#### Humble Robinson Group, LLC Annexation - rezone

#### Service Director Thomas – annual bids and contracts

## Findlay Revolving Loan Fund Administrator Matt Cordonnier – City of Findlay Revolving Loan Fund request for appropriation – overpayment of loan

On April 2, 2018, Fort Findlay Enterprises Inc. (dba Bistro On Main) completed payment on the City of Findlay Revolving Loan Fund Ioan that was opened in 2014. Bistro On Main has been making extra principal payments and the payoff occurred ahead of schedule. Due to the early payoff, Bistro On Main overpaid by two hundred forty-six dollars and eighty-four cents (\$246.84). Attached is a copy of the RLF Statement of Account which details each principal and interest payment made by Bistro on Main. Legislation to appropriate the funds to refund the Bistro overpayment is requested. Ordinance No. 2018-050 was created.

#### Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas - commitment of matching CDBG grant funds

Hancock Regional Planning Commission is preparing the documentation for the 2018 Community Development Block Grant Funds. The CDBG funds will be used on the Howard Street improvement project that is included in the Capital Improvement Plan. Last year, CDBG made a change so that the City will only receive the allocation every other year. Since this was the first year of the change, a conservative allocation estimate amount of two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000.00) was given when preparing the Capital Improvement Plan (a little less than twice the normal allocation), but have since been told that the actual allocation will be two hundred two thousand dollars (\$202,000.00). Since the allocation is less than estimated, the additional funds will need to come from the City's commitment. The funding for the project will be broken down as follows:

#### Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – Fishlock Avenue waterline project no. 3578200

By authorization of Ordinance No. 2018-019, a bid opening was held for this project on April 30, 2018. Bids were received from three (3) potential contractors with bid amounts ranging from \$845,551.75 to \$873,453.75. an alternate bid for roadway paint was also received that ranged from \$5,083.00 to \$5,230.00. The lowest and best bid was received from JDR Excavating, Inc. of Findlay, Ohio. This project is included in the 2018 Capital Improvements Plan and the total project estimate is within the budgeted amount. Previously, \$30,000 was appropriated to the project for design and startup. At this time, an appropriation for construction, inspection and contingency is needed to complete the project. This project is scheduled to be completed prior to Hancock County Fair. In order for the project to meet this schedule, it is imperative that the money test appropriated as soon as possible so that contracts can be signed and the contractor can start the work. Legislation to appropriate and transfer funds is requested. <u>Ordinance No. 2018-051 was created</u>.

#### Mayor Mihalik - District 13 Integrating Committee appointment

Mayor Mihalik is appointing Jeremy Kalb, Engineering Project Manager for the City of Findlay, to the District 13 Integrating Committee. This term will expire April 30, 2021. <u>This appointment does not require Council's confirmation</u>.

#### Safety Director Schmelzer - dark fiber project no. 319601

The fiber project is nearing completion. The project has gone relatively smoothly, but additional funds are needed. The overall appropriation to this project thus far has totaled \$958,000:

- \$150,000 for 288 strands in the Findlay City School loop
- \$808,000 for the City/County sections (\$388,000 of which has already been invoiced to the County)

The additional costs on the project are due to make ready charges from the utility companies, and requirements in some areas to bury the utilities instead of hanging the strands from existing poles. The school fiber project incurred an additional \$12,000 and the City project will incur additional charges for make ready and underground work in the amount of \$193,000. Contingency had already been built into the project and other items such as equipment and review have come in lower than estimated. A total of \$162,000 is being requested for this project. Approximately \$32,000 of that will be invoiced and reimbursed by the County. The MOU has been prepared to that effect and has been sent to the Commissioners. This is a shared project with Hancock County. This is a shared project with Hancock County It was combined into one bid package and administered by the City in order to save on duplicate bid costs, review, contract administration and avoid increases in phone system fees. Network fees for the City could increase to over \$72,000 per year without this project, and the ability to transfer data and video would be limited. Legislation to appropriate and transfer funds is requested. <u>Ordinance No. 2018-052 was created</u>.

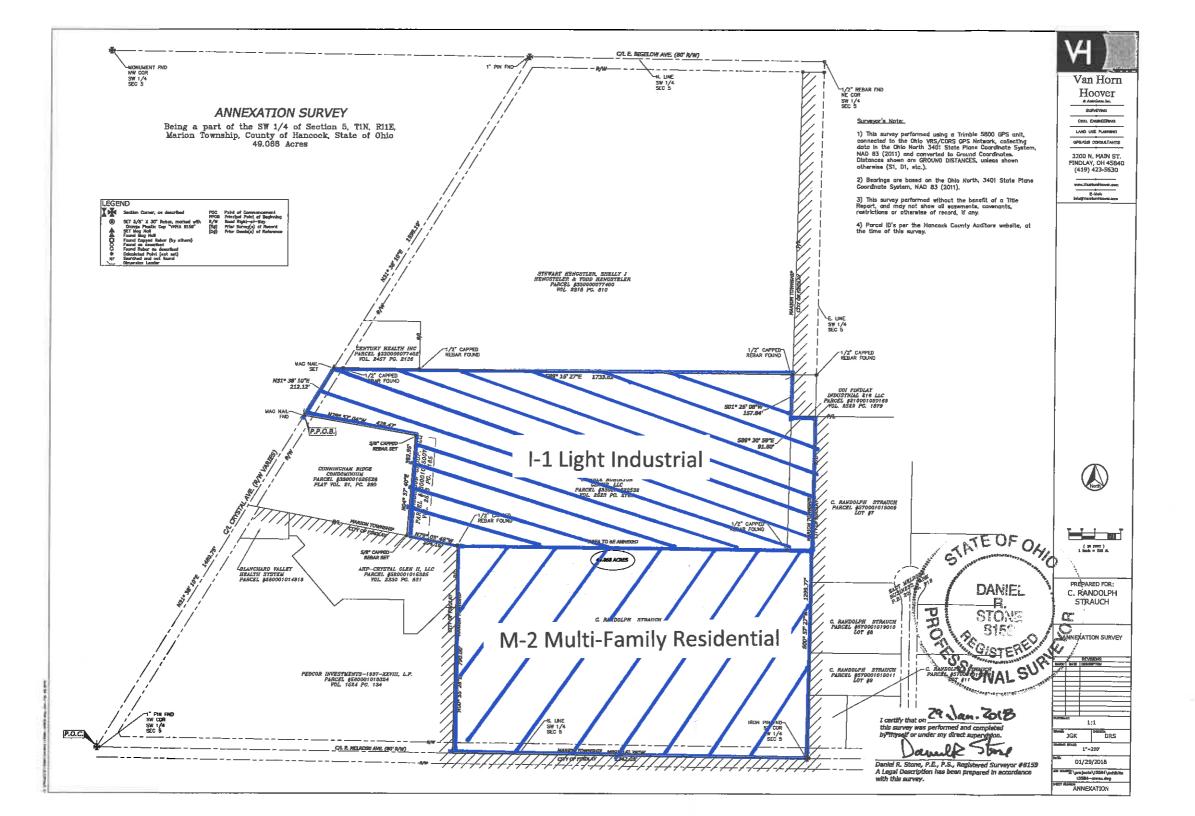

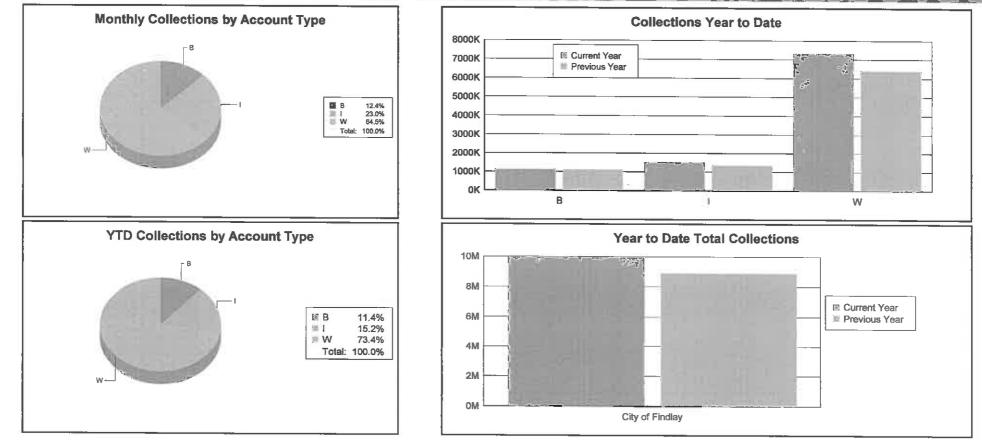

Hancock Regional Planning Commission is preparing the documentation for the 2018 Community Development Block Grant Funds. The CDBG funds will be used on the Howard Street Improvement Project that is included in the Capital Improvement Plan.

Last year, CDBG made a change so that the City will only receive the allocation every other year. Since this was the first year since the change, we had to estimate the allocation amount when preparing the Capital Improvement Plan. Dear Council Members:

The fiber project is nearing completion. The project has gone relatively smoothly, but additional funds are needed.

The overall appropriation to this project this far has been at total of \$958,000 generally as follows:

- \$150,000 for 288 strands in the Findlay City School loop
- \$808,000 for the City/County sections (\$388,000 of which has already been invoiced to the County)

The additional costs on the project are due to make ready charges from the utility companies, and requirements in some areas to bury the utilities instead of hanging the strands from existing poles.

The school fiber project incurred an additional \$12,000 and the City project will incur additional charges for make ready and underground work in the amount of \$193,000. There was already contingency built into the project, and other items such as equipment, and review have come in lower than estimated.

The total required for appropriation to the project \$162,000. Approximately \$32,000 of this will be invoiced and reimbursed by the County. I have prepared a MOU to that effect for the Commissioners.

Recall that this is a shared project with Hancock County. The project was combined into one bid package and administered by the City in order to save duplicate bid costs, review, contract administration and inspection efforts. The combined effort saved over \$20,000.

This project will greatly increase our ability to communicate between facilities, add security and avoid increases in our phone system fees. Our estimated increase in network fees would be over \$72,000 per year without this project, and our ability to transfer data and video would be limited.

# **Board of Zoning Appeals** December 14, 2017

Members present: Chairman, Phil Rooney; George McAfee; Doug Warren.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mr. Rooney. Mr. Rooney introduced the members to the audience and the general rules were reviewed.

Case # 56633-BA-17 (731 Trenton Avenue) was introduced. Mr. Adkins read his comments as follows:

Filed by Classic Sign Company, on behalf of Larry Ball, regarding a variance from section 1161.12.19(A)(1) of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance. The applicant is proposing to replace a high-rise non-conforming sign with another non-conforming high-rise sign at 731 Trenton Avenue. This section requires all height, area, and setback requirements must be met. The new sign will be approximately 10 feet from the side lot line and must have a minimum setback of 41 feet.

During the recent wind storm, the existing nonconforming high-rise sign's cabinet was damaged, which led to owner needing to replace it with a new cabinet. Currently, the existing pole on site is approximately 10 feet from the side property line. Once the cabinet for the nonconforming sign is removed and replaced, the sign will lose its grandfathered status. The code is written to rid nonconforming signage throughout the city. We recommend that the sign edge meets the required 41 foot set-back and conform to the zoning code.

Pat Gaswint, Classic Sign, 3256 Township Road 232, was sworn in. He talked about how the structure of the sign after the wind storm is still in good condition, however the plastic from the storm was damaged and replacing the plastic would be more expensive than replacing it completely. He also explained how the McDonalds logo has updated and will give the Trenton site a modern look, while eliminating the fog lights towards the bottom of the pole which is an expensive cost to light.

Mr. Warren asked if the sign was the sign was in compliance with all other aspects except for the location, in which Mr. Gaswint responded that yes it meets the height and size requirements but not location.

There was further discussion about the grandfathering of the sign and Mr. Richard explained that the code was written in such a way that anytime the structure is changed it loses its grandfathering, though it applies easier to pylon signs rather than interstate high-rise signs.

There were no communications.

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Mr. Warren made a motion to grant the request. Mr. McAfee seconded the motion. The motion to approve the variance request passed 3-0.

Case # 56634-BA-17 (2309 Foxmoor Road) was introduced. Mr. Adkins read his comments as follows:

Filed by William Booher, regarding a variance from section 1121.08(B) of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance. The applicant has constructed an accessory structure at 2309 Foxmoor Road that has a height of 18.9 feet above grade. The maximum height requirement is 18 feet.

The applicant has constructed a 26 X 28 detached garage in the rear yard that was approved per permit number 55821, which stated that there was a maximum of 18 feet in height allowed. Upon the final inspection on September 28<sup>th</sup>, it was discovered that the contractor built Mr. Booher's garage nine-tenths of a foot over the maximum allowed height of 18 feet. Initially, Mr. Booher applied for a permit with the building exceeding the allowed height and size. Prior to approval, he made all the necessary changes to the plan, bringing the building in compliance for both height and size of the structure. We recommend that the building meets the height limit.

William Booher, 2309 Foxmoor Road, was sworn in. He talked about how the slope of his property led to the difference in height. He explained how he had special tresses made to make sure the height was at 18 feet.

Mr. Rooney asked how much it would cost and what it would take to lower the height. Mr. Booher stated that it would be very expensive and would require a modification of the tresses.

There was further discussion of how the garage and the height is in harmony of other building lines and there was no issue with approving the variance.

There were no communications.

Mr. Warren made a motion to approve the request. Mr. McAfee seconded the motion. The motion to approve the variance request passed 3-0.

Case # 56635-BA-17 (172 Carlee Lane) was introduced. Mr. Adkins read his comments as follows:

Filed by Leslie Neal, regarding a variance from section 1161.01.1(D)(2) of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance. The applicant has constructed an accessory structure at 172 Carlee Lane that is 3.2 feet from the rear property line. The required setback is 5 feet.

The applicant has constructed an 8 X 13 shed in the rear yard that was approved per permit number 56004, which stated that the shed had to meet a minimum setback of 5 feet from the rear property line. Upon the final inspection on July 25<sup>th</sup>, it was discovered that the shed, and its footer, was encroaching into the rear yard setback by 1.5 feet. Mrs. Neal was made aware of the encroachment at the time and stated that they were under the assumption that the permitted fence was 2 feet off the property line, which was not the case, when in reality, their fence is on the property line. We recommend that the shed is moved back to the required setback of 5 feet.

Dustin Neal, 172 Carlee Lane, was sworn in. Mr. Neal explained how they used the fence as a measurement, which when installed, the contractor was asked to leave 24 inches beyond to the property line. With that being said, they thought that the fence was 2 feet from the property line whenever they put up the shed. He continued to explain that they had good intentions in leaving enough space between the neighbor's property. With that in mind, they assumed that the edge of the shed was at least 5 feet from the property line.

Mr. McAfee asked if there was a footer and Mr. Leslie explained that there were nine cement footers with a wooden base that he and his father built. Then Mr. McAfee continued to ask about the location of the fence and the code, which Mr. Richard answered that the fence was in compliance and was allowed to go up to the property line.

There were no communications.

Mr. McAfee made a motion to approve the variance. There was no motion to second the motion.

Mr. Warren made a motion to deny the variance. Mr. Rooney seconded the motion. The case was declared a no action with a 2-1 vote. The case will be re-heard on January 11, 2018.

Case # 56644-BA-17 (830 E. Sandusky Street) was introduced. Mr. Adkins read his comments as follows:

Filed by Matthias Leguire regarding a variance from section 1161.03(B)(1) of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance. The applicant has constructed an 8-foot fence that encroaches 3.5 feet into the required front yard at 830 E. Sandusky Street. The maximum height is 4 feet and must be 50-percent open.

Per permit number 56159 the 8-foot fence could not be located in the first 30 feet of the property. On October 12<sup>th</sup> an inspection was done, a property pin was found and when the measurement was made, it was discovered that the fence was constructed 3.5 feet into the required front yard. We recommend that the fence is moved back 3.5 feet and out of the required front yard.

Matthias Leguire, 830 E. Sandusky Street, was sworn in. He talked about how long the process took and that he built it with his wife and children. He admitted that he made a mistake by measuring from the sidewalk instead of the property pin. He then mentioned that the zoning department, upon inspection, would not be opposed to the variance.

Mr. Warren wanted clarification on the distance from the property line moving east to west and asked if any of the fence is in compliance. Mr. Laguire responded no.

There was one communication read into the record by Mr. Adkins:

With regard to the above referenced application for zoning variance, let it be known that we are strongly opposed to any variance granted to the homeowner in this case. Matthias Leguire has been a neighbor to the south of our properties for approximately 17 months in which time he has allowed the condition of the property to decline dramatically. An excessive amount of junk is accumulating on the property, including items stored near our homes, and the grass near our properties remains unmown.

We have invested tens of thousands of dollars improving our homes and our property values are being affected by the condition of the Laguire property. We have followed all permitting procedures and zoning regualtions during our renovations and expect our neighbors to do the same.

Mr. Warren said he would not approve a variance if the fence was not yet constructed and made a motion to deny the request.

There was further discussion about lowering the fence to 4 feet and opening it to 50-percent open, which Mr. Leguire did not see feasible.

Mr. McAfee seconded the motion. The motion to deny the variance request passed 3-0.

Case # 56645-BA-17 (151 Stanford Parkway) was introduced. Mr. Adkins read his comments as follows:

Filed by Flag City Truck & Equipment, regarding a variance from section 1161.12.11 of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance. The applicant is proposing to add an extra 100 square foot panel to the newly permitted interstate high-rise sign at 151 Stanford Parkway. This section limits the panel to not exceed 75 square feet.

The applicant is looking to add an extra panel exceeding the allowed square foot area of 75 feet to the recently permitted interstate high-rise sign which took the place of an existing pylon sign. Such sign may have up to four panels of 75 square foot. We recommend that the sign should not exceed 75 square feet in area due to the amount of area available to utilize.

There was no one present to represent the applicant.

Mr. Rooney made a motion to deny the request. Mr. Warren seconded the motion. The motion to deny the variance request passed 3-0.

The minutes for September and October were approved.

The meeting was adjourned.

# **Board of Zoning Appeals** April 12, 2018

Members present: Sharon Rooney; Kerry Trombley and Brett Gies.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mrs. Rooney. Mrs. Rooney introduced the members to the audience and the general rules were reviewed.

Mr. Erik Adkins read his comments as follows:

CASE# 56856-BA-18 Address: 3900 Ventura Dr. Zone: C2, General Commercial District

Filed by Classic Sign Company, on behalf of Ottawa Oil Company, regarding a variance from section 1161.12.9(C)(2) of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance in regards to the allowable dimensions for a sign with a frontage greater than 100 feet.

The applicant is proposing to replace an existing pylon sign with a pylon sign that is 178.5 square feet, causing the sign to be non-conforming by 8.5 feet. The street frontage for this parcel is 340 feet, allowing for the maximum size of proposed sign to be a total of 170 square feet.

The maximum allowable signage is very generous and a hardship is not apparent. We recommend the proposed sign be brought in to conformity and below the allowable 170 square feet.

Pat Gaswint, Classic Sign Company; and Janelle Cousey, Ottawa Oil Company.

Mr. Gaswint, explained that Shell only offered two different signage leaving the request for a variance due to size and due to the location, visibility with the bigger sign would make the site more visible on County Road 99. Mrs. Cousey explained that the enlargement of the sign was due to their branding of "Party Mart".

Mr. Trombley asked if it was replacing an existing sign. Mrs. Cousey answered yes.

Mr. Trombley asked if it would be one solid sign. Mr. Gaswint explained that it is fabricated as one complete sign.

Mr. Trombley asked if they were to comply to the code, what would they do. Mrs. Cousey stated they would eliminate the party mart or diesel.

Mr. Gies asked if the current sign is compliant. Mr. Richard stated yes that it was compliant.

There was further discussion about the total signage on the current signage and the location of all the signage. Mr. Trombley at this point asked if there was an interstate high-rise sign. Mr. Gaswint answered yes.

There were no communications.

Mr. Trombley made a motion to deny the variance. Mr. Gies seconded the motion.

The variance was denied 3-0. (Rooney, Trombley, and Gies)

CASE# 56922-BA-18 Address: 301 Winter Pine Drive Zone: R-1, Single Family, Low Density

Filed by Dennis Cosart regarding a variance from section 1121.05(C) of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance, pertaining to required rear yard setbacks, which is 30-feet in this zoning district.

The applicant is proposing a 16' by 12' addition to the rear of the dwelling, which will be 25 feet from the rear property line and will encroach into the rear yard setback by 5 feet. The required rear yard setback for a property zoned R-1 is 30 feet. The applicant has taken measures to avoid an existing easement in the entire south-east corner of the lot.

The proposal will have little impact on the neighboring property towards the east since the applicant's rear yard is abutting the side yard, and a sub-division retention pond. The property owner has been in contact with the neighbor to the east to purchase land to make their lot deeper and to gain access to the pond, possibly making the variance irrelevant.

Dennis Cosart, spoke and explained that they recently purchased the home. He explained that the lot is not as deep as other lots in the neighborhood, most of which go all the way to the pond and theirs does not. He explained that they are aware of the easement that is on their lot and stated the will stay out of it. He discussed that whey are only asking for five feet and not anything major.

There was no further discussion and no communications regarding this case.

Mr. Trombley made a motion to approve the variance. Mrs. Rooney seconded the motion.

The variance was Approved 3-0. (Rooney, Trombley, and Gies)
