City Auditor Jim Staschiak - Resolution Accepting Millage rates and amounts

The County Budget Commission has completed their work and returned our Certificate of Estimated Resources of our 2015 budget. Our tax millage has been certified exactly as submitted; 2.6 mills for General Fund and 0.3 mills each for Police and Fire Pension Funds for a total of 3.2 mills. Local government money is estimated to be \$422,532.38 for 2015 subject to likely adjustments by the State.

Council should now accept the amounts and levy the tax rates as certified by the Budget Commission. The proper Resolution must be adopted and returned to the County Auditor no later than August 29, 2014. This Resolution requires one reading. Legislation to accept millage rates and amounts is requested. Resolution No. 028-2014 was created.

Service-Safety Director Paul Schmelzer - Logan Avenue Improvements (Phase II), project No. 32532600

By authorization of Ordinance No. 2014-006, bids were opened for this project on August 13, 2014. Two (2) potential contractors submitted bids ranging from \$663,544.00 to \$730,929.00. The lowest and best bid was received from Helms & Sons Excavating of Findlay, Ohio. An appropriation for the construction contract along with contingency and inspection is needed.

The amount included in the 2014 Capital Improvements Plan was based on preliminary engineering estimates. Based on the bids, the actual amount needed for appropriation exceeds the budgeted amount by approximately \$128,000. The additional amount is being split between the water, sewer, and stormwater funds. The overages are due in large part to rock excavation costs.

We have double the amount of work typically undertaken in one year in order to put all eligible CDBG funds (\$109,000.00) into infrastructure. Note that we again received \$250,000.00 from OPWC, putting the grant funding at over half of the construction cost. Due to grant timing restrictions and the amount of work that needs to be done, it is imperative for the project construction to start now and finish before bad weather starts. Legislation to appropriate funds is requested.

Health Commissioner Stephen Mills - Findlay Area Safe Kids

The Findlay City Health Department is currently serving as fiscal agent and coordinator for the Findlay Area Safe Kids Chapter, special project #319242. Safe Kids is a nationwide organization dedicated solely to the prevention of unintentional childhood injuries. Child passenger safety is one of the main ongoing objectives of the group. They currently have a program in place to help families in need by providing convertible and booster car seats at no cost to those that qualify. However, one area of gap in our community has been for families that have an infant but have no car seat for that child. The Kiwanis Club of Findlay has generously donated \$924 for infant-only car seats to be given through the Findlay City Health Department for people in need. An appropriation of \$924.00 to project #319242 is needed in order to purchase these infant-only car seats is requested. Ordinance No. 2014-071 was created.

The Neighborhood Enhancement and Abatement Team received 92 new cases during the month which involved 60 properties with 11 of the property owners being out of town. NEAT personnel closed 149 cases during July and continue to work diligently on the 331 cases that remained active at the end of the month.

Please contact NEAT personnel at any time if there are concerns. The staff is dedicated to prompt response to issues that are brought to the attention of the department and works conscientiously with property owners and tenants to achieve compliance. The team appreciates the cooperative spirit of the administration and City Council which aids in the betterment of our community.

Dear Council Members:

By authorization of Ordinance 2014-6, bids were opened for the above-referenced project on August 13, 2014. Two potential contractors submitted bids ranging from \$663,544.00 to \$730,929.00. The lowest and best bid was received from Helms & Sons Excavating of Findlay, Ohio. An appropriation for the construction contract along with contingency and inspection is needed.

The amount included in the 2014 Capital Improvements Plan was based on preliminary engineering estimates. Based on the bids, the actual amount needed for appropriation exceeds the budgeted amount by approximately \$128,000. The additional amount is being split between the water, sewer, and storm water funds. The overages are due in large part to rock excavation costs.

We have doubled the amount of work typically undertaken in one year in order to put all eligible CDBG funds (\$109,000) into infrastructure. Note that we again received \$250,000 from OPWC, putting the grant funding at over half of the construction cost. Due to grant timing restrictions and the amount of work that needs to be done, it is imperative for the project construction to start now and finish before bad weather starts.

MINUTES

ATTENDANCE

Members Present: Paul Schmelzer, Chair, Matt Cordonnier, Dennis McPheron, Greg Meyers, Bob Nichols, Gary Pruitt, Mike Slough, Dave Trisel.

Staff Present: Lu Draper, Matt Stoffel, and Kathy Launder.

Guests Present: Grant Russel, Councilman; Greg, Karen, Kyle, and Will Herrold.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion to accept minutes of the June 16, 2014, meeting, by Slough, second by Nichols. Motion passed 8-0.

NEW BUSINESS

Request for Soccer Wall: Kyle Herrold would like to place a soccer wall at Emory Adams Park. This will be used for practice of shooting, passing, and kicking. This can be used by soccer teams, players, etc. who use Emory Adams Park. The suggested location is at the southeast loop of Emory Adams Park or by Fort Findlay Park. The wall will cost approximately \$850. Kyle will be doing fundraising to pay for the wall. The dimensions of the will be 24' wide by 8' tall using 4'x8' panels of 3'4" plywood-painted and anchored in concrete. The Board asked if he contacted Hancock Soccer Association regarding his idea. He has not yet. The Board also asked if there is a portable version available. Kyle stated that a portable version is available. Schmelzer would like to hear from Hancock Soccer Association as to whether they would prefer a fixed wall or a portable wall. Schmelzer stated that this is a great idea. He requested that Kyle talk with the Hancock Soccer Association to ask their preference of a fixed wall or a portable wall, and if they prefer a fixed wall, ask them to provide a couple preferred locations. After talking with the Hancock Soccer Association, bring back the results of the discussion in the form of a letter from the Hancock Soccer Association to the Parks and Recreation Board for further discussion. Schmelzer stated that the City can provide assistance in digging the holes. The Board is in support of Kyle's project.

<u>Clean up of Parks</u>: Kyle and Will Herrold addressed the Board. They are requesting permission to put together a team of friends to help clean up the parks by pulling weeds once a month for volunteer hours. They are calling themselves "The Weeding Warriors." The Board is in support of their effort.

<u>Facility Rental Agreement</u>: Draper reported that the Facility Rental Agreement has been revised to include all City facilities rather than just the Cube. There is also more detail, taking away the gray area.

The Cube On Ice Rental Agreement: Draper presented The Cube on Ice Rental Agreement for approval. Draper stated that user groups who reserve ice time will be responsible for payment of the amount of ice time they reserve. In the past the user groups would reserve a block of ice time and only pay for the amount of time they actually used. Motion to approve The Cube on Ice Rental Agreement supporting the concept for billing purposes subject to approval by Law Director by Meyers, second by Slough. Motion passed 8-0.

5-10-15 Year Plan: Councilman Russel asked the Board if there is currently a 5, 10, or 15 Year Plan in place for parks and recreation in Findlay. City Council has been approached by Findlay City Schools regarding the potential of purchasing City property near Cooper Field for a new school bus garage. Are there future plans for this area, additional ballfields, etc.? Currently there is no 5, 10, or 15 Year Plan in place. Schmelzer asked the Board if a garage is built on this property, would there be a conflict? Schmelzer stated that it would be a win for the City in relation to additional parking for the ballfield. Schmelzer stated that it would be a good idea to have at least a 5 year plan in place that is reviewed and updated annually for budget purposes. In the past the Board has hosted a Recreation Summit bringing all user groups together. Schmelzer stated that it is a good idea to hold a Summit every two years to produce a plan.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Recreation Department Report: Draper reported that the Drive In movie, The Logo Movie, was held on Saturday and was well attended and had good coverage in The Courier. The people who attended had a good time and stated that they would come again. For future drive in movies, we can sell sponsorships and announce upcoming events during the opening credits. The next movie will most likely be The Sand Lot. The Nations World Series is hosting an event in Sylvania. The tournament is so large that they have asked to use The Marathon Diamonds from Thursday to Sunday for games. The Eastern Nationals Women's Softball U16 tournament will be held at the Diamonds with 45 teams. Looking into the possibility of hosting affordable day camps at different parks in the City. Also looking at a battle of the parks with five different events at five different parks. On August 23 and 24 a Flea Market and Craft Show/Appraisal Fair will be held at the Cube. This is a new event. There will be demonstrations with 50 booths available. If it is successful this year, we will look to do a series of them next year. The NFL Punt Pass Kick event will be held on August 2 at the Cube.

<u>Parks Maintenance Department Report</u>: Stoffel reported that the slide at the park has passed inspection and it can be used. Schmelzer stated that the slide vendor did not provide any service to obtain the appropriate permits, did not provide equipment for water service to the slide, and did not supply any electrical components for the water supply to the slide. The Public Works Department put together the electric and pump for the water service. Schmelzer stated that this was a job well done by the Public Works Department. We need to determine what to do with the Skate Park, either fix it or close it.

OTHER REPORTS

<u>Hancock Park District Report</u>: Pruitt reported that the concert series at Riverside Park is midway through the season. East of Cheyenne will be performing at the next concert. They are a country music band which is different than what they usually have. This year the Hancock Park District will have one concert on a Wednesday at 7:30pm.

Chief Lonyo stated that it is difficult to make a left turn onto Bright Road from East Main Cross Street but not impossible if you take your time. Don't feel comfortable changing for one request. A suggestion is to put signage warning of a dangerous intersection. Director Rasmussen stated that better markings for lane designation for the right turn lane on Bright Road approaching Sandusky Street may help. Chief Lonyo inquired what the long term plan is for the fire hydrants along Logan Avenue with the ongoing project. Currently there are hydrants on one side of the street in one block and on the other side in another block.

Motion to table request for further review by Chief Horne, second by Chief Lonyo. Motion passed 3-0.

7/21/2014

Motion to lift from table by Chief Lonyo, second by Director Schmelzer. Motion passed 4-0.

Director Schmelzer stated that the City will be working on an additional two blocks on Logan Avenue as part of the continuing improvement project. We will revisit the request when the Logan Avenue improvement project is complete. Motion to deny request by Chief Lonyo, second by Director Schmelzer. Motion passed 4-0.

NEW BUSINESS

 Request of John Kunysz, IntelliHARTx, 129 East Crawford Street, Suite 360, for one or two additional handicap spots near 129 East Crawford Street.

Mr. Kunysz stated that a few of his employees are physically challenged. They are currently utilizing the parking garage. Mr. Kunysz is requesting four handicapped parking spaces: two on the north side of East Crawford Street at Beech Street and two on the south side of East Crawford Street at Beech Street. Would also like them designated as "Employee Parking" and exempt from the 2-hour parking limit. Chief Lonyo stated that the City needs a policy moving forward regarding requests of this nature. Director Schmelzer stated that there is a private property requirement by the ADA for providing a certain number of handicapped parking spaces. There is no requirement for public right-of-way. Chief Lonyo stated that he would like to have a defined policy for handicap parking requests for the business area. He would like a map from the requestor detailing exactly where they want the four parking spaces designated as handicap parking. Also check feasibility of converting the area to the west of 129 East Crawford Street that has a drive approach into a parking space. Motion to table request by Chief Lonyo, second by Director Schmelzer. Motion passed 4-0.

2. Request of Sgt. Ryan Doe, Findlay Police Department, for an additional "Do Not Enter Sign" or "One Way" sign on the south side of the intersection of West Main Cross Street and South Cory Street.

Motion to add a "Do Not Enter" sign or "One Way" sign on the south side of the intersection of West Main Cross Street and South Cory Street by Councilman Monday, second by Captain Young. Motion passed 4-0.

3. Request of a representative of Muddy River Bicycle Company, 403 South Main Street, for a Loading Zone (10 minute parking only) in front of their location in the space that is currently marked for the fire hydrant that is within a few feet of the intersection.

Chief Lonyo stated that there is enough space between the fire hydrant and the corner to convert the no parking area to one parking space. Chief Lonyo prefers this space be a temporary 10 minute loading zone. Discussion ensued regarding the benefit of a 10 minute loading zone space vs. a regular parking space: the space is in front of a larger building, could always make it a regular parking space if needed in the future, does give opportunity to have the area cleared quickly in event of a fire, are not taking parking space away to create.

Motion to make one permanent parking space at 403 South Main Street by Chief Lonyo. Motion dies for lack of second.

Motion to convert space from the southeast corner of South Main Street at East Crawford Street to a loading zone consistent with City Ordinance by Director Schmelzer, second by Chief Lonyo. Motion passed 4-0.

4. Request of Reid Ponx on behalf of Gardner Brothers, LLC, 16067 State Route 12, Findlay, per recommendation of City Planning Commission to make the east/west alley at 223 South Main Street one way.

Mr. Ponx stated that the owner has no preference as to the direction of the one way designation. If the alley is one way going westbound it prevents stacking on Main Street or motorists trying to beat traffic when trying to turn left into the alley. Captain Young is concerned about visibility and safety entering onto Main Street. He prefers the designation be one way eastbound. Director Schmelzer stated that he will talk to the property owner to the north of the parking lot to get their feedback, and come back next meeting to discuss further.

Motion to table request by Chief Lonyo, second by Captain Young. Motion passed 4-0.

5. Request of Chris Kucharski, Gilbane Construction, contractor for Marathon Petroleum Company, to temporarily remove one parking space in front of the building at 129 East Crawford Street on the East Sandusky Street side during the construction at Marathon Petroleum Company.

Mr. Kunysz has no issue with temporary removal of parking space.

Motion to temporarily remove one parking space in front of the building at 130 East Crawford Street on the East Sandusky Street side during the construction at Marathon Petroleum Company by Chief Lonyo, second by Captain Young. Motion passed 4-0.

6. Bob Kuhlman, resident of Saratoga, requested increased patrols on Saratoga from Bright Road east especially between 6:45am-7:45am. Mr. Kuhlman estimates that motorists exceed the 25 MPH speed limit by more than 10-20 MPH. Director Schmelzer stated that the City Police Department has been doing targeted enforcement for these types of issues. Captain Young stated that part of the determination to do targeted enforcement is driven by crash data. Targeted enforcement is done during free patrol time which is very limited. Street Department will confirm that the appropriate number of speed limit signs are installed on Saratoga.

Board of Zoning Appeals

June 12, 2014

Members present: Chairman, Phil Rooney; Secretary, David Russell; Sharon Rooney; George McAffee; Doug Warren.

The meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by Mr. Rooney. Mr. Rooney introduced the members to the audience and the general rules were reviewed.

Case # 52023-BA-14 was reviewed by Todd Richard, City of Findlay:

Filed by Black Gold Ventures, regarding 535 Trenton Avenue (current Swifty fuel station). The applicant is seeking a variance from section 1135.04B1 of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance. This section requires a 15 foot side yard setback. Proposed construction will result in a 5 foot encroachment.

Since this is a corner lot, it has two front yards, a side and a rear yard. The building may be oriented at the owner's choosing, provided the building meets all of the setback requirements. With corner lots, the owner may choose which is the rear yard and which is the side yard. To the north and west, a front yard setback is required. The owner has chosen the south lot line to be the side yard and the east lot line to be the rear.

The applicant wants to keep the existing canopy and build a new convenience store up to it. As you can see from the site plan, the canopy is angled on the lot. The encroachment increases from east to west. The southwest corner of the building nearly meets the setback. The southeast corner has the greatest encroachment.

The encroachment is gradual and relatively minor. The property to the south is also zoned C-2. Since the canopy will remain, the applicant has few alternatives to consider and has minimized the magnitude and number of variances the redevelopment needs.

This plan was reviewed by the City Planning Commission earlier today and was approved.

Jim Burns, 140 Green Drive, Villa, Indiana of Burns distributing, was sworn in. He gave a brief history of Black Gold Ventures. He outlined each condition required for a variance.

There were no questions or other testimony.

Mr. McAffee made a motion to approve the variance to approve the variance. Mr. Rooney seconded the motion. The variance was approved 5-0. It was clarified that the zoning permit needed be obtained within 60 days.

Case #52025-BA-14 was reviewed by Mr. Richard.

Filed by James Stephenson, the applicant is seeking a variance from section 1121.05A of the City of Findlay Zoning Ordinance. This section requires a 300 foot front yard setback. A roofed area over a new deck will result in a 7 foot encroachment.

Front porches in this neighborhood are common and may be encroaching the front yard setback requirement for a number of reasons. This is another case where the pavement seems to be slightly off-center of the right-of-way. The sidewalks are very close to the curbs.

The home was built in 1959 without meeting the front yard setback requirement prescribed at that time (33'). Many homes built in this era were built up to the minimum setback line with no room left for any future expansion to the front of the dwelling.

The request seems a bit excessive, however, since the sidewalk sits so close to the street, the encroachment won't be very noticeable. There is no concern for visibility.

Sally Sieferd, 913 Edgehill Road, Findlay was sworn in. She is the sister of the applicant and is representing him. Over the last seven years, the owner has made many improvements to the dwelling. He wants the new deck to be covered to keep the area protected. There is no plan to enclose it.

There was an explanation that the deck was legally erected, but when a roof is placed over it, a building line is created.

There was no other testimony. Mr. McAffee made a motion to approve. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Rooney. The motion to approve the variance was approved 5-0.

Mr. Rooney made a motion to approve the May 8, 2014 minutes. Mrs. Rooney seconded the motion. The minutes were approved.

The meeting was adjourned.
