### Law Director Rasmussen - replacement resolution of services for Darway annexation





City law requires persons requesting the vacation of a street or alley to file a petition with City Council. Council then refers the request to the City Planning Commission and the Planning & Zoning Committee for their findings. These Committees file their report with Council, who in turn makes the final ruling on the request.

# **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

Petition forms are available in the Council Clerk's Office. It requires the signature of a majority of the property owners that abut the requested vacation. A plat of the area shall accompany the application indicating the street or alley to be vacated. This plat can be obtained from the City Engineer's Office.

In addition to the petition for an alley vacation being signed by the abutting property owners, which is notice, if said proposed alley vacation is less than the full alley running from street to street, either north and south or east and west as the case may be, then the Clerk will also send notices to the abutting property owners on that portion of the alley extended but not in the request for vacation. For example, if an alley runs from north to south from street A to street B, intersected by a east-west alley, and the request is to vacate the alley running from street A to the intersecting east-west alley, then the abutting property owners on the remaining portion of that north-south alley between street A and street B shall also receive notice of the petition to vacate from the Council Clerk. (Rules of Procedure, as amended, of Findlay City Council).

Ideally, the petition must be signed by all abutting property owners. If not, a Public Notice of Consideration to Vacate has to be advertised in the Courier for six consecutive weeks. The cost of the advertising shall be paid by the petitioner. Anyone wishing to address Council concerning the petition may do so as a result of the publication. This can occur at any of the three readings which Council must give an Ordinance that vacates right-of-way.

#### FEE

At the time of submitting the request to the Council Clerk, a \$75.00 non-refundable fee shall accompany the petition. This is to off-set some of the City's expenses. Upon adoption of legislation, applicable advertising and filing fees will be invoiced to the petitioner.

#### **ASSESSMENTS**

By law, if there were assessments to the abutting properties for improvements to the street or utilities, the petitioners are to pay the assessment fee for the property being vacated. These assessments, if any, are recorded in the City Engineer's Office. They are requested to be researched for the property upon legislation request. The petitioners will be invoiced for the total expense, and it must be paid before Council will vacate the street or alley.

#### PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION

Planning Commission action on vacation petitions will be in the form of a recommendation to City Council. Council may then either concur with the Commission's recommendation or override it. Concurring action may be accomplished with a simple majority vote, while overriding action requires a two-thirds (2/3) vote of Council. Notice of the Planning Commission Meeting will be sent from the Engineer's Office to the filer of the petition advising him/her when the request shall be heard.

#### PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE ACTION

This Committee's action will be in the form of a recommendation to City Council. Council may then either concur with the Committee's recommendation or override it. Action is a simple majority vote to concur or override the Committee report. Notice of the Planning & Zoning Committee Meeting will be sent by the Council Clerk to the petitioners advising them when the request shall be heard.

#### CITY COUNCIL ACTION

Once the petition is placed on Council's agenda, it will be referred to the City Planning Commission and the Planning & Zoning Committee with all documentation submitted. Both the City Planning Commission and the Planning & Zoning Committee shall review the request.

Upon their findings, Council will request legislation and give it three (3) separate readings if the vacation is to proceed.

In order to vacate a public right-of-way, City Council must adopt an ordinance doing so. Normally, legislation is prepared when the Planning & Zoning Committee recommends that an action be taken. However, appropriate legislation can be drawn at the request of any Council member, whether or not the vacation is supported by the Committee. Ordinances require three readings prior to adoption, and this normally occurs over the course of three consecutive meetings of Council.

A majority affirmative vote of at least five (5) members is necessary to enact a vacation ordinance. If Council disagrees with the Planning Commission's recommendation, it will take six (6) affirmative votes of members of Council to enact a vacation ordinance. The ordinance is not effective until at least 30 days after signing by the Mayor.

# Board of Zoning Appeals

# February 14, 2013

Members present: Phil Rooney, Chairman; Doug Warren, Vice-Chairman; David Russell, Secretary; Sharon Rooney; George McAfee.

The meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by Mr. Rooney. The members were introduced and the rules of the proceedings were explained.

Case # 50241-BA-13 (123 Cherry Street) was introduced. Todd Richard, Zoning/Floodplain Administrator reviewed the case:

Filed by Austin Gerber, on behalf of Mr. Joseph Edinger. The applicant is seeking a variance from section 1161.15j2 of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance. The applicant wishes to establish a crematorium within 100 feet of a residential area.

This building was established in sometime around 1920 and has had many uses over the past decades. It was zoned C-residential at the time zoning was adopted in 1955. In 2009, it was rezoned to B-3, Downtown Business. When the new zoning code and map were adopted in December 2011, this property was supposed to have been changed to C-3, Downtown Commercial, which is virtually the same classification as to what was the B-3 district in the old code. A mapping error placed it in the R-3 district (single family, high density).

Ironically, the R-3 district allows funeral services (conditionally) and we have included the crematorium activity as part of what a funeral service provides. The difference here is this crematorium is for pets only. The activity and process is the same as it is for humans.

The proposal was brought to the City Planning Commission (CPC) and it was denied since the activity is within 100 feet of a residential area. The wording of "area" in the code does not seem proper, however, the activity is within 100 feet of a district. The code allows crematoriums in the R-3 district but not within 100 feet of a residential area. The language seems to contradict itself. This is a code issue that needs to be addressed.

The applicant is meeting EPA and Wood County Building code requirements and has been very diligent in following the process. The activity should be relatively unnoticed and many of the neighbors have been notified. The building has no realistic possibility of being changed into a dwelling.

The owner is in the process of having the zoning district changed to the C-3 district. It is currently in the early stages. However, the C-3 district does not necessarily permit funeral services. If this variance is granted and the zone changes to C-3, a nonconforming use will be created.

Mr. Warren asked Mr. Richard why the 100 foot buffer was created. Mr. Richard does not know why and the language contradicts itself and it may be an error in the code writing.

Mr. Austin Gerber was sworn in. His address is 1512 Crystal Avenue. He is the business owner. He read a quote from Mr. Tom Genseman (?), owner of 125/127 Cherry Street. "Based on everything "(inaudible). This was from an email. Mr. Gerber said that if the request is turned down he will find an alternative location for this activity.

Mr. Joseph Edinger was sworn in. He lives at 820 Third Street and is the owner of 123 Cherry Street. He affirmed what Mr. Genseman stated in his emails that he was not in objection to the activity. Mr. Edinger reviewed some of the past uses of the property. He thinks this activity will have a very low impact and he will be using part of this building also. He said that he has had past inquiries for this building would have a higher impact but would have legal uses. The nature of the neighborhood is anything but R-3.

Mr. John Snyder was sworn in. He resides at 324 Clinton Street and also owns 322 Clinton Street. He thinks the applicant and owner of the property are great neighbors to have. His concern is more will happen here than what is intended. He thinks odor will be a problem. He does not want dead animals dropped off at the door and has a concern that large animals will be cremated either.

There were no written communications to be presented and no one else was present to testify in favor of or in opposition to the request.

Mr. Warren asked about the nature of the request. Mr. Richard told the Board that they are only ruling on the location of the activity in relation to the residential area. This is not a use variance. There is a map that indicates the properties within 100 feet of the activity.

Mr. McAfee asked about the zone change process. He asked about what happens when the zoning district is changed. Mr. Richard explained a legal nonconforming use will be created. The use has already been approved with the condition the Board grants a variance.

Mr. Warren asked about the errors in the map. He was advised to ask HRPC about the status of the map maintenance and update.

A motion to approve the variance was made by Mrs. Rooney provided the applicant or owner obtains the permit within 60 days. The motion was seconded by Mr. Russell. By voice vote, the motion passed 5-0.

The minutes from October 11, 2012 and December 13, 2012 were reviewed. Mr. Rooney made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Mrs. Rooney seconded the motion. The motion passed by voice vote 5-0.

A motion was made by Mr. Warren to leave the officers intact for 2013. Mrs. Rooney Seconded the motion. The motion passed by voice vote 5-0.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:25 p.m.

Call to Order: In the absence of Mayor Lydia Mihalik, Board President Gregory Cline, called the meeting to order at 7:35 A.M.

Minutes

Mr. Cline called for a motion to approve the minutes of the January 16, 2013 Board Meeting. Mrs. Work moved to accept the minutes of the January 16, 2013 Board of Health meeting as circulated. Seconded by Mr. Alge. Motion carried 4-0. Filed.

#### **HEALTH COMMISSIONER REPORT**

- Dr. Mills shared the latest proposed Master Trails plan which prioritizes some routes that the group feels should eventually be incorporated into city development. He explained the manner in which the plan would loop around and connect the city. If all purposed trails would be developed it would include 15 miles of new trails.
- 2. Related to this topic, Dr. Mills spoke with Matt Cordonnier of Hancock County Regional Planning regarding including a health representative on the Regional Planning Board. This would bring a new perspective to projects of HRPC. All board positions are currently filled but Dr. Mills asked that this be kept in mind should a vacancy occur.
- 3. Copies of the annual report were included in the Board's packet. The theme of Findlay's bicentennial was incorporated into the report as Dr. Mills shared some of the history of the city health department as well as commenting on the advancements made in public health over the last 200 years. Dr. Mills reviewed highlights of the report which included pointing out that providing public health services in 2012 cost each resident less than 21¢ per week. The report is available on the city's website.
- 4. Mr. Niese next introduced Dawn Thompson who was attending the meeting at the suggestion of the Board of Health to discuss the situation with her septic system. Ms. Thompson shared that she is currently on disability and does not have the financial means to make the needed improvements even if the new owners of the apartment property allow

her to tie in to their connection. Mr. Niese stated that there have been no further complaints regarding the property since the initial complaint 10 years ago. He has made frequent trips out to the property to assess the situation and the area is currently grown up with brush and not easily accessible. Mr. Cline moved to grant a variance to Ms. Thompson and to revisit the situation in 1 year or if further complaints occur. Seconded by Dr. McEvoy. Motion carried 4-1 with Mrs. Work voting against. Filed.

### DEPUTY HEALTH COMMISSIONER REPORT

- 1. Included in the Board packet was a listing of proposed changes effecting public health that were included in the governor's budget. Mrs. Wilhelm reviewed these changes which include regionalizing grants, requiring continuing education for Board members, encouraging shared services, requiring sanitarians to be certified by the FDA and most importantly requiring health departments to be accredited by 2018. Mrs. Wilhelm noted that active, informed Board members are also a prerequisite for accreditation and we may want to revisit paying a meeting stipend to Board members. Ohio Revised Code allows for payment to the Board for meeting attendance but in the past the Board voted to refuse payment for their service. In relation to the Board the governor's budget also requires each Board of Health to include an executive officer or medical director of the hospital on its board. Mrs. Wilhelm is in full favor of this idea as it will serve to facilitate community planning. Mrs. Wilhelm did not have further details on these recommendations and if approved the changes would not go into effect before the start of the state's fiscal year on July 1, 2013.
- 2. Mrs. Wilhelm received a call several weeks ago from the O.S.U. College of Public Health asking for her assistance in scheduling a meeting in Findlay. The purpose of the meeting would be to bring together a small workgroup of local health department representatives to participate in developing a Continuous Quality Improvement Plan template which can be used by local health departments across the state as they work to reach accreditation goals. The meeting will take place at the City Health Department on Thurs. February 28. Mrs. Wilhelm has agreed to participate in the meeting as well. By doing so she hopes to gain an improved knowledge of continuous quality improvement as she works to complete CQI plans for our own department.
- 3. Much work has been done by the department in the area of obesity prevention. Our health educator Jenn Rathburn has been very busy working on Healthy Kids Day, which is a collaboration between the YMCA, the University of Findlay College of Health Professionals and the Findlay City Health Department, to be held on April 12, 2013 at the University. The event will include a health fair, health screenings, and physical activities for kids and families. Ms. Rathburn and Mr. Masters worked together on a competitive MRC grant to help provide funding for this event and they were recently notified that they were awarded \$7000 to help with this activity. This was a nationwide competitive grant.

Mrs. Rathburn has also added 4 Findlay City Schools to the department's Recess Based Activity Program. Bigelow Hill, Northview Primary, Jacobs Primary, and Whittier Primary now join Arcadia in participating in the program that reaches an average of 1,100 active

participants per week. In March we will be having a *Fuel Up to Play* kickoff in these schools to encourage kids to pledge to do 60 minutes of activity per day. There will be a physical activity challenge for kids to log their activity and the winning school will be recognized at the Healthy Kids Day. The Child Obesity Prevention Action Team continues to meet on a monthly basis with the next meeting scheduled for Wednesday February 20<sup>th</sup>.

- 4. The health department has been ready to begin the Help Me Grow Home Visiting program for some time and have finally received the contract from O.D.H. to begin. Mrs. Wilhelm was pleased to learn that included in the contract is the opportunity to be reimbursed from the state for components of the program that have already been put in place such as training staff, program protocols etc. This opportunity will enable us to start the program with \$18,000 in addition to being able to bill for our visits.
- 5. Nursing Director, Taya Hyde, has turned in her official letter of resignation with her last day on staff being March 15, 2013. Mrs. Wilhelm reminded the Board that state subsidy requirements, as well as the Emergency Response grant, require the department to have a nursing director. Becky Bern is now the senior nurse in the department. She has successfully completed the Help Me Grow training, revitalized the BCMH program and received excellent employee evaluations. Mrs. Wilhelm recommended she be moved to the director's position. Mrs. Work moved to name Becky Bern as the new Nursing Director effective March 17, 2013. Seconded by Dr. McEvoy. Motion carried 5-0. Filed

#### **NURSING REPORT**

- Mrs. Hyde introduced Missy Jack R.N. as well as Becky Bern R.N. who were in attendance.
  Mrs. Jack will fill the empty public health nurse position that will be created when Mrs. Bern
  moves up to the Director's position. Mrs. Jack has previous experience with Blanchard
  Valley Medical Associates as well as with the Findlay City Schools and St. Michaels as a
  school nurse.
- The CLIA site visit was held on Jan. 29, 2013. A copy of the letter sent as a result of the site
  visit was circulated. We were found to be in full compliance with the CLIA requirements. Mrs.
  Hyde shared that the 2 representative sent from the Ohio Department of Health were very
  pleased with our policies and procedures.
- 3. This Friday February 22, our nursing department will be holding a regional Director of Nursing meeting here in our facility. The purpose will be to discuss accreditation as it pertains to the nursing divisions of local health departments and how to position themselves to work together to achieve their goals.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH REPORT**

Environmental health issues were handled with the Dawn Thompson property discussion.
 Mr. Niese did add that the Environmental Health Directors of local health departments have
 also been discussing accreditation. There is general consensus that the process will be
 very time consuming and require a good deal of focus.

#### **EMERGENCY RESPONSE / EP! REPORT**

1. Mr. Masters reviewed the annual Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) newsletter that was sent to all the volunteers and highlighted several of the responses from 2012. Mr. Masters also informed the Board that he is wanting to host a volunteer recognition banquet on April 24<sup>th</sup> at the Findlay Inn & Conference Center to coincide with National Volunteer Appreciation Week (April 21-28) to acknowledge the service of the medical volunteers in the community since 2010. Mr. Masters requested a motion to allocate MRC funds (separate from general revenue funds) to pay for the function. Dr. McEvoy moved to approve the use of MRC funds to provide a volunteer recognition banquet for MRC volunteers. Seconded by Mr. Alge. Motion carried 5-0. Filed

Additionally, Mr. Masters informed the Board that with the recent receipt of the NACCHO Competitive Capacity Building Award of \$7,000 (which Mrs. Wilhelm had mentioned earlier in the meeting), the Hancock County MRC has received \$31,000 since 2008 to build its health and preparedness infrastructure.

Safety-Service Director, Paul Schmelzer, inquired about the health department's awareness of coordination between other agencies that would be involved in an emergency response situation (EMA, Blanchard Valley Hospital, Red Cross, etc.) Mr. Masters replied that he began attending monthly Pandemic Flu Committee meetings at BVH in 2006, which evolved into an All-Hazards Committee, whereby representatives from these agencies attended. Mr. Masters mentioned that he is now attending the Disaster Collaborative meetings at the Red Cross, where the topics of response are similar. There are representatives from the agencies above who are present to discuss what they can contribute during a response. Mr. Masters stated that the health department has, and will continue to, work with these community partners to ensure a unified approach to preparing citizens for emergencies.
