Second Ward Councilman Hellmann; Fifth Ward Councilman Slough; At-Large Councilman Russel – Income Tax Chapter 193

Second Ward Councilman Hellmann; Fifth Ward Councilman Slough; and At-Large Councilman Russel request legislation to amend Chapter 193 Income Tax of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Findlay to make the following changes:

- Any program or change in collection procedures that significantly modify the standard collection processes of the City Income Tax Department may not be implemented until a written procedure describing the modification has been created and that a written procedure has been approved first by the City Income Tax Board followed by City Council.
- That change will become effective on January 1, 2020 s as to not affect the remaining life of the existing Income Tax Estimated Payment Waiver Program.
- Eliminate 193.12(c) "a special windfall tax provision"

City Auditor Jim Staschiak - Resolution accepting millage rates and amounts

The County Budget Commission has completed their work and returned our Certificate of Estimated Resources for our 2020 budget. Our tax millage has been certified exactly as submitted; 2.6 mills for the General Fund and 0.3 mills each for Police and Fire Pension Funds to a total of 3.2 mills. Local government money is estimated to be \$469,587.62 for 2020 subject to likely adjustments by the State. Council should now accept the amounts and levy the tax rates as certified by the Budget Commission. The proper Resolution must be adopted and returned to the County Auditor no later than September 30, 2019. Legislation for this is requested and only requires one reading. <u>Resolution No. 023-2019 was created.</u>

Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – Ohio Public Works Commission Grant Application

Engineering is preparing to submit the annual grant application to the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) for Logan Avenue, Phase 3 (from Tappan Street to Harrison Street). The project will be to lower the existing pavement so curbs can be installed, installation of storm sewers and replacing the existing six (6) inch waterline with an eight (8) inch waterline. Legislation authorizing City Representatives to execute grant applications and/or agreements to receive grant funding. <u>Ordinance No. 2019-074 was created</u>.

Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – Runway 7/25 Rehab – Crack Seal Design/Construction #35293200; Rehabilitate Taxiway A (A4 to A6) – Design #35293200

The projects listed above are the current projects that the City has received Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) grant monies to cover ninety percent (90%) of the projects. The City has received FAA approval, so the next step is to apply to ODO Aviation for the Airport matching grant program. Similar to other projects that have been completed in the past, the grant would be for five percent (5%) of the costs which would reduce the City's share from ten percent (10%) to five percent (5%) or approximately nine thousand seven hundred nine dollars and fifty cents (\$9,709.50). Legislation authorizing the Service Director to apply for funding from the Ohio Airport Matching Grant Program for the Taxiway A Rehabilitation Project and the Runway 7-25 Crack Seal and Remarking Project at the Findlay Airport. Ordinance No. 2019-075 was created.

Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – Blanchard River Greenway Extension 2 (Design) Project No. #31993800

The existing Blanchard River Greenway Trail ends behind the old Kodak building on East Main Cross Street is proposed to extend the trail to Bright Road using TAP funds that were applied for any awarded in 2017. The proposed construction for this part of the project is scheduled for 2020. The Blanchard River Greenway Extension 2 was included in the 2019 Capital Improvement Plan and is for the design of the extension of Blanchard River Greenway Trail from Bright Road to County Road 236. The Engineer requested qualifications from engineering firms. Five (5) firms submitted qualifications for the project with the highest scoring from being Strand Associates of Columbus, Ohio. At this time, an appropriation is needed so that the engineering services (including survey work, geotechnical work, engineering design, permitting, and easements) can be complete. Legislation to appropriate and transfer funds for the capital expenditures is requested.

Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – County Road 180 Drainage Plan #35594100

As authorized by Ordinance No. 2019-039, the City of Findlay has entered into a memorandum of understanding with the Hancock County Commissioners. As outlined in the agreement, the County is looking at four (4) projects located in the city limits that will help keep major roadway open longer in the event of a major flood event. Plans are being finalized for the first project which will add additional drainage along County Road 180 to the Blanchard River. As stated in the agreement, the City is responsible for the bidding and inspection of the project during construction. Funds are now being requested so that the project can be bid. Legislation to appropriate and transfer funds for the capital expenditures is requested. <u>Ordinance No. 2019-077 was created</u>.

Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – Municipal Building HVAC Controller Replacement #31994700 The HVAC system in the Municipal Building has not been functioning properly resulting in areas of the building being extremely cold during the summer. Not only is that uncomfortable for the employees, but also causes additional energy consumption to cool areas beyond what is comfortable to the employees. The first step to get the system repaired is to replace the HVAC controller. This will help regulate the temperatures so that the building will be more comfortable for the employees while also reducing energy consumption. There are still some parts of the system that are original form when the building was constructed, but are currently working correctly. The City's Building Maintenance Department is working on a plan to start replacing the aging parts of the system in phases. The replacement of these parts is no expected to begin until 2020, so it will be part of next year's Capital Improvement Plan. The roof on the Municipal Building was replaced earlier this year with that project coming in under budget. The funds that were returned when the roof project was closed is more than enough to cover the replacement of the HVAC controller. The replacement of the controller was not included in the 2019 Capital Plan, but the overall spend from the Capital Fund will remain the same. Legislation to appropriate and transfer funds for the capital expenditure is requested. <u>Ordinance No. 2019-078 was created</u>.

By authorization of Ordinance No. 2019-013, a bid opening was held for this project on August 7, 2019. Bids were received from four (4) potential contractors with the base bide amounts ranging from \$381,673.05 to \$496,948.10. There were also seven (7) alternates that were part of the bid. Alternate prices ranged from \$127,072.95 to \$156,176.00. The lowest and best bid was received from Inland Waters Pollution Control, Inc. of Detroit, Michigan. This project is included in the 2019 Capital Improvement Plan with an estimated cost of \$400,000. He is asking for the full amount to be appropriated so that additional sections of sewer can be added to the project. Legislation to appropriate funds is requested. <u>Ordinance No. 2019-079 was created</u>.

Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – Lime Hauling for Water Treatment

As part of last year's budget process, there was a discussion about a large one-time budget increase that was needed to dispose of spent lime (from the Water Treatment Plant) that had been stockpiled on the north side of the Water Pollution Control Center. The OEPA is in the process of changing its rules for lime which will limit the number of days that spent lime can be placed in a stockpile and will add testing requirements for the lime before it can be disposed of. Both reasons mean that it is to the City's advantage to dispose of as much as the stockpile as possible because the cost will increase once the new rules take effect. To date, the contractor has been able to clean each of the three (3) drying beds once, removed all of stockpile #1 and about a fourth (1/4) of stockpile #2. The budgeted funds are nearly spent and Water Treatment is estimating that it will take an additional four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) to remove the remainder of stockpile #2 and have funds left to clean out two (2) of the drying beds an additional time. He is requesting this be sent to committee to discuss the pros and cons of the additional funding request. Legislation to appropriate funds is requested. Ordinance No. 2019-080 was created.

Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – annual Community Park Improvement Program Grant

The City of Findlay Public Works Department is again applying for the annual Community Park Improvement Program Grant through the Hancock Park District. This \$10,000 grant is to repair walkways in Riverside Park and replace trees within the City parks system. The Public Works Department will be performing all the labor on the project. The Hancock Parks Grant is offered each year to communities within Hancock County to improve their park systems. This grant is then divided among the communities that request available funds. Those funds are at no cost to the community and do not require matching funds. The City has completed many projects in our parks using these grant dollars. One of the requirements of the grant is to obtain project to be funded by these grant funds is requested. <u>Needs Council's approval to fund said projects by grant funds</u>.

CPC STAFF

General Information

This request is located on the east side of S. Blanchard Street south of Lincoln Street. It is zoned C-1 Local Commercial. Land to the north and south is also zoned C-1. Land to the west is zoned I-1 Light Industrial and to the east is zoned R-3 Single Family Low Density. The outer perimeter area of the land is located within the 100-year flood plain. It appears that the actual building area is outside the flood plain. The City of Findlay Land Use Plan designates the area as Neighborhood Commercial.

Parcel History

This is currently the site of a car wash.

Staff Analysis

The applicant is requesting the zoning change in order to convert the property into a duplex.

There is an existing duplex to the north at 716 S. Blanchard and across the street at 719 and 725 S. Blanchard. There appear to be a few single-family rentals in proximity also.

The upcoming zoning map amendments show the majority of the S. Blanchard Street frontage which is currently zone as C-1 going to R-3 Single Family High Density as it is mostly residential. This parcel is still shown as C-1 because of the existing car wash.

General Information

This request is located on the south side of E Sandusky Street. It is zoned PO Parks and Open Space. Parcels to the south, east and west are zoned R-2 Single Family Medium Density. To the north is zoned R-1 Single Family Low Density. It is located within the 100-year flood plain. The City Land Use Plan designates the site as PRD Planned Residential Development.

Parcel History

This site is a part of the Hancock County Fairgrounds. The last site plan reviewed for the complex was the Cattle Barn in June 2018

Staff Analysis

The applicant is proposing to construct an 11,250 square foot Junior Fair building over the same footprint of two narrow buildings.

Access will be by the existing roadways inside the fairground property.

Because the building will sit well within the property, there are no setback issues. The height of the building is 23'-6" at the peak. That is well below the 35' maximum permitted.

The only lighting will be wall packs on the building.

Staff Recommendation

CPC Staff recommends approval of APPLICATION FOR SITE PLAN REVIEW #SP-19-2019 for an 11,250 square foot Junior Fair Building at 1017 E Sandusky Street, Findlay.

ENGINEERING

Access – Will be from the existing drive.

Sanitary Sewer – Plans show no proposed sanitary sewer

Waterline – Plans show no proposed water service or waterline work.

Stormwater Management – Detention has been provided with the expansion of Lye Creek with the previous development.

DISCUSSION

Mr. Clinger asked Mr. Stone about the existing building and the one to the north if the drainage would be reworked. Mr. Stone said yes, right now it's just grass and doesn't drain very well so they want to put in aggregate, adding three catch basins on an existing storm line there. This will clean it up so water won't just be sitting. Mr. Clinger asked if it would require any extra detention. Mr. Stone said that when they planned the event center, they went through and expanded and put in a large detention facility as well as a cut-fill flood mitigation facility along Lye Creek to compensate for any additional work in the future according to the master plan. At that time, they went through detailed calculations with the City Engineering and provided that.

Mr. Stone pointed out that the footprint of the impervious area building is smaller than the other two buildings. Runoff will be a little more but not by much. It will be metered by the existing pipe there so it's not going to let anything out any quicker than what's occurring right now so it may pond up in the catch basins but it will be overcompensating for other places. But as far as up or down stream from the fairgrounds, there will be no negative impact.

Mr. Clinger asked if the expansion of the detention area is to the west. Mr. Stone said it was to the southeast. He said there are multiple drainage outlets on the site and they go into Lye Creek. So, they looked at the property as a whole and what the outlet was at the downstream property line and we've compensated that way. As these different pipes go in at the property line, that's where the restriction is for the fairgrounds.

4. APPLICATION FOR SITE PLAN REVIEW #SP-20-2019 filed by Rowmark, LLC, 5409 Hamlet Drive, Findlay for a 57,000 square foot addition to their industrial facility.

CPC STAFF

General Information

This site is located on the east side of Hamlet Drive in the Invision Place Subdivision. The lot in this request is zoned I-1 Light Industrial. All surrounding land is also zoned I-1. The site is not within the 100-year flood plain. The City Land Use Plan designates the area as Industrial.

Parcel History

Current site of Rowmark manufacturing facility.

Staff Analysis

This proposal will add an approximately 57,000 square foot addition to the current facility. The addition will consist of more manufacturing area and warehousing space. Additional truck docks, truck access drives and employee parking will be added.

The building is being extended to the east following the line of the existing building. The existing building sits well within the required setbacks so there is no issue with the building line.

Heavy-duty pavement is being extended to the eastern limits of the new addition. Truck docks are added on the north side of the building. A stone drive completes a loop around the property. An area of future expansion is indicated on the plans and this drive will have to be paved at the time of that construction.

Parking is based on 1.1 spaces per employee on the largest shift. The plans state that there will be 100 employees which calculates to 110 required spaces. The plans show 114 parking spots.

The highest point of the building is 27'-6". That is well below the maximum permitted height of 60' for the district.

Staff Recommendation

CPC Staff recommends approval of APPLICATION FOR SITE PLAN REVIEW #SP-20-2019 for a 57,000 square foot addition to Rowmark at 5409 Hamlet Drive.

ENGINEERING

Access –

Will be from the existing drives off Hamlet Drive.

Sanitary Sewer -

The plans are not proposing any additional sanitary sewer work.

Waterline -

The plans are not proposing any additional waterline work. *Would like to see the 8-inch and 12-inch waterline extended to the east side of the building with a hydrant at the end of each waterline.*

Stormwater Management -

Detention for the site will be achieved by the regional detention facility to the north of the parcel. *MS4 Requirements* –

The amount of erodible material that will be disturbed will be more than one acre so the site is will be required to comply with the City of Findlay's Erosion & Sediment Control Ordinance.



The HVAC system in the municipal building has not been functioning properly. This has resulted in areas of the building being extremely cold during the summer. Not only is this uncomfortable for the employees but it is also causing additional energy consumption to cool areas beyond what is comfortable to the employees.

The first step to get the system repaired is replacing the HVAC controller. This will help regulate the temperatures so that the building will be more comfortable for the employees while also reducing energy consumption.

There are still some parts of the system that are original from when the building was constructed but they are currently working correctly. Building Maintenance is working on a plan to start replacing the aging parts of the system in phases. The replacement of these parts is not expected to begin until 2020 so it will be part of next year's capital improvement plan.

Dear Council Members:

As part of last year's budget process, there was discussion about a large one-time budget increase that was needed to dispose of spent lime (from the Water Treatment Plant) that had been stockpiled on the north side of the Water Pollution Control Center. As you recall, the OEPA is in the process of changing its rules for lime, which will limit the number of days that spent lime can be placed in a stockpile and will add testing requirements for the lime before it can be disposed of. Both of these reasons mean that it is to our advantage to dispose of as much of the stockpile as we can now because the cost will increase once the new rules take effect.

To date, the contractor has been able to clean each of the three drying beds once, removed all of stockpile #1 and about 1/4th of stockpile #2 (see attached photos). The budgeted funds are nearly spent and Water Treatment is estimating that it will take an additional \$400,000 to remove the remainder of stockpile #2 and have funds left to clean out two of the drying beds one additional time.

I would like to request that this item be sent to committee so that we can discuss the pros and cons of the additional funding request.



WHEREAS, Council desires to amend section 194.013 of the Income Tax Ordinance, No. 2015-101, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Findlay, State of Ohio, two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1: That Section 194.013 which reads as follows:

Effective January 1, 2016 funds collected under the provision of this chapter shall be deposited in the City Income Tax Administration Fund, and the funds shall be disbursed as follows.

- (A) The part necessary to defray all costs of collecting the taxes, and the cost of administering and enforcing the provisions hereof.
- (B) The balance shall be disbursed, appropriated, and allocated as follows.
 - (1) Eighty percent (80%) to the General Fund.
 - (2) Twenty percent (20%) to the CIT-Capital Improvement Fund.
- (C) A special windfall tax collection provision is hereby enacted and defined as being business income tax collections that exceed the Auditor's estimate for business income tax collections for that calendar year. In such an event, fifty percent (50%) of the windfall collections shall be allocated and go to the Rainy day fund, and the other fifty percent (50%) shall be allocated and go to the Capital Improvements Fund. When the balance in the Rainy Day Fund reaches one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00), all windfall collections received thereafter are hereby allocated to the Capital Improvements Funds.

Effective January 1, 2019 funds collected under the provision of this chapter shall be deposited in the City Income Tax Administration Fund, and the funds shall be disbursed as follows.

- (A) The part necessary to defray all costs of collecting the taxes, and the cost of administering and enforcing the provisions hereof.
- (B) The balance shall be disbursed, appropriated, and allocated as follows.
 - (1) Eighty percent (80%) to the General Fund.
 - (2) Twenty percent (20%) to the CIT-Capital Improvement Fund.

WHEREFORE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 194.07 OF CHAPTER 194 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FINDLAY, OHIO.

WHEREAS, on August 7, 2019, the Income Tax Board recommended the following changes to Section 194.07; and,

WHEREAS, Council desires to amend said section of the Income Tax Ordinance, No. 2015-101, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Findlay, State of Ohio, two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1: That paragraph (F) of Section 194.07, which reads as follows:

- (F) The Tax Administrator may waive the requirement for filing a declaration of estimated taxes for any class of taxpayer after finding that the waiver is reasonable and proper in view of administrative costs and other factors.
 - (1) In the event the requirements prescribed herein may cause hardship to the taxpayer or to the City, and subject to prior written approval by the Tax Administrator, the taxpayer may disregard the estimate payment requirements and pay the entire amount of tax due for the year when the return is filed, provided the payment is made and the return is filed on or by the original or extended due date as prescribed in Section 194.09 of this Chapter.
 - (2) In accordance with Section 194.13(B)(2) of this Chapter, the Tax Administrator shall provide to Council and the Income Tax Board the monthly and cumulative number of Individual and Business taxpayers that have been permitted, pursuant to Subparagraph 1 of this section, to disregard the estimate payment requirements prescribed in this section.
 - (3) Nothing in Subparagraph 1 of this section shall relieve the taxpayer of the responsibility of making the declaration of estimated taxes as prescribed in Paragraph B of this section.

Be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (F) The Tax Administrator may waive the requirement for filing a declaration of estimated taxes for any class of taxpayer after finding that the waiver is reasonable and proper in view of administrative costs and other factors.
 - (1) The Tax Administrator shall not waive the estimate payment requirements established herein, except as allowed by written policy approved by the Income Tax Board and Council.
 - (2) Taxpayers granted permission to waive the requirement established herein shall resume the estimate payment requirements beginning with tax year 2020. For tax year 2019, said taxpayers shall make an extension payment for the entire year as of the original due date prescribed in Section 194.09.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance be and the same hereby approved and adopted by this Council, and shall be effective January 1, 2020.

WHEREFORE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period provided by law.
