Councilman Slough asked if this is the one that was questioned at the last City Council meeting. President Pro-Tem Ward replied that this is an additional request. He asked for clarification on what this is for. Auditor Staschiak replied that HRPC attached a letter explaining that the invoice is for services related to fiscal year 2011 formula grant activity planning. It was to prepare the neighborhood plan that would identify flood prone properties and potential improvements to low-moderate income areas. It is not something the Auditor's Office is usually involved in other than to verify that they are properly paying invoices as they are received. Councilman Slough then asked if this is for 2011. Auditor Staschiak replied that according to the letter from HRPC, it is. Service-Safety Director Schmelzer added that formula year 2011 means for services performed in 2012. Mayor Mihalik added that the Engineering Department prepares the purchase orders for the different activities that are done for the formula grants. This one was left out because it was a planning activity and not a particular project. It was an oversight on the part of both Engineering and HRPC. It is paid through the formula grant activity. No funds come out of the General Fund. Councilman Ward noted that funds come out of the grants. Mayor Mihalik replied that is correct.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Old Business:

Councilwoman Spence asked why HRPC is billing back to June of 2012 and asked if this request (Ordinance No. 2012-105) could be discussed at the next Appropriations Committee meeting. President Pro-Tem Ward replied that it can be discussed then and asked that the Director of HRPC attend the meeting. He noted that Ordinance No. 2012-105 received its second reading tonight, so it will receive its third reading at the next City Council meeting. Resolution No. 002-2013 (HRPC request for \$15,000) will also be discussed. An explanation for it is not required, but would like to see a breakdown of the charges similar to what Council receives for their monthly expenses. Resolution No. 002-2013 was adopted tonight, but a breakdown would be appreciated. He also asked the Auditor to provide a list of all the charges HRPC has requested for 2012, as well as a comparison with the year before. Councilman Murray would also like to see an interim report on the neighborhood grant project. He would like to see what has been achieved, what is left to be done, and due dates.

Councilman Slough Ordinance No. 2013-004 states that the City will lease approximately three hundred seventy square feet (370 sq ft) of office space to Congressman Latta. He noted that the Civil Service Commission Office on the third floor is not that large. He asked if any remodeling (i.e. tearing down walls, etc.) will be done. Service-Safety Director Schmelzer replied that they have not determined exactly where Congressman Latta will lease space from in the Municipal Building. He is looking for that amount of square footage to lease. President Pro-Tem ward thinks it's great that Congressman Latta is considering leasing space in the Municipal Building. It will be a great thing for him and for the community and his constituents. This building is an appropriate place for him to be. It is a secure building.

President Pro-Tem Ward commended the City's Street Department on keeping the streets plowed. They plowed the residential areas a lot quicker than was expected. It was a well-organized, well-thought out effort. Service-Safety Director Schmelzer added that a lot of personnel were pulled from other departments to help.
