Findlay Fire Department Activities Report – May 2015.

City Engineer Brian Thomas – ODOT FY16 Resurfacing (PID97385), Project No. 32847600

The City is eligible for Federal Urban Allocation Funds administered through the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT). This project is eligible for this type of funding. In 2015 and 2016, these funds were used for resurfacing with plans to use the funds for resurfacing again in 2016. The project is estimated at \$582,400 with eighty percent (80%) being funded by ODOT and twenty percent (20%) from the City. The City's matching share is included in 2016 of the 5-year Capital Improvement Plan. Legislation to authorize the Service-Safety Director to enter into the project agreement with ODOT is requested. Resolution No. 015-2015-054 was created.

City Auditor Jim Staschiak – Revenue Estimates for fiscal year 2016

Ohio clearly defines a budgetary process which includes the requirement that municipalities prepare an annual tax budget by July 20th. The County Budget Commission has not required the filing of a complete tax budget for many years and requires the City of Findlay only to provide the attached Estimated Revenues for submission to the Budget Commission for the next fiscal year. No action will be required at this meeting. In order to meet the statutory requirements for the distribution of the local government money, this document should be formally accepted by Council at the July 7th meeting so it can then be filed with the County Auditor by no later than July 20th. A motion for acceptance of the revenue estimates will be needed during the meeting on July 7th. A public hearing on July 7th public hearing will be scheduled.

The Ad Hoc Committee met on this subject on March 18, 2015, March 31, 2015, May 6, 2015, and May 27, 2015. It was referred to the Appropriations Committee by City Council during the June 2, 2015 regular session City Council meeting.

The May 27, 2015 recommended:

1. Mayor: restoring base salary of \$69,500 with a 2% increase per year in 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019.

Auditor: base salary of \$69,418 with a 2% increase per year in 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019.

Law Director: restore base salary to \$106,451 (Law Director salary in 2011) with a 2% increase per year in 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019.

2. Continue discussion on Citizen Compensation Commission.

We recommend approval of above.

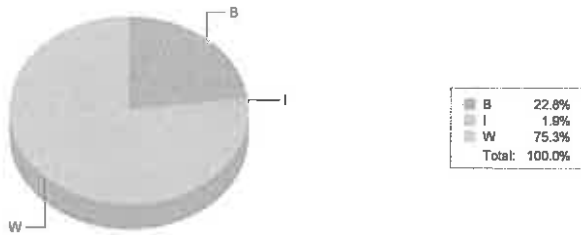

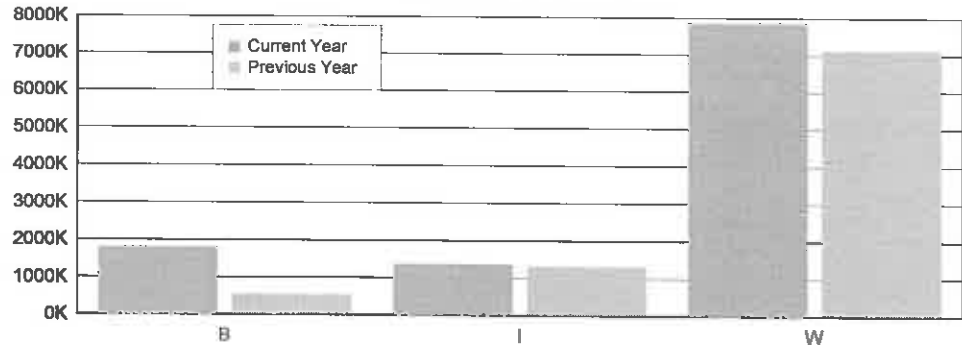

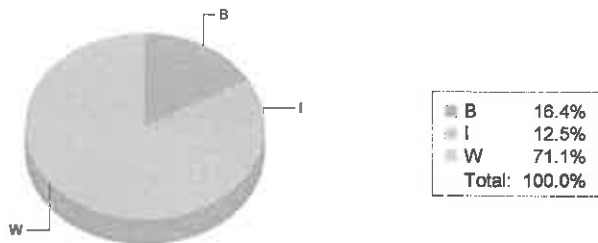
Monthly Collections by Account Type



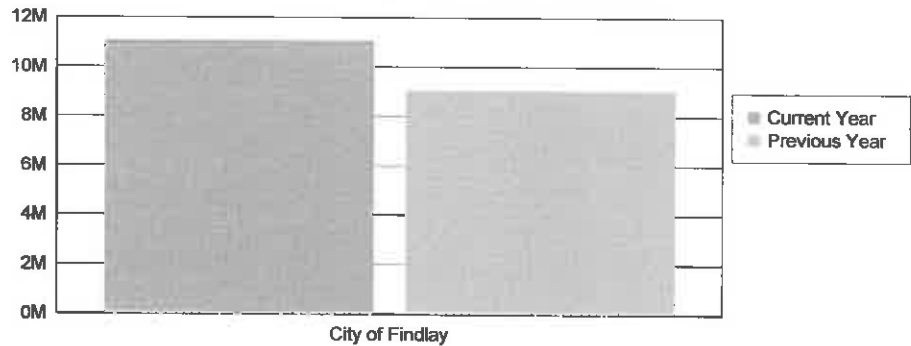
Collections Year to Date



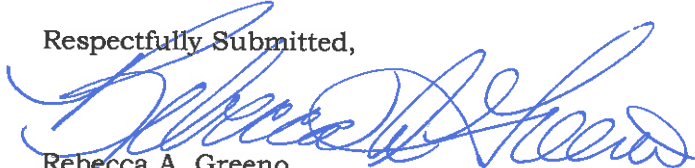

Board of Zoning Appeals

May 14, 2015

Members present: Chairman, Phil Rooney; Sharon Rooney; Douglas Warren; George McAfee.

The meeting was called to order at 6:04 p.m. by Mr. Rooney. Mr. Rooney introduced the members to the audience and the general rules were reviewed.

Case # 53222-BA-15 (310 Third Street) was reviewed by Todd Richard, City of Findlay:

Filed by Peggy Jo Ferrell, regarding 310 Third Street. The applicant is seeking a variance from section 1161.01.1.C2 of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance, which limits the size of an accessory building to 900 square feet in area. The applicant has proposed to construct an accessory building 1200 square feet in area.

This code has been modified to its present language and seems to address most requests for sizeable accessory buildings. There is no hardship to allow a larger building than 900 square feet in area. Additional storage area can be created with a supplemental shed or other accessory building. Two photographs were shown to the Board.

Patrick McKinnis, tenant, was speaking on behalf of the owner and was sworn in. His mother owns the property. An old carriage house was removed. He has 4 cars that he would like to have sheltered. There has been some vandalism and he does not want cars parked on the street. He will be meeting all of the other standards. He wants to keep everything under one roof and have the appearance of just one building. His proposed lot coverage is only 25%. He thinks there is more harmony with one building.

Mr. Warren asked if a 40 x 22 ½ foot building would work? It would give the width he needs for the cars.

Mr. Richard stated that a typical parking space is 18 feet in depth.

Heidi Quorion, 1119 Maple Avenue, was sworn in. She just moved to this property. She is concerned with the size of the building. She wants to know what the building will be used for. She wanted to know if there will be an A/C unit. It will be three feet from her fence. Noise is a concern depending on what type of activity will occur. This building will block her view.

Mr. McKinnis responded that it will only be a garage and have no A/C unit. He may have a wood burner. He is currently renting a storage unit and needs the space.

Ms. Quorion asked if there were any statistics on devaluing the property if the variance is granted.

No one on the Board was aware of any statistic.

Mrs. Rooney asked why a wood burner was needed.

Mr. McKinnis said he may maintain his vehicles or do some other hobby activity in the building.

There was no other testimony offered.

Mr. Warren made a motion to deny the request because there are alternatives.

Mr. McAfee seconded the motion.

The motion to deny the request passed 4-0.

Case # 53232-BA-15 (1119 Tarra oaks Drive) was resented by Mr. Richard.

This case was filed by Mathew and Rebecca Evans. The applicants are seeking a variance from section 1161.03B1 of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance. This section prohibits fences in the front yard that exceed 4 feet in height and are less than 50% open. The applicant has proposed a solid, 6 foot high fence in the front yard.

This is a corner lot with a front yard to the north and east. The lot is very shallow (109 foot depth) and was once part of a Planned Unit Development. An above ground swimming pool was installed in 2013 and the applicants want to provide some privacy with a fence.

The pool was installed in its present location because of the limits of the lot depth and the desire to keep the pool away from windows and doors at the rear of the dwelling. The request has some validity, however, we would prefer that it be moved back slightly to lessen the severity of the encroachment but still have space to the pool for maintenance and access and still provide the desired privacy.

Mr. Evans, 1119 Tarra Oaks Drive was sworn in. He has some landscaping and wants to keep the fence in line with it. He wants to contain his dog and wants security. Mr. Evans mentioned he has an interest in buying the vacant property to the west.

Mrs. Rooney asked that the fence requirements for pools be clarified and Mr. Richard explained the code requirements.

Mr. McAfee had more questions regarding the requirements and Mr. Richard further clarified how fences are treated in front yard areas.

Mr. Richard stated that the house and pool were only required to have a 20 foot setback from the north lot line.

There was some discussion and Mr. Evans proposed that the fence be allowed to meet the north building line. He was asking for the maximum amount of space for his variance request, but he would be satisfied if the fence could meet the same setback as the current building line.

Mr. Rooney made a motion to grant the variance provided the fence be placed equal to the building line of the dwelling on the north side and that a zoning permit be obtained within 60 days.

Mrs. Rooney seconded the motion.

The motion to grant the variance passed 4-0.

Mr. Warren made a motion made a motion to approve the April 2015 minutes and Mr. Rooney seconded the motion.

The motion to approve the April 2015 minutes passed 4-0.

The meeting was adjourned.

Dear City of Findlay Council,

The Blanchard River Watershed Partnership (BRWP) applied for a \$15,000 grant from Freshwater Futures to do the Assessment Study this past March. The BRWP didn't receive the grant. The only other source of grant money doesn't offer their grant until this September. This grant would not allow the Assessment Study to be completed during this summer and fall. This would prevent the pursuing of grant money later in 2015. The projected cost for the removal is between 1.0 - 1.2 million dollars.

There is approximately 100,000 yd³ of sediment and debris behind the dam covering nearly 12 acres of surface area. The sediment has collected to the point that the aquatic habitat has been greatly impaired. In addition, the recreational use of the area for fishing and canoeing has been greatly hindered. The back-up source for the City of Findlay drinking water is located in this area and has been compromised. The source of the sediment has been run-off over the years from mainly agricultural land located upstream. As you may be aware, a second sediment island started to appear in the summer of 2014.

The coordinator has mentioned the project to the Hancock County Commissioners. The BRWP is hoping that Commissioners will be willing to give \$5,000 towards the Assessment Study. The remaining \$10,000 would be supplied by the City of Findlay.

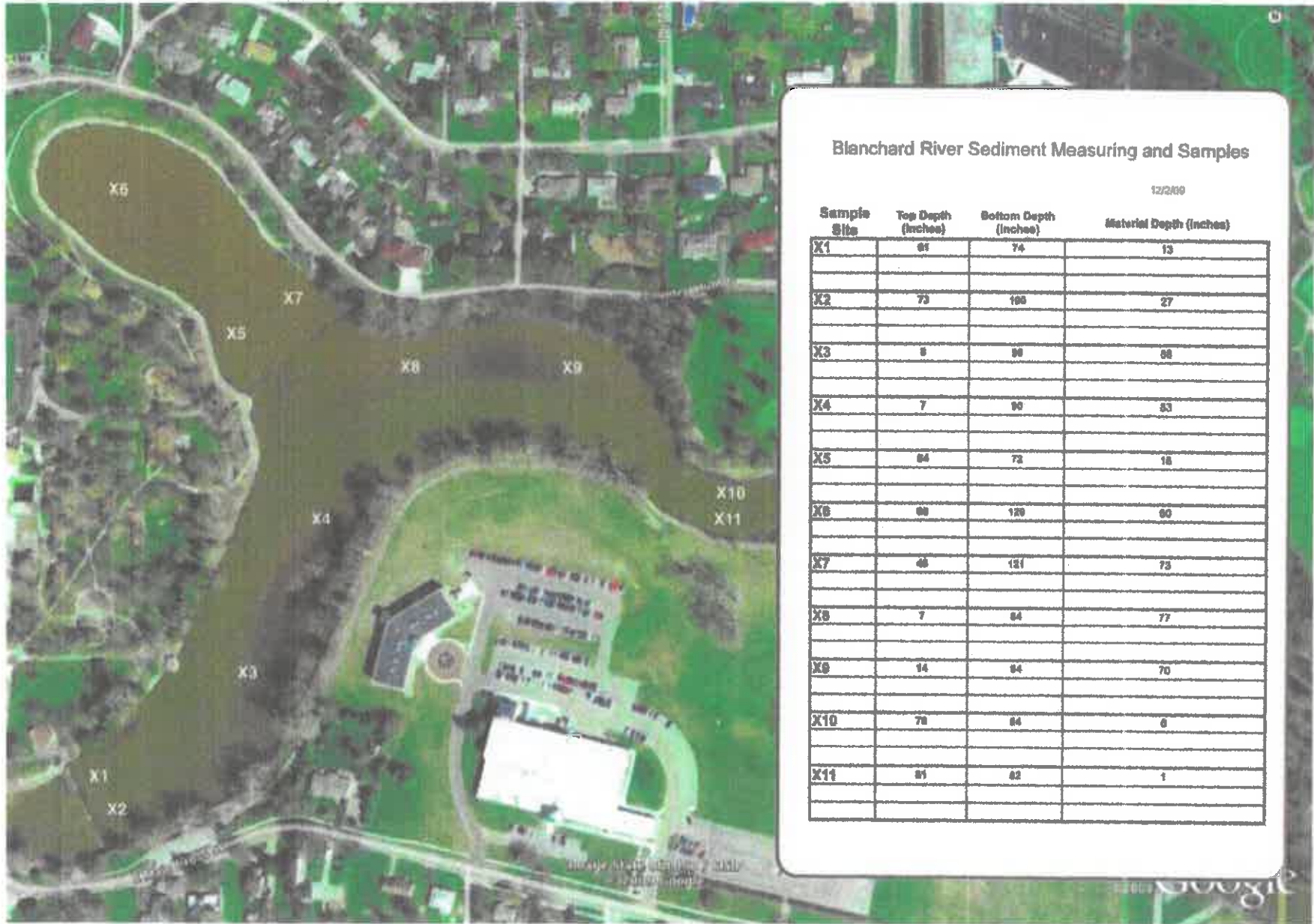

The sediment has been a source of contention for some time, and I am excited about the opportunity to investigate the best way to remove it.

The City of Findlay's primary source of water is obtained by two large above ground reservoirs located 4 1/2 miles southeast of town. The secondary source for water is located at Riverside Park where a valve chamber is located behind the dam which would then allow water to enter into the Water Treatment Plant, if necessary.

It is unknown how much water this secondary source could supply to the Water Treatment Plant in its current state. Any type of sediment removal could only increase the capacity that would be required. This would be a benefit to the citizens of Findlay should there be an event that this source would be needed.

This secondary source has never been used over the past thirty years at least. However, it is vital to the City of Findlay that this secondary source of water be operational to its fullest capacity.

The secondary source for water is located at Riverside Park where a valve chamber is located behind the dam which would then allow water to enter into the Water Treatment Plant if necessary.

It is an unknown how much water this secondary source could supply to the Water Treatment Plant in its current state. Any type of sediment removal could only increase the capacity that would be required. This would be a benefit to the citizens of Findlay should there be an event that this source would be needed.

This secondary source has never been used in my thirty plus years of experience with the plant. However, it is vital to the City of Findlay that this secondary source of water be operational to its fullest capacity.

Dear Mr. Martin:

I understand that the Blanchard River Watershed Partnership is applying for a grant that would enable an assessment on how best to remove sediment from behind the Riverside Dam. I certainly support an assessment of that kind.

On November 12, 2014, the Board of Park Commissioners approved a Strategic and Comprehensive Plan for Programs, Parks, and Recreational Facilities. One of the focus areas is the Blanchard River Greenway, which has four components. One of the components is a Blanchard River Action Plan.

The Blanchard River Action Plan states: *"Promoting an increase in canoe and kayak traffic downstream from Blanchard River Nature Preserve to Blanchard Landing would boost the Blanchard River's reputation as an outdoor recreation resource and magnet for nature lovers and outdoor recreation enthusiasts, thus drawing visitation locally and from throughout the region."* Recommendations include designating a section of the Blanchard River as a State Water Trail, improving river access with more functional facilities, and expanding watercraft inventory and float trip opportunities.

It is apparent to me that sedimentation has occurred over several years. I would think that removing it would improve boating opportunities – not just in terms of the Zonta Landing Boat Rental that operates in the area, but also the many float trips that use that section of the river. After having spent time on the river in 2014 in an effort to complete an assessment for the Water Trail Application and to plan for river recreation in 2015 and beyond, the level of sedimentation does hinder the navigability of watercraft. I can only imagine that it will get worse over time.

I am interested in learning what you find out about the feasibility of such an endeavor. Good luck with the grant application.
