Law Director Rasmussen – Funds for 2019 City Prosecutor's Office telephone services (Ordinance No. 2019-028)

2019 telephone services for my Prosecutor's Office were not budgeted for, not realizing their building is not part of the City's newly installed fiber optic line, thus they continue to receive a monthly telephone bill and funds are needed to pay their monthly 2019 bills.

Mayor Muryn - Elder Beerman parking lot

The Blanchard Valley Port Authority has requested to convert the current Elder Beerman parking lot into one hundred sixty (160) covered parking spaces, fifty-two (52) of which would be located at grade level and would be maintained for public use. Those parking spaces are currently being leased at a monthly rate. <u>Needs to be referred to a Committee of the Whole meeting</u>. Representatives from the Blanchard Valley Port Authority and also Findlay-Hancock County Economic Development, as well as Developer Mr. Younpeter will be in attendance for the Committee of the Whole meeting.

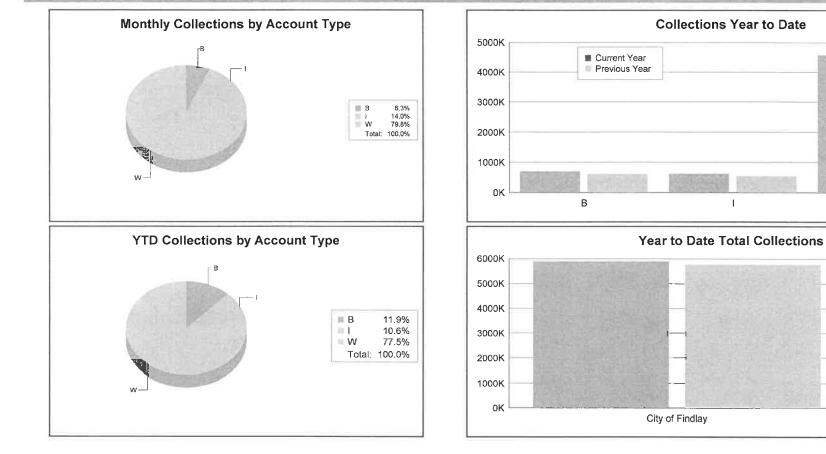

Total precipitation recorded at the City of Findlay Water Pollution Control Center was 8.71 inches of rain and 20.10 inches of snow for the first quarter (Jan-March) of 2019.

At the end of March, the Findlay reservoirs stood at 97% of capacity. This reservoir level represents a 1014 day water supply at the city's current usage rate.

The City of Findlay Water Treatment Plant treated 553.65 million gallons of water in the first quarter of 2019. That is an average of 6.15 million gallons per day.

Please find for your convenience the letter, a copy of the Blanchard Valley Port Authority Resolution, and an image with parking space counts of the parking lot in question. Please note that the lot in question has the below distribution of parking spots.

As stated in the letter, the current development is slated to include 160 covered parking spaces, 52 of which would be located at grade level and would be maintained for public use. I believe these spots are being leased at \$35/month and the Auditor's Office is currently confirming these figures.
