City Engineer Kalb – Reservoir Transfer Line Rehab, Project No. 35782800, Water & Wastewater Infrastructure Grant

The City of Findlay was notified earlier this year that grant funds were received from the Department of Development earlier this year through the Water & Wastewater Infrastructure Program for the rehabilitation of the reservoir transfer lines and valves. As part of the match money for the grant, the City purchased the necessary valves for the project in the beginning of the year, but are still awaiting a delivery date from the vendor. To ensure that the funds are ready for use once the valves are delivered, it will be beneficial to appropriate the grant funds at this time. Legislation to appropriate the Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Program grant funds to the project for use of the rehabilitation of the reservoir transfer lines and valves is requested. <u>Ordinance No. 2022-127 was created</u>.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

The WATER AND SEWER COMMITTEE met on November 9, 2022 to discuss restricted funds for both the Water and Sewer Departments.

City Auditor Staschiak presented to the committee concerning existing WPC and Water Restricted Funds, and also presented new language for proposed new restricted funds for Water and WPC. The committee will have further meetings concerning this subject.

The **PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE** to whom was referred a request from Philip L. Rooney, Rooney & Ranzau, Ltd. on behalf of Mardic Investments, Inc. to rezone the property to be annexed to the City of Findlay, Ohio as M2 Multi-Family, High Density. The property is located in the southwest quarter of Section 36, Township 2, North, Range 10 east currently in Allen Township.

We recommend approval as requested. Ordinance No. 2022-129 was created.

The **PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE** to whom was referred a request from Anthony J. Coyne/Diane A. Calta, attorneys for the applicant EPIC Collaborations, LLC to rezone 119 West McPherson Avenue from R2 Medium Lot Residential to C1 Local Commercial. This request was tabled during the October 13, 2022 PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE meeting.

We recommend to deny in light of strong public opposition; because the proposed expands commercial creep into residential; because changing zoning to commercial from residential further threatens the intended use of this area as laid out in the land use plan.

The **PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE** to whom was referred a request from James Bowser, Owner of Performance R&D LLC, to vacate Bolton Street from Barnett Street south to the dead end.

We recommend approval of the vacation request and to put in a utility easement for the City of Findlay. Ordinance No. 2022-130 was created.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion to approve minutes of the May 4, 2022, meeting as presented, by Mayor Muryn, second by Law Director Rasmussen. Motion passed 5-0.

OLD BUSINESS

Income Tax Software Request for Proposal Discussion: Mayor Muryn stated Price worked with Ginger Sampson in the Auditor's Office and Brent Schroeder in the Computer Services Department to develop the Income Tax Software Request for Proposal (RFP). Auditor Staschiak asked how many bidders anticipated. Price stated that she is expecting at least three companies to respond. Auditor Staschiak asked how many companies cannot bid. Price stated there is one company that is not qualified due to not a robust online filing system. Auditor Staschiak asked how this new software will reduce staff. Price stated she is confident that they will no longer need part time employees once the new software system is in place. Auditor Staschiak asked if we have an estimate of cost. Mayor Muryn stated that \$125,000 is budgeted. Looking at potentially using ARPA dollars for the software. Price inquired how long the systems should run parallel. Auditor Staschiak suggested that they should run parallel through all major processes at least once. Councilman Wobser asked for a basic timeline for the RFP and then implementation. Price stated that once the RFP is approved, the deadline will be set for 30 days for response to RFPs and then review. Auditor Staschiak stated that the 2023 budget for employee expense should look the same, but would expect to see a decrease in employee expense for the 2024 budget. Price stated that they won't see efficiency gain until at least year two. Councilman Wobser asked if the companies will have to do much adjustment to their software product. Price stated that each of the three companies she has talked with usually do customized software packages. Price stated that the RFP will be advertised through Bid Express. Motion to approved Income Tax Software Request for Proposal, by Councilman Wobser, second by Mayor Muryn. Motion passed 5-0.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Year-To-Date Collections</u>: Price stated that collections overall are up 34.245% as of July 29, 2022. The remainder of the year month-to-month collections will be lower due to comparison to Speedway sale in 2021. Goodyear is not expecting any significant changes for 2022, will know by October 2022 for 2023.

<u>Collections, Estimates, Delinquencies</u>: Price stated that through July the year to date is down from 2021. 2021 was a big year for tax collections. Pre-2016 cases are getting less and less.

Legal Actions in Process and Contemplated: Court cases and wage garnishment numbers are down from last year for same reason as above.

Income Tax Department Organizational Chart Proposed Statement/Assistant Tax Administrator – Proposed Job Description: Price stated that if she is out, there is no second in command currently. Some duties of the Tax Administrator can be delegated to the Assistant Tax Administrator. The promotion will be done internally and will not add an additional full time employee. Auditor Staschiak stated that he is in support of the position and further stated that this individual would need to learn what all the positions in the department do. Price stated that the individual they are considering for the position already knows what all the positions in the department do. Motion to approve job description for Assistant Tax Administrator, by Auditor Staschiak, second by Councilman Wobser. Motion passed 5-0.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Request for review of the Center Street corridor as it relates to traffic flow, speed, barriers for safety as well as sound, and pedestrian crossings.

11/15/2021

Director Martin stated that a group of residents of the Center Street corridor requested a review of the corridor as it relates to traffic flow, speed, barriers for safety as well as sound, and pedestrian crossings.

Kalb stated that he has traffic counts from Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) for Center Street from railroad tracks to Main Street and Tiffin Avenue from Blanchard Street to the split. Currently getting counts for Center Street. Director Martin stated the plan is to get traffic counts and analyze the data. Then discuss what next steps are. Are there things we can do or do we hire an outside source to do a traffic study? Kalb stated that looking at traffic counts from ODOT, on Tiffin Avenue east of Blanchard Street was 18,000 cars per day, on Center Street between the railroad tracks and Main Street was 8,000 cars per day. Kalb is working on ideas, but waiting for traffic counts to come in first. Director Martin stated that the recommendation is to table the request until we are able to get the traffic counts in and analyze the data. Motion to table request, by Councilman Slough, second by Kalb. Motion passed 5-0.

12/20/2021

Motion to lift item from table, by Councilman Slough, second by Kalb. Motion passed 4-0.

Kalb stated that traffic counts on Center Street from Tiffin Ave. to Blanchard Street westbound was 300 vehicles and eastbound was 800 vehicles. Looking at the safety of those travelling eastbound from S. Main St. and speeding over the railroad tracks to go straight to this area of Center St. Kalb drew up a sketch of what it would look like if a 90° turn was put in to enter onto Center Street at Tiffin Avenue rather than being able to drive straight through. There are no barriers available to slow people down in the area of the railroad tracks. The only thing to really do is to have a safety study done that will cost about \$100,000. Chief Ring suggested we try something more simple with signage that there is a curve ahead especially westbound. Kalb stated that traffic counts at Blanchard and Tiffin Avenue has 18,000 vehicles, and the railroad tracks to Main Street has 8000 vehicles. Director Martin asked if we should look at some signage before we make any significant changes. Kalb stated that in order to get any funding from the State to make changes, a safety study would have to be conducted.

Chief Ring stated that changing Center Street to a 90° turn will slow eastbound traffic, but will do nothing for westbound traffic where most of the issues occur with vehicles running into houses. Rayle asked if raising the pavement on the other side of the railroad tracks to make less of an incline over the tracks would help. Kalb stated that there is a lot of coordination with the railroad company that would need to be done. Kalb further stated that if that comes up in the safety study there is the potential to secure safety funds to pay for it. Director Martin stated that it all comes back around to a safety study. Kalb stated that it is a lot of money, but we collect a lot of data and are then eligible for safety funds.

Signage suggestions: dangerous curve sign with 25 MPH speed designation, chevrons on guardrails or reflectors.

Motion to install dangerous curve signs with railroad and a 25 MPH designation for both directions on either side of the railroad tracks on Center Street and to install chevrons on guardrails on Center Street near railroad tracks, by Chief Ring, second by Kalb. Motion passed 4-0. Motion to table Center Street corridor discussion, by Chief Ring, second by Kalb. Motion passed 4-0.

3/21/2022

Kalb stated that a safety study is budgeted this year. The study is scheduled to be performed this fall.

7/18/2022

Kalb stated that he went to ODOT Safety Board to request suggestions for this area. The City has already completed the items they have suggested such as signage for the curve and railroad and reducing the speed limit.

8/15/2022

Item remained tabled.

10/17/2022

Motion to lift item from table, by Chief Eberle, second by Chief Ring. Motion passed 5-0. Kalb stated that we have completed all the requests for review of the Center Street corridor relating to traffic flow, speed, and barriers for safety by reducing the speed limit to 25 miles per hour and installing a guardrail and signage related to dangerous curve ahead. The Engineering Department has a project planned to do a traffic study

Motion to take no further action on this request, by Director Martin, second by Kalb. Motion passed 5-0.

2. Request of Diane Boguski, 1920 Palmer Drive, Findlay, Ohio, to replace the traffic signal at the intersection of Western Avenue and Lake Cascades Parkway.

7/18/2022

Edith Wannemacher stated that she travels Lake Cascades Parkway to Western Avenue frequently. She has witness numerous near misses at this intersection due to visibility issues while looking south as well as the speed of motorists travelling Western Avenue. Kalb stated that the Lake Cascades sign is potentially in the line of sight and the grassy hill is on the verge of being in the line of sight. Currently the traffic counts do not warrant a traffic signal at this intersection. Kalb stated he can have a traffic study performed by City staff of this area. After the study is complete, a decision can be made regarding how to address the issues at this intersection.

Motion to deny request to replace the traffic signal at the intersection of Western Avenue and Lake Cascades Parkway, by Kalb, second by Ring. Motion passed 4-0.

Motion to have City of Findlay Engineering Department perform a traffic study of the intersection of Western Avenue and Lake Cascades Parkway and bring results back to Traffic Commission to review, by Kalb, second by Martin. Motion passed 4-0.

Motion to lift item from table, by Kalb, second by Director Martin. Motion passed 5-0.

Kalb stated that the Engineering Department performed a traffic study of the intersection. Looking at traffic count reports from 2016 to 2022, counts only increased by 2%. Western Avenue is still considered a thoroughfare. The traffic counts do not warrant a traffic signal at the intersection of Western Avenue and Lake Cascades Parkway. If a three-way stop was implemented at this intersection, it would create a lot of stacking on Western Avenue and the right turn lane would have to be eliminated. Need to keep traffic on the major road flowing and the minor road needs to stop. If this area develops, we will take an updated traffic count and determine if action is needed at the at time. Director Martin stated that more traffic turns right onto Western Avenue than turns left. Kalb stated that the line of sight at the intersection is sufficient for a safe turn. Not further action is needed,

NEW BUSINESS

1. Request of Lakeview Parkway Homeowners Association for a pedestrian controlled signal at the crosswalk across County Road 236 at Lakeview Parkway and Foxtail Drive.

John Selick, President of the Lakeview Park Homeowners Association, stated that there have been near misses of children getting struck while crossing County Road 236 from Foxtail Drive to Lakeview Parkway. Looking for anything to enhance the safety of the crosswalk. Kalb stated that what is posted is what the City is required by law to have in place. High visibility signage and ladder crossing parking is what is currently in place. The traffic counts collected over the past several years shows counts from 6600 to 7400 cars per day. Whatever steps we take to improve the crossing at Lakeview Parkway and Foxtail, will need to be implemented at Heatherwood Drive as well. Chief Eberle stated that he is in favor of the concept of a pedestrian controlled signal, however, the City receives requests like this frequently and what we decide to do for one request, we have to do for all requests. Chief Eberle and Director Martin stated that they are looking for a way to make this safety improvement, but need to keep consistent. Kalb stated that we can look at installing solar blinking lights around the pedestrian crossing sign to draw attention to the crosswalk.

Motion to deny request for a pedestrian controlled signal at the crosswalk across County Road 236 at Lakeview Parkway and Foxtail Drive; and instead install a solar blinking light around the Pedestrian Crossing sign on County Road 236 at the Foxtail Drive/Lakeview Parkway intersection and at the Heatherwood Drive intersection, by Chief Eberle, second by Kalb. Motion passed 5-0.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting adjourned. The next meeting of the City of Findlay Traffic Commission will be held on November 21, 2022, at 2:30 p.m. in the third floor conference room of the Municipal Building.

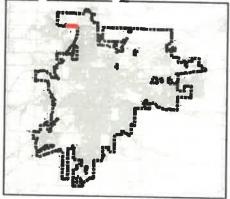


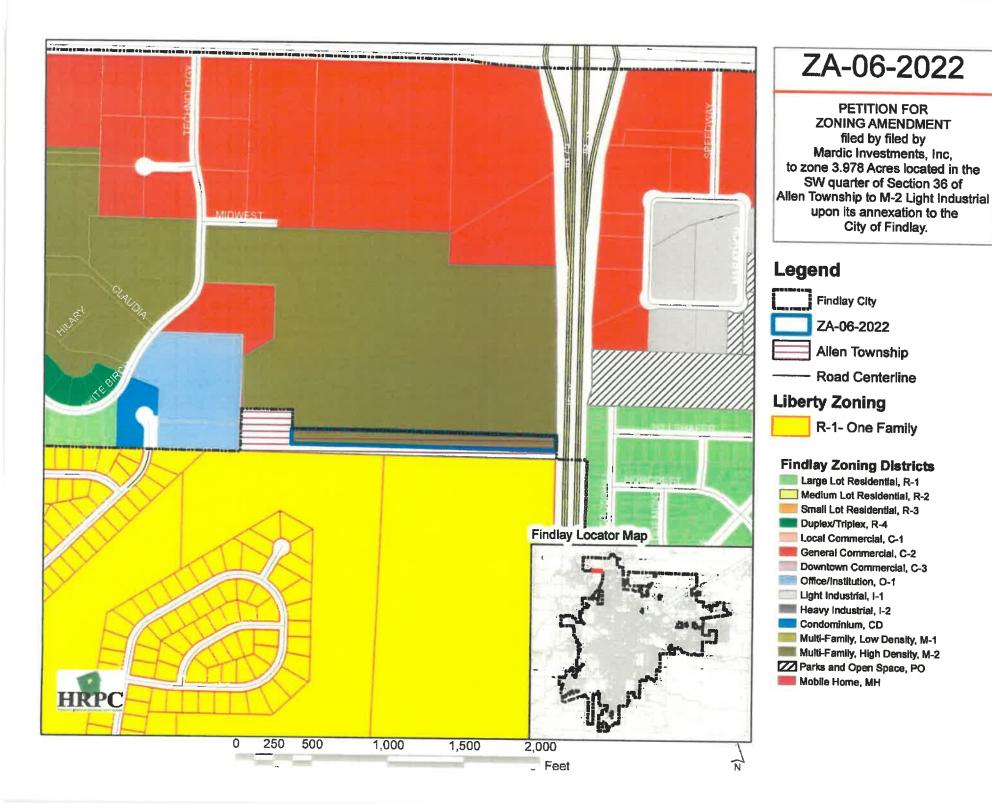

2. APPLICATION FOR SITE PLAN REVIEW #SP-26-2022 filed by Racetrac Inc, to construct a 8,100 sf convenient store and truck stop at 11600 CR 99.

CPC STAFF

General Information

This request is located on the north side of County Road 99, just east of I-75. It is located in Allen Township. To the south and east, it is zoned C-2 General Commercial. The City of Findlay Land Use Plan designates the property as Regional Commercial.

Parcel History

The site is currently vacant.

Staff Analysis

This applicant is proposing to construct a sixteen (16) pump fueling station, five (5) truck pump fueling lanes, a truck scale, and an 8,100 square foot convenience store. Although this is located in Allen Township, staff reviewed it based upon the City of Findlay I-1 Light Industrial standards. Truck Stops are a permitted in I-1. One condition will be that the applicant file for annexation into the City of Findlay.

There are two parking areas on the site, one in front of the convenience store and one for the truck parking. There are 34 parking spots for trucks at the north end of the site. For the convenience store, there are 29 parking spots, with two designated handicapped.

The convenience store has a height of 23 feet, which is under the maximum height in the I-1 district. The structures all meet the setback requirements.

The plan does not indicate either foundation plantings or perimeter landscaping for their parking lots. In the I-1 district, foundation plantings would require two (2) shrubs for every twelve (12) lineal feet of building circumference. This would calculate to 62 shrubs around the convenience store. Shrubs can be clustered around the building and shall be at least 18 inches in height when planted or be a minimum of a two-gallon container size.

Perimeter landscaping should include the following around their convenience store parking lot:

- Shrubs shall be planted at a minimum ratio of one (1) shrub per five (5) lineal feet around the perimeter. Minimum size at planting shall be twenty-four (24) inches in height. A minimum of fifty percent (50%) of the shrubs shall be evergreen.
- One (1) deciduous tree per forty (40) feet of parking lot perimeter shall be planted within ten (10) feet of the parking lot edge. Trees may be clustered.

The site plan shows an extension of Speedway Drive to the north. At this phase, the road would dead end, but provide access to the Racetrac site and the neighbors to the east. The street will need to be dedicated to the City of Findlay.

Staff Recommendation

CPC Staff recommends approval of APPLICATION FOR SITE PLAN REVIEW #SP-26-

2022 filed by Racetrac Inc, to construct a 8,100 sf convenient store and truck stop at 11600 CR 99 with the following conditions:

- File for annexation with the City of Findlay
- Dedicate the right-of-way for the extended Speedway Drive.
- Add foundation plantings and perimeter parking lot landscaping as prescribed by the code.

ENGINEERING

Access -

As part of this site plan Speedway Drive will be extended north. It is anticipated that the roadway and site will be annexed into the City of Findlay prior to the start of construction. The roadway will need to be built per City of Findlay specifications. Once the roadway is approved by the City of Findlay Engineering Department, the roadway will then need to be bonded and inspected by the City of Findlay. Since this is a site that will be travelled to by pedestrians, the Engineering Department would like to see a sidewalk to be placed on both sides of the Speedway Drive Extension.

Water Service -

A new 6-inch waterline will be extended off the new main that will be constructed as part of the Speedway Drive extension. There are a couple of changes that the Engineering Department would like to see as part of the waterline. Place a gate valve on the 6-inch where it meets at the Tee, and for the ³/₄-inch yard hydrant will need a back flow preventer placed on the line. Prior to the start of construction of the waterline, the developer will need to sign the Agree to Annex form and have it filed with the City of Findlay.

Sanitary Service -

A new sanitary lateral will be coming off of the sanitary mainline that will be extended as part of the Speedway Drive extension. The grease interceptor will be inspected by the Health Department.

Stormwater Management -

The stormwater calculations that were submitted as part of the application, complies with the City of Findlay Standards. The stormwater will be directed to a new underground detention pond located on the north end of the property.

MS4 Requirements –

The site will disturb more than one (1) acre so the applicant will need to comply with the City of Findlay's Erosion & Sediment Control Ordinance once it is annexed into the City of Findlay.

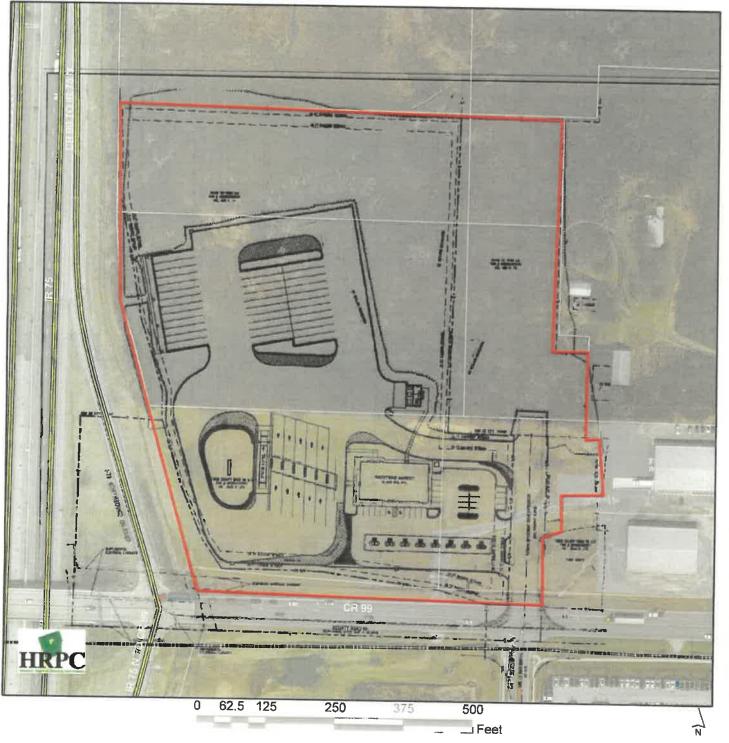

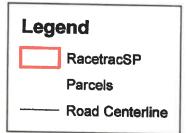

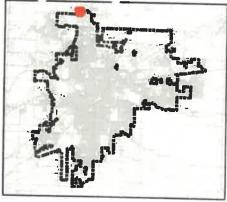

General Information

This request is to vacate Bolton Street from the intersection of Barnett Street south to the bike path at the end of the street. R&D Performance LLC, which is owned by James Bowser, owns all but one parcel abutting the vacation. The City of Findlay own Swale Park, which abuts the end of the street.

Staff Analysis

The applicant is requesting Bolton Street be vacated due to their safety and security reasons. Mr. Bowser owns the properties that directly abut the street on either side of the road. He stated to staff that the increase of pedestrian traffic around the site has led to security issues for his business.

The City of Findlay is also an abutting property owner at the south end of Bolton Street. The City did not sign the petition to vacate the street.

After discussions with the City Engineer, it was noted that a major waterline runs underneath Bolton Street in that section. If the street were vacated, the City would be losing access as well to Swale Park. Staff does not recommend the City vacate this section of Bolton Street.
