciation for the Fire Department's dedication to the City of Findlay. The tentative agreement was voted on by the Union body in August 2021 and was passed by their body. Legislation for Council to vote on this ratified contracted, as well as an Executive Session to discuss the details of this contract, if necessary, during the October 19, 2021 Regular Session City Council meeting, is requested. Ordinance No. 2021-103 was created.

Service-Safety Director Martin - OPBA (FPD) contract renewal 2022-2024 (3) years

The current three (3) year Police Union contract expires on December 31, 2021. Over the recent months, Service-Safety Director Martin, Police Chief Ring, and the Police Union have been negotiating a new contract for a three (3) year term to include year's 2022-2024. The negotiations went well with healthy discussion by all involved. Understanding the current National climate for police work in addition to the strain the pandemic has caused on all associates, it was imperative to continue to collaborate with the Union to find common ground in exhibiting the City's appreciate of our Safety Service's dedication. A large focus of the discussion evolved around the recruitment of highly qualified candidates, as well as the retention of strong performing police force. The contract was voted on by the Union body on October 12, 2021 where it was passed by their body. Legislation for Council to vote on this ratified contracted, as well as an Executive Session to discuss the details of this contract, , if necessary during the October 19, 2021 Regular Session City Council meeting, is requested. Ordinance No. 2021-104 was created.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

The WATER AND SEWER COMMITTEE met on October 4, 2021 to discuss water regulations.

We recommend no action needed by Council.

The **STREETS**, **SIDEWALKS & PARKING COMMITTEE** met on October 5, 2021 to continue September 7, 2021 discussions on carriage/service walks. We recommend to take out the carriage walks when disrupted by construction in the right-of-way no matter if parking is allowed or not because of Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA).

The STREETS, SIDEWALKS & PARKING COMMITTEE met on October 5, 2021 to continue September 7, 2021 discussions on boulevard/right-ofway use.

We recommend to table boulevard/right-of-way use due to lack of information.

The STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE met on October 11 and 12, 2021 to review Request for Proposals (RFP) presentations.

We recommend to continue the selection process to choose a consultant to assist in the strategic planning process. Next meeting is Tuesday, October 19, 2021.

The **PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE** to whom was referred a request from Keith Tennant to vacate the east-west alley between Lot 149 and 150 in the Country Club Acres 2nd Addition from Londonderry Drive to the east dead end.

We recommend approval as requested. Ordinance No. 2021-105 was created.

The **PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE** to whom was referred a request from Van Horn, Hoover & Associates, Inc. on behalf of property owner TELA, Inc. and Terrence Connor, to rezone the area consisting of the two hundred eight feet (208'), plus or minus, east of Park Street, and the four hundred sixty feet (460') north of Oakland Avenue from I-1 Light Industrial to R-4 Duplex/Triplex, High Density.

We recommend approve as requested. Ordinance No. 2021-106 was created.

The **PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE** to whom was referred a request from Brian Buck on behalf of his father William Buck to rezone Madison Avenue Lot 6192, 6193, 6194 from R3 Single Family High Density to C1 Local Commercial District. 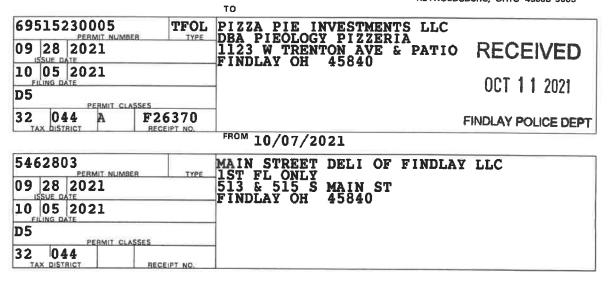

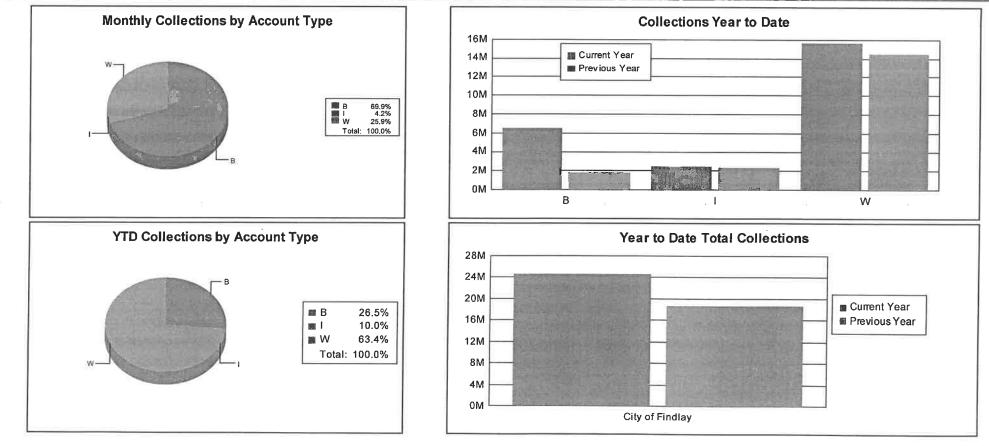

The City of Findlay Water Treatment Plant treated 578.37 million gallons of water in the third quarter of 2021. That is an average of 6.29 million gallons per day.

1. APPLICATION FOR PRELIMINARY PLAT #PP-02-2021 for the Tall Timbers 3rd Addition Subdivision located in part of the Northeast ¼ of Section 4, Findlay, Ohio.

CPC STAFF

General Information

This request is in the Tall Timbers 3rd Addition just south of County Road 212. This location is not located within the 100-year floodplain. The City of Findlay Land Use Plan designates the area as Industrial.

Staff Analysis

The proposed plat would create three parcels on the site. Parcel 1 would have a cul-de-sac at the end of the stub driveway. The remaining land would be split into two new parcels. On the west side, parcel 2 is a 42.445-acre parcel that is entirely wooded. On the east side, parcel 3 would be 21.360 acres in size. A fifty-foot gas line easement runs diagonally from the northwest corner to the southeast corner of lot 3.

General Information

This request is located on the east side of Brookside Drive north of Redbird Drive. It is zoned R-1 Large Lot Residential. It is surrounded by R-1 Large Lot Residential. To the west is Emory Adams Park, which is zoned PO- Parks and Open Space. It is not located within the 100-year flood plain. The City of Findlay Land Use Plan designates the area as Single Family Large Lot.

Parcel History

This is currently the site is currently a residential home.

Staff Analysis

The site is located in a residential neighborhood in Southeast Findlay. The applicant would like to operate a bed & breakfast at the location. The bed & breakfast would cater as a meeting place for small groups interested in crafts and sewing.

The home has three bedrooms and a total living space of 1440 square feet.

The parking should not be an issue. There is a 2-car garage and the driveway could accommodate more than four cars.

Staff Recommendation

CPC Staff recommends approval of APPLICATION FOR CONDITIONAL USE #CU-07-2021 filed by Wanda Ward to create a bed & breakfast at 1815 Brookside Drive.

DISCUSSION

Applicant Wanda Ward was present to discuss the project. She has been attending events around Ohio that cater to small groups. Her proposal would allow for these types of events to occur in Findlay. Many times local church groups or friends will just need a meeting space to come together to work. She wanted to assure the Commission that this would be a quiet meeting space and not a party house.

Mayor Muryn asked if Ms. Ward would continue residing in the house, which she said no. She wanted to reaffirm that this is catering to local groups as well as out of town. Mayor Muryn noted that they could revoke the conditional use if they receive complaints about the property.

Dan DeArment asked what type of construction is planned for the site. Chris Vaughn is the project contractor. He said that they would be updating the kitchen, flooring, bathroom, and removing two trees from the backyard.

Dan DeArment asked what signage could be installed. Matt Cordonnier said they could put up a 2-foot-by-2-foot placard on the house to mark the business. Ms. Ward stated that she wanted to hang a sign from the lightpole in the front garden by the road. Erik Atkins noted that this would not fit the current code, because it was not flushed to the house. Mayor Muryn stated that she thought this could be worked through to come to an agreement. This would be no different than a family hanging a sign on the lightpole noting the family name. Matt did note that the code is clear that this would not be fitting. He said that this would be a BZA case instead, but that Erik and the applicant could work with the applicant on signage.

Matt Cordonnier asked for clarification on the number of guests could be on site at a time. He said that a condition would be appropriate to allow a maximum number. Wanda Ward noted that she would have three bedrooms. Matt said that he thought six total overnight guests would be sufficient. The idea is that this would keep the house acting like a residential property. Mayor Muryn offered that eight would give them a bit of cushion in their operation. Erik Atkins recommended that the applicant reach out to Wood County Building Department since this is transitioning from a purely residential use to a commercial use. Wanda Ward confirmed that she was in the process of working with them.

Matt Cordonnier did state that HRPC received a call from a neighbor raising concerns about this being added to the neighborhood. They were unable to attend the meeting though.

General Information

This request is located on the north side of W. Lima Street, east of Cory Street, and west of S. West Street. It is zoned R-3 Small Lot Residential. The parcel directly to the west is C-2 General Commercial. To the east, there is a mix of R-3 Small Lot Residential, C-2 General Commercial, and O1 Office/Institution. To the north and south is mostly R-3 Small Lot Residential. It is not located within the 100-year flood plain. The City of Findlay Land Use Plan designates the area as Downtown.

Parcel History

According to the Auditor, this parcel has been residential since 1900.

Staff Analysis

Grace Moore had originally applied for the conditional use at the April 2021 CPC meeting, but was unable to attend. The main concern from the discussion was that there did not appear to be enough room for parking at the back of the property. The parking spot minimum standards are 9 feet x 18 feet. The parking pad appeared to be 16.5 feet wide, which was short of the 18 feet required.

Grace Moore contacted HRPC staff and provided photos that showed that they could fit two cars in the garage. Ms. Moore added that the parking pad could also fit two cars as well. This would allow her to accommodate enough parking for the business.

She said that she would always have the sidewalk to the garage cleared, and that she would advertise that the parking was located in the back. She did confirm that there an opening in the fence by the carriage house, so if people parked out front, they could enter that way rather than go all the way to the back.

The Bittersweet and Bluebonnet Sanitary Sewer Project has been a well discussed project in numerous Council and Committee meetings. The original scope of the project involved installing the sanitary sewer in the grass off the edge of the roadway. After we started construction it was found that there was an existing storm line that was very close to the alignment of the new sanitary sewer. With the depth of the sanitary it was decided to relocate the sanitary to avoid any conflict with the existing utilities in the area. Since this project is outside of City limits and the road is under Liberty Township jurisdiction, we consulted with Liberty Township and the County Engineer to find a new location for the sanitary sewer. The Township and County advised the City that they would prefer the sanitary lines to be placed in the middle of the roadway. Due to the new location of the sanitary, additional work and backfill material was needed to complete the project since the sanitary line was now under the pavement. With the additional pavement replacement and stone backfill an additional \$77,320.69 is needing to be appropriated to the project so the contractor can be compensated for the additional work.

The City started a new contract with Scott Basinger for legal services due to Roger Rader retiring. Mr. Basinger has been filing more cases for us. Councilman Wobser asked if cases overall were increasing. Mary stated that cases have been increasing. She further stated that they have been coming up with ideas to reduce the number of cases. One way is sending out the past due collection notices.

Motion to approve the funding request with the caveat that we get a resolution or ordinance that waives the necessary potential bidding for Scott Basinger to continue through the year and for next year if necessary, by Auditor Staschiak, second by Councilman Wobser. Motion passed 4-0.

OTHER BUSINESS

Auditor Staschiak asked Mary if elevated business collections and growth are sustainable year over year or is it one off collections. Mary stated she believed that the collections and growth are sustainable year over year. The quarterly collections are coming in strong.

Being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
