City Engineer Kalb – WTP Generator Replacement, Project No. 35725300

Over the past couple of years, the City of Findlay team has been working on the replacement of the emergency generator at the Water Treatment Plant. The design of the generator and its components is finalized and are ready to purchase the necessary equipment. Water and American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds are now being requested to be appropriated to purchase the generator and components for the automatic transfer switch. The current lead time for both of these items are in the eighty to ninety-five (80-95) week range. Through a previously authorized cooperative purchasing program named Sourcewell, the City will be able to directly purchase both of these items without the need of going through the competitive bid process. Three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) was previously appropriated to this project and an appropriation is now needed to cover the cost of the generator and the automatic transfer switch. Legislation authorizing the Mayor, Service-Safety Director and/or the City Engineer to enter into contracts for the purchase of the equipment, as well as appropriate and transfer funds is requested. <u>Ordinance No. 2023-032 was created</u>.

Hancock Regional Planning Commission Director Cordonnier – moratorium amendment

Hancock Regional Planning Commission (HRPC) is requesting City Council to amend Ordinance No. 2022-119 which created a six (6) month moratorium on the creation of games of skill businesses. The moratorium was put into effect October 18, 2022 and expires on April 18, 2023. HRPC requests that Ordinance No. 2022-119 be amended to extend the moratorium an additional twelve (12) months with a new ending date of April 18, 2024. HRPC would like additional time to investigate methods of regulating games of skill. In light of recent criminal investigations, HRPC would like to investigate more aggressive forms of regulations. <u>Ordinance No. 2023-035 was created</u>.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

The **STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE** met on March 7, 2023 to discuss the community organization list for an invitation to present to the committee.

Honorable Members of City Council:

I am aware that some citizens are in vocal opposition to a proposal of developing a green space along the Blanchard River in Downtown Findlay. I'm also aware of at least one elected official who seems to be opposed to the idea (providing the media correctly reported).

I write to you in ardent support of the exploration of such a concept, and ask you to consider the long-term impact of an investment in an under-utilized area of our Downtown.

When companies look to locate or expand, they consider aspects such as quality of life, educational institutions, infrastructure, and housing. Companies want the workforce to be happy and have reason to live nearby. A possible green space on the Blanchard River could not only contribute to quality of life for our workforce, but could also further solidify a connection between Downtown Findlay and the University of Findlay.

I am well aware of situations where businesses have bypassed a neighboring community because of the rating of its school system, and because of a perceived lacking in quality of life

opportunities. Fortunately Findlay has strength in its educational offerings, and can only realize an increase in the already nice offerings our citizens enjoy.

I implore you to consider the transformational nature of the Scioto Mile in Downtown Columbus. While admittedly a much larger project, it has quickly become a destination in what was previously an under-used and well-worn part of that city. *(It would be a false dichotomy should anyone say "Findlay is not Columbus" as we are considering the overall impact.)*

Neighboring Tiffin is planning an outdoor green space. Communities like Charlevoix, MI have transformed their waterfront into a destination where children play in a splash pad, and citizens and visitors eat ice cream on the lawn while enjoying the waterfront.

While our Blanchard River is a far cry from Lake Charlevoix, the potential to enhance Downtown should not be dismissed on the premise of the cost of design work, nor upon the premise of the potential cost of the scope of the project.

The National Association of REALTORS® has grant money available that could assist in a number of ways. Said grants require a local association to make the application. The real estate community is one of many who could be a part of a project like this.

Our community has many needs, and by no means am I suggesting that we overlook those, nor am I suggesting that we prioritize our needs in any certain way. Rather, I'm respectfully asking as a business owner, property owner, taxpayer, and a father, that you consider the long-term effects of an investment in a project like this.

I have watched what happens when other communities do not place a great enough emphasis on quality of life as part of their economic development strategy. Such short-sighted steps create a trickle-down impact on families, businesses, tax collection, housing, and the overall health and viability of a community.

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COLUMN: Recent federal investments will bring generational change to Ohio's cities

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) are generational opportunities to change the trajectory of cities across the U.S.

And they could not come at a better time, as we continue to work our way out of the pandemic and stabilize our city, our neighborhoods, our schools, and our families.

These investments from the Biden-Harris Administration have the potential to be transformational, but maximizing shelf impact is up to us.

The City of Cleveland received the eighth largest allocation of ARPA funds, totaling \$512 million. After taking office in January 2022, we launched Mayor Bibb's Rescue & Transformation Plan to outline

Cleveland's priorities and set a robust process for evaluating how we spend ARPA and IIIA dollars and to better prepare the city to compete for additional funding.

Our administration is doing this work through the Center for Economic Recovery, a strategic policy team responsible for shaping and evaluating ideas for ARPA-funded projects that systematically and equitably address our most urgent challenges.

We are not talking about spending ARPA dollars on one-off projects and programs. Such a list would be endless, and we would likely find ourselves in the same place we started. Instead of simply pushing money out the door, we are developing transformational investment strategies intended to reverse decades of decline and disinvestment, improve residents' quality of life, address economic and social disparities and enhance our competitiveness.

We are laser focused on leveraging ARPA investment to solve Cleveland's big, vexing issues like poverty, public safety, the digital divide, housing insecurity, lead contamination, education, and neighborhood disinvestment. These factors are responsible for decades of decline in our city.

As we speak, we are in the process of moving legislation through Cleveland City Council for a third of our unencumbered ARPA dollars. Our first set of strategic priorities in cludes \$50 million in proposals intended to address structural housing problems in the city through a new Housing Gap Financing Fund (\$35 million). Home Repair Fund (\$10 million) and a Developer Acquisition Rehab Loan Pool (\$5 million).

Housing is essential and these funds set us up to deal with housing challenges well into the future with a forward-thinking and long-term approach.

It is imperative that, as mayors, we take the time to make the most strategic use of this influx of one- time funding--to ensure that what we begin today has an impact on generations to come.

As we work to leverage these investments for their best and highest purposes, we must set our cities up to be intentional, vet proposals objectively, and be ready to act when additional opportunities arise.

We can be a model for America with thoughtful urgency and collaborative evecution on how we spend this money. In short, this is our shot, and we intend to make the most of it to benefit the residents we serve across our great city.

Program gives homeowners up to \$25K in repairs

Belinda Poling credits the city of Akron's new home repair program with saving her life.

The 46-year-old was among the more than 1,800 applicants for the program, which offers up to to \$25,000 for eligible repairs for homeowners in need of financial assistance.

When inspectors came out to her East Akron home in September, where she's lived for nearly two decades, they detected unusually high carbon monoxide levels from her furnace and immediately replaced it, alongside her hot water tank.

"I'm really lucky they came out," she said. "I knew there were issues with the air conditioning and windows, but I had no idea about the furnace. It really saved my life."

Poling is expecting other repairs she requested when she applied in June, such as widened doorways to make her home more accessible for her wheelchair. She did not use the wheelchair when she first moved in, but now her house's setup makes it difficult for her to navigate. Each time she wants to go to her bedroom or bathroom, she has to move to a separate chair.

"It's going to be really helpful for me," she said. "I can't move very fast in here, and having more points of entry and exit will be safer in case there's a fire or emergency."

So far, the city has completed about 70 home inspections and begun repairs on 20 homes. One is fully complete.

The funds come from Akron's \$145 million federal stimulus allocated by the American Rescue Plan Act, which are intended to assist those most affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

"The idea is for owner occupants to

be able to age in place where they live now, so cost of repairs are not forcing them to have to move or sell or go somewhere else," said Sean Vollman, the deputy mayor for integrated development.

Vollman said the city is focusing on areas that have historically experienced less investment, as well as lower-income residents who "wouldn't otherwise be able to do this."

With limited funding, however, the program will not be able to assist all eligible applicants. Applications closed at the end of the August, and city staff will have to sift through nearly 2,000 applicants.

"The only real downside is we have a finite amount of money," Vollman said. "We are starting with emergencies."

The city aims to complete at least 200 homes within the first year, with plans to continue the program until they either run out of money or hit the ARPA spending deadline at the end of 2026.

"That that point, assuming everything goes smoothly, it would be nice to find another potential source of funding to continue the program past that point," Vollman said.
