Findlay Municipal Court Administrative Judge Bishop - Supreme Court of Ohio Technology grant

The Findlay Municipal Court has been awarded a Technology Grant through the Supreme Court of Ohio in the sum of nineteen thousand six hundred fifty dollars (\$19,650.00) to be used to fund a software upgrade through CourtMaster, the Court's Court Management Software. The upgrade will be for electronic filing (e-filing) of court pleadings. E-filing will improve accessibility, accuracy, and efficiency of the judicial process for all court users. Legislation to appropriate funds is requested. Ordinance No. 2022-054 was created.

City Auditor Jim Staschiak - Revenue Estimates for fiscal year 2023

City Auditor Staschiak will provide the Estimated Revenues for the next fiscal year in the July 19, 2022 City Council packet. The is the first step required under Ohio Budgetary Law is to provide best estimate figures of what is expected in revenues over the next eighteen (18) months. In order to meet the statutory requirements for the distribution of the local government money, this document should be accepted by Council during the July 19, 2022 City Council meeting so it can then be filed with the County Auditor no later than July 20. A motion for acceptance of the revenue estimates will be needed during the July 19, 2022 meeting. As required by statute, the Council Clerk has scheduled a public hearing before the meeting, notice of which must have been published ten (10) days before the hearing, during which period, two (2) copies will be available for public inspection in the City Auditor's Office. City Auditor Staschiak is requesting this letter be read into the record. The public hearing is scheduled for July 19, 2022 at 6:55pm.

City Auditor Staschiak - City Income Tax Administration Fund

One of the primary roles of the City Auditor is to monitor receipts and appropriations throughout the year to ensure the City complies with State Budgetary Law. Year to date income tax receipts are coming in higher than expected and projected for 2022, primarily due to a large influx in business net profit tax receipts. This increase in revenue necessitates an appropriation of money within the City Income Tax Administration Fund to the General Fund. This appropriation will have the effect of increasing the transfer thereby increasing the projected General Fund year-end balance by the amount listed below, but has no impact on the CIT operations Legislation to appropriate funds is requested. Ordinance No. 2022-055 was created.

City Auditor Staschiak - minimum reserve balance policy

In 2008, City Council adopted Resolution No. 2008-007 creating a minimum reserve policy for the first time. The policy required a minimum dollar amount of approximately twelve percent (12%) or one and a half (1 ½) months of the projected General Fund expenses for the current year. Although well intended, the policy was not strictly followed until 2011. Best practices state a minimum budget reserve for the City of Findlay's General Fund should consist of three (3) month expenses or approximately twenty-five percent (25%) of the City's projected General Fund budget. Following City Auditor Staschiak's urging In 2014, Council moved closer to the best practice guideline by adopting Resolution No. 002-2014 which created a minimum reserve amount of sixteen and seven tenths percent (16.7%) or two (2) months of projected General Fund expenses. In 2020, with the COVID19 pandemic underway, City Council decided not to adopt legislation increasing the minimum reserve to the best practice minimum amount of three (3) months expenses. On January 1, 2022, the City of Findlay started the year with its largest cash balances in its history with over sixty-two percent (62%) of its projected 2022 expense budget or \$21MM was the beginning carry-forward balance, \$19.9MM of which remained unappropriated. Although it is not likely this large of a balance will be maintained forever, it is in the best interest of the City and its taxpayers, to now raise the minimum reserve to a full three (3) months or projected General Fund expenses. If a need to spend into the minimum reserve, the policy currently adopted requires a plan be created and presented to Council to restore the reserve to the proper amount ensuring the spending approach is well considered. Legislation to adopting a minimum reserve balance is requested. City Auditor Staschiak is requesting this letter be read into the record. Resolution No. 018-2022 was created.

City Engineer Kalb – Cherry Street Storm Sewer Project No. 35524100

An existing storm catch basin on Cherry Street is currently draining to the sanitary sewer. With ongoing work that is being done to the brick building that is located just south of the tracks on Main Street, the developer would like to utilize the catch basin for the drainage of a new parking lot. Since additional flow will be going to the catch basin, it would desirable to the City of Findlay to ensure the storm water goes to the storm sewer system. This is a smaller project, so the City of Findlay Engineering Department reached out to a couple of local contractors to obtain a bid price from a set of plans that were developed in-house. Three (3) bids were received ranging from forty-three thousand five hundred twenty-four dollars to eighty-seven thousand nine hundred eighty-six dollars and forty-five cents (\$43,524.00 - \$87,986.45). Hohenbrink Excavating Inc. of Findlay, Ohio provided the lowest and best price. Legislation to enter into an agreement with Hohenbrink Excavating Inc. for construction, as well as appropriate and transfer funds for construction, inspection and contingency in order to complete the project is requested. Ordinance No. 2022-056 was created.

City Engineer Kalb - Public Works replacement plasma table

In May of 2022, the City of Findlay's Public Works plasma table was damaged due to a power surge that diminished the computer system on the table itself. The City of Findlay's Public Works Department uses the plasma table daily to create and build parts for various pieces of equipment across the City. Without the plasma table, new components will need to be purchased from a vendor which will prolong the downtime for a piece of equipment. Legislation to appropriate and transfer funds is requested. Ordinance No. 2022-058 was created.

City Auditor Staschiak - self-insurance fund

A Self-Insurance Fund was created many years ago in order to have money available to cover potential liabilities to the City of Findlay. It has been funded at one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) annually. Deductibles, premiums, and certain claims are paid out of this fund. A very large environmental fine was paid out of this fund. Environmental liability is one of the highest uncovered risks to the City. Several claims have been paid out of this fund over the years. Most recently, the City has seen a large increase in the number of lawsuits filed against the City and its officials. Now is the right time and would be wise to increase this fund to an annual beginning balance of two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) that will not only add additional protection to the City of Findlay against potential liability, but would also strengthen the City's ability to be selective to the liability coverage that is continually purchased form the insurance markets. City Auditor Staschiak is requesting this letter be read into the record. Ordinance No. 2022-059 was created.

Fire Chief Joshua Eberle - Robert L. Hamilton estate trust funds

The Auditor's Office was recently notified that the Findlay Fire Department is a recipient of a charitable trust from the Robert L. Hamilton estate in the amount of forty-seven thousand two dollars and twenty cents (\$47,002.20). The trust agreement stipulates that the funds be used for the purchase of equipment, not to include motor vehicles. Listed below is what the Findlay Fire Department has identified as needed equipment to purchase with these trust funds:

Findlay Fire Department - State of Ohio Office of First Responder Wellness grant

The State of Ohio Office of First Responder Wellness has a grant program that had a submission deadline of Friday, June 17, 2022. This grant is called the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) First Responder Wellness, Recruitment, Retention & Resiliency that has no local match requirement. Grant documentation states, in part, "applicants can use these funds to address the mental and behavioral health impacts of the Coronavirus pandemic on First Responder personnel." Fire Chief Eberle approached Service-Safety Director Martin last week with a grant application proposal which includes a plan to address those impacted through a physical fitness program, coupled with a mental/behavioral health assessment that Findlay Firefighters can accomplish on duty. The grant application includes:

- Training costs to certify four (4) Findlay Firefighters as Peer Fitness Trainers (estimated to be \$5,996.00)
- Fitness equipment for each fire station (estimated to be \$42,344.00)
- Contract costs for local professionals to administer mental/behavioral health evaluations, establish functional routines, and correlate data over the course of twelve (12) months (estimated to be \$7,500.00)

Due to the grant submission deadline, the fact that this is a zero-match grant and the importance of the topic of Firefighter mental and behavioral health, Service-Safety Director Martin gave approval to submit the application prior to formal Council authorization. Instead, legislation to accept the grant funding will be requested if the grant is awarded.

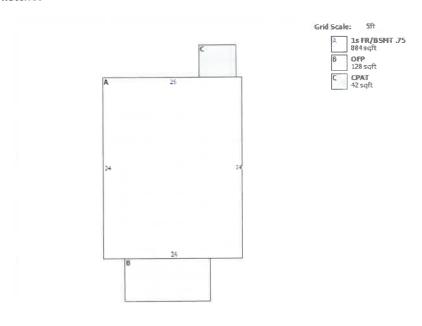

FROM: Council Clerk

City law requires persons requesting the vacation of a street or alley to file a petition with City Council. Council then refers the request to the City Planning Commission and the Planning & Zoning Committee for their findings. These Committees file their report with Council, who in turn makes the final ruling on the request.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Petition forms are available in the Council Clerk's Office. It requires the signature of a majority of the property owners that abut the requested vacation. A plat of the area shall accompany the application indicating the street or alley to be vacated. This plat can be obtained from the City Engineer's Office.

In addition to the petition for an alley vacation being signed by the abutting property owners, which is notice, if said proposed alley vacation is less than the full alley running from street to street, either north and south or east and west as the case may be, then the Clerk will also send notices to the abutting property owners on that portion of the alley extended but not in the request for vacation. For example, if an alley runs from north to south from street A to street B, intersected by a east-west alley, and the request is to vacate the alley running from street A to the intersecting east-west alley, then the abutting property owners on the remaining portion of that north-south alley between street A and street B shall also receive notice of the petition to vacate from the Council Clerk. (Rules of Procedure, as amended, of Findlay City Council).

Ideally, the petition must be signed by all abutting property owners. If not, a Public Notice of Consideration to Vacate has to be advertised in the Courier for six consecutive weeks. The cost of the advertising shall be paid by the petitioner. Anyone wishing to address Council concerning the petition may do so as a result of the publication. This can occur at any of the three readings which Council must give an Ordinance that vacates right-of-way.

FEE

At the time of submitting the request to the Council Clerk, a \$75.00 non-refundable fee shall accompany the petition. This is to off-set some of the City's expenses. Upon adoption of legislation, applicable advertising and filing fees will be invoiced to the petitioner.

ASSESSMENTS

By law, if there were assessments to the abutting properties for improvements to the street or utilities, the petitioners are to pay the assessment fee for the property being vacated. These assessments, if any, are recorded in the City Engineer's Office. They are requested to be researched for the property upon legislation request. The petitioners will be invoiced for the total expense, and it must be paid before Council will vacate the street or alley.

PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION

Planning Commission action on vacation petitions will be in the form of a recommendation to City Council. Council may then either concur with the Commission's recommendation or override it. Concurring action may be accomplished with a simple majority vote, while overriding action requires a two-thirds (2/3) vote of Council. Notice of the Planning Commission Meeting will be sent from the Engineer's Office to the filer of the petition advising him/her when the request shall be heard.

COMMITTEE ACTION

This Committee's action will be in the form of a recommendation to City Council. Council may then either concur with the Committee's recommendation or override it. Action is a simple majority vote to concur or override the Committee report. Notice of the Planning & Zoning Committee Meeting will be sent by the Council Clerk to the petitioners advising them when the request shall be heard.

CITY COUNCIL ACTION

Once the petition is placed on Council's agenda, it will be referred to the City Planning Commission and the Committee with all documentation submitted. Both the City Planning

Commission and the Planning & Zoning Committee shall review the request. Upon their findings, Council will request legislation and give it three (3) separate readings if the vacation is to proceed.

In order to vacate a public right-of-way, City Council must adopt an ordinance doing so. Normally, legislation is prepared when the Planning & Zoning Committee recommends that an action be taken. However, appropriate legislation can be drawn at the request of any Council member, whether or not the vacation is supported by the Committee. Ordinances require three readings prior to adoption, and this normally occurs over the course of three consecutive meetings of Council.

A majority affirmative vote of at least five (5) members is necessary to enact a vacation ordinance. If Council disagrees with the Planning Commission's recommendation, it will take six (6) affirmative votes of members of Council to enact a vacation ordinance. The ordinance is not effective until at least 30 days after signing by the Mayor.

GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT

By this Grant Award Agreement ("Agreement"), entered into by and between the Supreme Court of Ohio ("Court") and Findlay Municipal Court ("Recipient"), both parties agree as follows:

Section 1: Purpose

The purpose of this Agreement is to set out the parties' duties and responsibilities for the Technology Grant Fund Project ("Project"). The Project shall be implemented pursuant to Recipient's application number 1236 ("Application"), in response to the 2022 Technology Grant Fund Opportunity/Request for Grant Applications ("Request"). A copy of the Application and Request are attached at Appendices A and B and are incorporated as though fully rewritten herein, but only to the extent they do not conflict with the terms of this Agreement.

Section 2: Responsibilities of the Court

The Court shall pay Recipient \$19,650.00 to complete the Project pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The Court will issue payment within thirty days after effective date of this Agreement.

Section 3: Responsibilities of Recipient

- A. Recipient shall implement and maintain the Project pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- B. Recipient shall ensure that all equipment, software, or materials purchased for the Project are and remain Recipient's property unless the Court is notified and gives express written consent to the sale, donation, or other disposal of the equipment, software, or materials. The Court maintains a right of first refusal. If the Court owns any equipment, software, or materials purchased for the Project, the Court will transfer ownership of it to Recipient at the conclusion of the grant.
- C. Recipient agrees to provide photographs of the Project, if requested by the Court.
- D. Recipient shall maintain adequate supporting records that are consistent with generally accepted accounting practices and Recipient's purchasing policies and practices.
- E. Recipient shall provide the Court with an audit report conducted in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices. The audit report shall be provided within six months following the close of Recipient's fiscal year during the term of this Agreement. If an audit report is not available for Recipient through its local governing authority, the Court may require the audit be completed by a certified public accountant, the costs of which may not be charged to the grant. A copy of the Court's Guidelines for Audit of Grant Award Funds is attached at Appendix C.

- F. Recipient shall allow the Court and its authorized representatives access to all records kept pursuant to this Project for the purpose of any audit and examination relative to this Agreement.
- G. The Court reserves the right to request the reimbursement of all distributed Project grant funds if Recipient fails to comply with this Agreement.

Section 4: Use of Grant Funds

- A. Recipient agrees that there shall be no substantial variance from its use of grant funds as submitted in its Application and approved by the Court, without the Court's prior written approval.
- B. Project grant funds shall be expended only for one-time costs, with any resulting maintenance or ongoing support costs being Recipient's responsibility.
- C. Recipient agrees to notify the Court if Recipient encounters difficulties in the performance of or is unable to proceed with the grant activities. Under these conditions, the Court may terminate the grant and require the return of unexpended funds.
- D. Recipient agrees that any grant funds not spent or committed for the grant activities shall be returned to the Court within 60 days of this Agreement's expiration.
- E. Project grant funds shall not be expended to support any political campaign; attempt to affect the political opinion of the general public or any segment thereof; or communicate with any member or employee of Recipient who may participate in the formulation of legislation, other than through making available the results of nonpartisan analysis, study, and research.
- F. Recipient agrees that grant funds shall not be co-mingled with other funds and any interest earned on grant funds shall be accounted for separately.

Section 5: Payment Process

- A. The Court will distribute Project grant funds to Recipient in advance and on a one-time basis. The funds shall be used to purchase items as quoted in the Application. To receive payment, Recipient shall submit an executed agreement for the purchase of the items with supporting documentation to the Court at techgrant@sc.ohio.gov.
- B. Project grant funds shall be disbursed following receipt by the Court of the executed agreement for the purchase of the items and supporting documentation.
- C. Project grant funds shall not be distributed for purchase of items unless the purchase is specified in this Agreement or has been approved in advance by the Court.
- D. An invoice documenting the purchase of the items shall be reviewed and signed by Recipient's authorized representative and submitted to the Court at techgrant@sc.ohio.gov and AccountsPayable@sc.ohio.gov. Recipient shall submit the invoice within 30 days after the purchase of the items, but no later than June 30, 2023. If the invoice changes after the original

submission, Recipient shall provide the Court with an updated invoice. The Court reserves the right to demand an updated invoice from Recipient.

Section 6: Copyright and Rights to Use

The Court and any person, agency, or instrumentality assisting in the work performed under this Agreement shall have unrestricted authority to reproduce, distribute, and use, in whole or in part, any submitted report, data, or material and any other copyrighted material incorporated therein. No report, document, or other material produced, in whole or in part, with the grant funds shall be subject to copyright in the United States or any other country. Recipient shall relinquish any and all copyrights and privileges to the evaluation model, data collection process, and data developed under this Agreement, and any other copyrighted material incorporated therein.

Section 7: Public Records

Recipient understands this Agreement and all documents contained in or incorporated into it are presumed to be public records. The Court is required to allow the public to inspect and obtain copies of public records in accordance with Rules 44 through 47 of the Ohio Rules of Superintendence.

Section 8: Effective Date, Default, and Termination

- A. This Agreement shall be effective from the date of the last signature below through June 30, 2023.
- B. Except as provided in Section 9 of this Agreement, Recipient defaults under this Agreement if (1) Recipient fails to timely perform or observe any of its obligations under this Agreement, or (2) Recipient withdraws from the Project and does not remedy the failure or withdrawal within five business days of the Court's written notice of default.
- C. Except as provided in Section 9 of this Agreement, if the Court terminates this Agreement, the Court shall be responsible for reimbursing Recipient for all expenses incurred by Recipient prior to the date on which Recipient receives written notice of termination. Such written notice of termination may be sent by email.

Section 9: Force Majeure

- As used in this section, "force majeure" means acts of God, such as lightning, earthquakes, fires, storms, hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, washouts, droughts, and any other severe weather or natural calamity; epidemics, pandemics, restraint of government and people, explosions, war, strikes, and other like events; or any other cause that could not be reasonably foreseen in the exercise of ordinary care and that is beyond the reasonable control of the party.
- B. If either party is delayed in or prevented from performing or observing any of its obligations under this Agreement, other than a payment obligation, because of force majeure, the following shall apply:

- 1. If delayed, the time for performance or observance of the obligation shall be extended for a period equal to the time lost because of the force majeure event;
- 2. If prevented, the party shall be excused from performing or observing the obligation, to the extent the party took all commercially reasonable steps to mitigate or avoid the effects of the force majeure event.
- C. A party that is delayed in or prevented from performing or observing any of its obligations under this Agreement because of force majeure shall provide the other party with prompt written notice.

Section 10: Change or Modification

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and any changes or modifications shall be made in writing, signed by the parties, and attached to this Agreement. Recipient may not assign any rights, duties, or obligations described in this Agreement without the Court's written approval.

Section 11: Construction

This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted and the parties' rights determined in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio.

Section 12: Forum and Venue

All actions arising out of this Agreement shall be instituted in a court of competent subject-matter jurisdiction in Franklin County, Ohio.

Section 13: Severability

Whenever possible, each provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted in such a manner as to be effective and valid under applicable law. However, if any provision of this Agreement is held to be prohibited by or invalid under applicable law, such provision shall be ineffective only to the extent of such prohibition or invalidity, without invalidating the remainder of this Agreement.

Section 14: Responsibility for Claims

Recipient shall indemnify and hold harmless the Court from liability for injury or damage to third parties occurring during performance of activities under this Agreement to the extent caused by Recipient's negligence or willful misconduct. By operation of Ohio law, the Court cannot and therefore does not indemnify Recipient in any way.

Section 15: Certification of Funds

The Court represents that it has adequate funding available to reimburse Recipient under this Agreement. However, the Court may terminate this Agreement if its appropriations or other

revenues are reduced or, if applicable, the grant funds used to support this Project are reduced or terminated. The Court has made no promises of funding to Recipient except for the amount specified by this Agreement, and the award of this grant does not constitute a promise of future funding to Recipient.

Section 16: Dispute Resolution

The parties recognize that litigation is an expensive, resource-consuming process for resolving business disputes. Therefore, the parties agree that any controversy or dispute arising out of or relating to this Agreement, or any breach of this Agreement, they shall attempt in good faith to settle the dispute expeditiously through mediation within thirty days. The parties shall attempt to mutually agree to the provider of mediation services.

Section 17: Applicable Court Policies

In the work performed under this Agreement, Recipient agrees to comply with the Court's policies on Equal Employment Opportunity (Adm. P. 5), Alcohol and Drug Free Workplace (Adm. P. 22(A) to (C)), Weapons and Violence Free Workplace (Adm. P. 23), and Discrimination and Sexual Harassment (Adm. P. 24(A)). Copies are attached at Appendix D.

Section 18: Assignment

Recipient may not assign any rights, duties, or obligations described in this Agreement without the Court's written approval.

Section 19: Copies of Agreement

This Agreement may be executed by electronic signature and in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same Agreement.

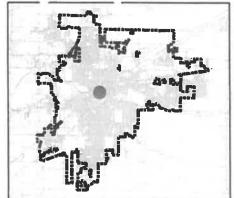

CPC STAFF

General Information

This request to the east side of Carlin Street, just south of the Gay Avenue. It is zoned O-1 Office/Institution. To the west, it is zoned O-1 and C-2 Regional Commercial. To the east is commercial, and to the north it is zoned R-3 Small Lot Residential. It is not located within the 100-year flood plain. The City of Findlay Land Use Plan designates the area as Neighborhood Commercial.

Parcel History

This site is the Family Resource Center. The building was built in 1980, and was last renovated in 2003. At the time of the renovation, they did their first parking lot expansion.

Staff Analysis

The proposed site plan would see a new front driveway that would loop the two entrances off Carlin Street. Along this driveway, they would also install an additional four handicap parking spots outside the southwest corner of the building. The driveway would be one direction going north, and the site plan notes that arrows would be painted on the ground to indicate the direction of traffic flow. Staff would recommend that the applicant consider an additional sign at the north end of the parking lot to discourage people using the north entrance of the loop.

While the building itself is not expanding, the applicant did increase the amount of foundation plants along the southeast corner of the building.

The northern parking lot would be extended to the east and wrap around the back of the building to the south. The expanded parking area would accommodate an additional eighteen (18) vehicles.

The applicant has requested a new curb cut onto Gay Avenue. Staff had a call from the neighbor saying that they were in favor of an additional curb cut. Sometimes people enter their property thinking was the entrance to the Family Resource Center. Off the curb cut, a new dumpster enclosure would be constructed. Staff would note that the enclosure needs to be six feet in height and enclose the entirety of the dumpster.

Staff Recommendation

CPC Staff recommends APPLICATION FOR SITE PLAN REVIEW #SP-12-2022 filed by the Family Resource Center, 1941 Carlin Street, to add a new drop-off drive in front and additional parking to the east of the building.

ENGINEERING

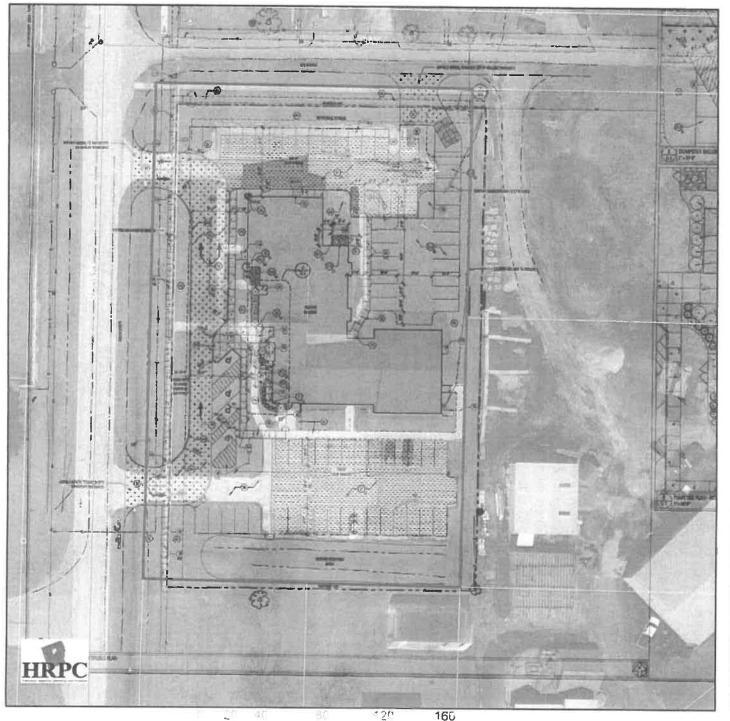

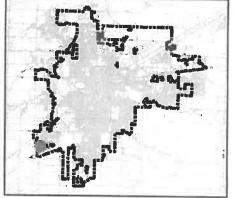

General Information

This request is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of TR 145 and S. Main Street. It is zoned M-2 Multi-Family, High Density. To the north, it is zoned a mix of R-1 Large Lot Residential, R-4 Duplex/Triplex, C-2 General Commercial, and Liberty Township RM-1 Multiple Family Residential. To the west, it is zoned M-2 Multi-Family, High Density. It is not located within the 100-year flood plain.

Parcel History

The site is currently vacant. In January 2022, the applicant went through the rezoning process to change from C-2 General Commercial to M-2 Multi-Family, High Density.

Staff Analysis

The applicant, Provision Living is proposing to construct a 2-story, 75 unit Assisted Living and Memory Care building, and 27 independent living villas on the site. The Assisted Living & Memory Care building would be located on the northeast corner of the site. The parking lot for this site will mainly be at the northeast corner of the building, but additional parking has been provided along the west side of the building as well. The building will include an interior courtyard for the residents.

The 27 independent living villas would loop around the remainder of the site. They have met the parking requirements with a few 5- spot parking lots provided around the facility for visitor parking. A 100-foot petroleum pipeline easement goes diagonally across the site. Inside the easement, they were able to add some additional recreation options for the residents, but could not place any villas within the easement itself. The applicant did go to the BZA last month and got a variance on the lot coverage since they exceeded the 40% lot coverage mark.

A landscaping plan was submitted with the site plan. It meets our standards for trees and foundation plants. A photometric sheet has been submitted as well and meets our standards.

A monument sign was indicated to be located in the northeast corner of the site. A separate permit will need to be submitted with the Zoning Department for the sign.

Elevations were submitted with the application. The villas and the Memory Care Building will be under the maximum for the M-2 district. Architecturally, they have included façade details that are both horizontal and vertical articulation.

Staff Recommendation

CPC Staff recommends approval of APPLICATION FOR SITE PLAN REVIEW #SP-13-2022 filed by Provision Living, 9450 Manchester Road, Suite 207, St. Louis Missouri, for the construction of a 2-story, 75 unit Assisted Living and Memory Care building, and 27

Independent Living Villas, at the southwest corner of S. Main Street and TR 145.

ENGINEERING

Access -

The site will be accessed by two new drives off of Main Street and a single drive off of Township Road 145. The site will utilize a roadway system to traverse from one drive to the next.

Engineering would like to see the sidewalk extended on TR145 to Main Street. When extending the sidewalk, the walk should line up with the existing walk that is located to the west of the site. When installing the driveway on TR145 the area where the walk should be will need to be within ADA standards.

Water Service -

The proposed plans are showing an 8-inch waterline to be looped throughout the site. There are two proposed taps to come off the 8-inch waterline. Engineering has a couple of comments for the waterline.

- Will this be a private or public line
 - o If public, easements will need to be established
- To help with water flow throughout the loop Engineering would like to see one tap to come off of TR145 and the second tap to come off of S. Main Street. Right now if there was a main break on S. Main Street, which would essentially shut down that waterline as well.
- Add an additional fire hydrant to the southwest of the side over by CB No. 17.
- Three additional valves will need to be added to the tee for waterline isolation and for testing purposes.
- Is a master meter needed for each building or one for each living quarter?
- If an irrigation line is desired there will be a separate meter for that system.

Sanitary Service -

The proposed sanitary will be coming off of the existing sanitary sewer that is located on the south side of Madison Avenue.

Stormwater Management -

The stormwater will be detained by the onsite detention ponds located on the southeast side of the site.

MS4 Requirements -

The disturbed area is more than 1 acre so the applicant will need to comply with the City of Findlay's Erosion & Sediment Control Ordinance. Applicant has provided a SWPPP plan for the site.

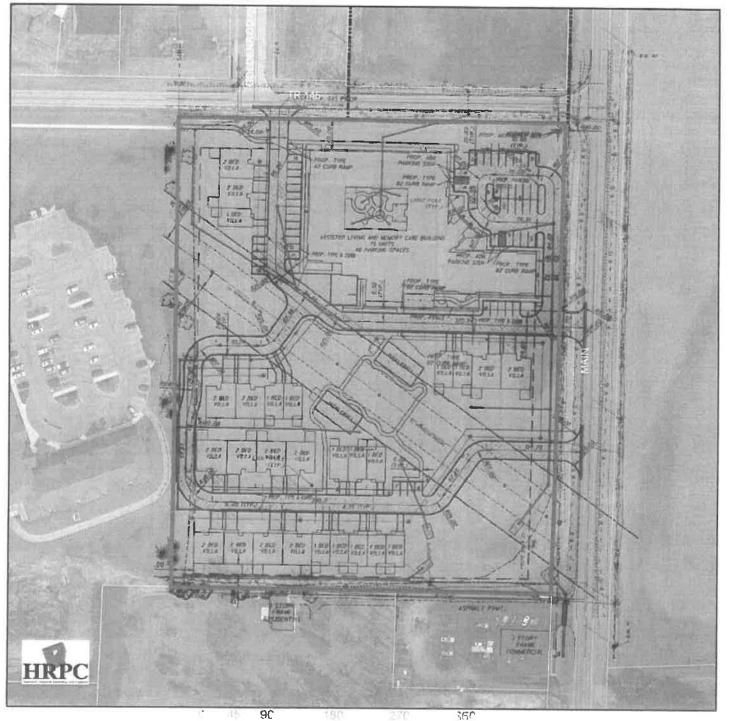

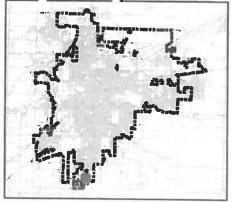

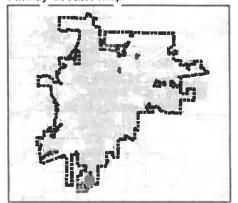

General Information

This request is located on the south side of Melrose Avenue, east of the proposed Lakota Drive. The site is zoned I-1 Light Industrial. To the north and east is a mix of C-2 General Commercial and I-1 Light Industrial. To the east is a mix of M-2 Multi-Family, High Density and MH Mobile Home. It is not located within the 100-year flood plain.

Staff Analysis

This project proposes a two-phase development to construct storage facilities. Phase one would include four (4) buildings totaling 42,706 square feet in size. Phase two would see an additional eight buildings, totaling 83,640 square feet. The first phase would align the buildings along the frontage of Melrose Avenue and Lakota Drive. The second phase would add a building to the south end to close off the site, as well as interior buildings. The site plan shows a 6-foot-high security fence around the site. The only entrance to the site will be off Lakota Drive.

The setbacks and heights of the buildings are within the standards for the I-1 district. The minimum building separation in the I-1 district though is twenty-five feet (25'). There are spots on site where the buildings are only separated by twenty-four feet (24') feet.

There is an existing tree line along the east side of the site which effectively screens the site to the east. No additional landscaping was indicated on the site plan. They will need to plant screening between the site and the M-2 that will eventually be added to the south of the site. Staff would recommend Level 3 screening Option 1, which states four (4) canopy trees and four (4) evergreen trees per one hundred lineal feet (100') of contiguous boundary with the conflicting zoning district or use.

One of the primary roles of the City Auditor is to monitor receipts and appropriations throughout the year to ensure the City complies with State Budgetary Law. Year-to-date income tax receipts are coming in higher than expected and projected for 2022, primarily due to a large influx in business net profit tax receipts.

This increase in revenue necessitates an appropriation of money within the City Income Tax Administration Fund to the General Fund. This appropriation will have the effect of increasing the transfer thereby increasing the <u>projected</u> General Fund year-end balance by the amount below. It has no impact on CIT operations.

The appropriation should appear as follows:

Dear Council Members,

In 2008 City Council adopted Ordinance 007-2008 creating a minimum reserve policy for the first time. The policy required a minimum dollar amount of approximately 12% or 1½ months of the projected General Fund expenses for the current year. Although well intended, the policy was not strictly followed until 2011.

Best practices state a minimum budget reserve for the City of Findlay's General Fund should be 3 months expenses or approximately 25% of your projected General Fund budget.

In 2014 at my urging, Council moved closer to the best practice guideline by adopting Resolution 002-2014. This created a minimum reserve amount of 16.7% or 2 months of projected General Fund Expenses.

In 2020 with the COVID19 pandemic underway, City Council decided not to adopt legislation increasing the minimum reserve to the best practice minimum amount of 3 months expenses.

January 1, 2022 the City started the year with its largest cash balances in its history. Over 62% of its projected 2022 expense budget or \$21MM was our beginning carry forward balance, \$19.9MM of which remained unappropriated. Although it is not likely this large of balance will be maintained forever, it is in the best interest of the City and its taxpayers to now raise the minimum reserve to a full 3 months of projected General Fund Expenses.

If there is a need to spend into the minimum reserve the policy currently adopted requires a plan be created and presented to Council to restore the reserve to the proper amount, ensuring the spending approach is well considered.

By copy of this letter, I am requesting the Director of Law prepare the necessary legislation for your consideration.

It has been brought to our attention that an existing storm catch basin on Cherry Street is currently draining to the sanitary sewer. With the ongoing work that is being done to the brick building that is located just south of the tracks on Main Street, the developer would like to utilize the catch basin for the drainage of a new parking lot. Since additional flow will be going to the catch basin it would be desirable to the City to ensure the storm water goes to the storm sewer system.

Dear Council Members,

Many years ago, in order to have money available to cover potential liabilities of the City of Findlay a "SELF INSURANCE FUND" was created. It has annually been funded to One Million Dollars (\$1MM).

Deductibles, premiums, certain claims are paid out of this fund. I have mentioned in the past that at one time a very large environmental fine was paid out of this fund. Environmental liability is one of your highest uncovered risks to the City. Additionally, there have been several claims paid out of this fund over the years.

Most recently, the City has seen a large increase in the number of lawsuits filed against it and its officials. I believe the time is right and it is wise to increase this Fund to an annual beginning balance of Two Million Dollars (\$2MM). Not only does it add additional protection to the City against potential liability, it would strengthen our ability to be selective with regards to the liability coverage we continue to purchase from the insurance markets.

The State of Ohio Office of First Responder Wellness has a grant program that had a submission deadline of Friday, June 17. This grant is called the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) First Responder Wellness, Recruitment, Retention & Resiliency, and it has no local match requirement.

Grant documentation states, in part, "applicants can use these funds to address the mental and behavioral health impacts of the coronavirus pandemic on First Responder personnel." Last week I approached Service-Safety Director Martin with a grant application proposal which includes a plan to address those impacts through a physical fitness program, coupled with a mental/behavioral health assessment, that Findlay firefighters can accomplish on duty. The grant application includes:

- Training costs to certify 4 Findlay firefighters as Peer Fitness Trainers (est. \$5,996)
- Fitness equipment for each fire station (est. \$42,344)
- Contract costs for local professionals to administer mental/behavioral health evaluations, establish functional fitness routines, & correlate data over the course of 12 months (est. \$7500)

Due to the grant submission deadline, the fact that this is a zero-match grant, and the importance of the topic of firefighter mental & behavioral health, SSD Martin gave approval to submit the application prior to formal council authorization. Instead, if we are awarded the grant, we will request Council legislation to accept the grant funding.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A MINIMUM RESERVE BALANCE POLICY AS PROMULGATED BY THE CITY AUDITOR'S OFFICE, AND REPEALING ALL RESOLUTIONS AND/OR PARTS OF RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Auditor has set forth a proposed a Minimum Reserve Balance Policy which Council deems appropriate and wishes to endorse same to serve as guidelines for the future operations of City of Findlay.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Findlay, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: That the following Financial Plan Policy be and the same is hereby approved and adopted as follows:

Minimum Reserve Balance Policy

The City will budget Minimum Reserve Balance for unforeseen emergencies or revenue shortfalls and to eliminate the need for short-term borrowing for cash-flow needs. The minimum reserve balances for next year will be estimated during the operational budgeting process. If events trigger a breach of the reserve balance reserves during a fiscal year, this will be brought to Council and corrective action planned to eventually restore the Minimum Reserve Balance. This Minimum Reserve Balance should be adjusted periodically upward to keep pace with the City's expenses, so that the Minimum Reserve Balance target is approximately twenty-five percent (25%) of the City's General Fund expenses or approximately three (3) months operating expenses in said fund.

SECTION 2: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Findlay, Ohio, and for the further reason it is immediately necessary to enact said legislation so that this policy and statutorily-created reserve may be established forthwith thus enhancing the City's overall fiscal policy.
