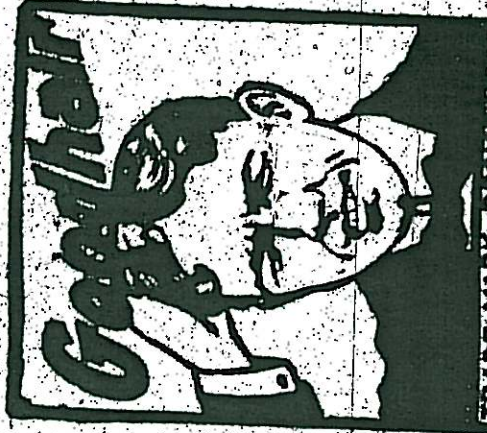

Menno Crates, of Arlington, son of
 Godfrey Crates recently lost his life
 yesterday morning while trying to
 cross a swollen ditch near that place.
 While in the middle of the stream
 both horse and driver were swept away
 by the current. Mr. Crates is an ex-
 cellent swimmer and it is to that fact
 that he owes his life.

Although mentioned by wet climate
 Mr. Crates swam for a quarter of a
 mile until he came to a wire fence
 and was able to grasp a post and hang
 there until he was rescued by several
 men in a boat. The horse got out
 of time.

It was at first reported by this city
 that Mr. Crates had drowned but the
 true facts were ascertained later in the
 day over the telephone phone.

BYAL FELL INTO CREEK.

George Byal, a well known member
 of the school board here, escaped
 drowning yesterday afternoon while
 trying to be ferry south of the city.
 When Mr. Byal reached the creek
 he found the water considerably over
 the road, but thought that he could
 drive across. Everything went well
 until he was facing the bridge when
 his horse became frightened and
 fell over the side of the road.

NOTES OF THE FLOOD

The water on Eagle creek and on
 the flats and bottoms was higher than
 ever before known.

The fence surrounding the Athletic
 park went down with the flood and as
 it struck the bridge was smashed into
 hundreds of pieces.

The Findlay Tile and Brick works
 was badly struck by the flood. The
 kilns were badly washed out and the
 loss will be about \$3,000.

Never before has the water in the
 river risen so rapidly.

A horse and wagon fell into a sewer
 on G street Friday afternoon. The
 horse was taken out with great dif-
 ficulty, but the wagon is still submerged
 in mud and water.

All the cellars on South and North
 Main street were full of muddy water
 today.

Boats were floating on Sandusky,
 Front and Main-Cross streets, and one
 came up as far as the old Counter block
 on Sandusky street, something never
 before heard of.

Influence avenue was submerged as
 far up as the residence of W. D. Mc-
 Carthy, president of the board of sur-
 vice.

All the bridges across Eagle creek
 were under water to the depth of from
 one to three feet.

Findlay merchants, who got their
 ready butter at Piquette, were no-
 tified by phone Friday afternoon that
 the trainery was surrounded by water
 and that it would be impossible to
 ship any more butter until the water
 subsides.

 ever were before.

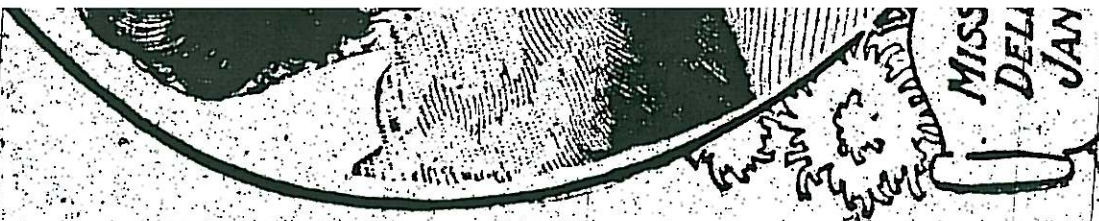
A small house came floating down
