ORDINANCE NO. 2022-132, AS AMENDED

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2021-009 TO CHANGE THE HOURS OF OPERATION FOR THE DESIGNATED OUTDOOR REFERESHMENT AREA (D.O.R.A.), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Findlay, State of Ohio, Two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1: That SECTION I. INTRODUCTION AND SUBMITTAL OF APPLICATION (page 3 of Exhibit A) of Codified Ordinance No. 2021-009 of the City of Findlay, Ohio which reads as follows:

I. INTRODUCTION AND SUBMITTAL OF APPLICATION

Section 4301.82 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) authorizes, effective April 30, 2017, municipalities over 35,000 in population to create a Designated Outdoor Refreshment area of "DORA". In order to consider creation of a DORA, the Executive Officer of the City of Findlay must file an application with the Findlay City Council (City Council), which meets certain statutory requirements. The application filing must be advertised for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation. Not earlier than 30 days, but not later than 60 days, after the initial publication of the notice, the City Council may approve or disapprove of the application by ordinance or resolution.

In summary, this application would provide the following:

- A. The DORA would ease or make more accessible outdoor dining in front of liquor permit holding establishments. It would allow such establishments to serve alcoholic beverages in a plastic cup pursuant to the law within a designated area during certain hours. Creation of the DORA would relieve these establishments of current requirements for fencing around a dining area. Signage, sanitation and safety requirements would be established by the City.
- B. The DORA would provide the ability for individuals to walk within the DORA boundaries with an alcoholic beverage purchased from a liquor permit holding establishment during permitted hours. This authority would be limited to the hours of 11:00AM to 11:00PM seven days per week.

This authority would be limited to the hours of 11:00AM to 11:00PM seven days per week, with the exception of the following holidays of which hours are specified below:
 - St. Patrick's Day 7:00am-12:00am
 - New Year's Eve 11:00am-11:59pm
 - New Year's Day 12:00am-2:00am, 11:00am-11:00pm

SECTION 2: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Findlay, Ohio, and for the further reason it is immediately necessary to amend said Ordinance so that revised DORA hours may be implemented.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period

provided by law.
