ORDINANCE NO. 2019-102

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF FINDLAY, OHIO TO MANAGE PROCUREMENT OF MATCHING FUNDS THROUGH PUBLIC, PRIVATE, AND JOINT SOURCES, AND AUTHORIZE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AS REQUIRED FOR A REGIONAL TRAINING FACILITY TO BE UTILIZED BY PROFESSIONAL AND VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS OF HANCOCK COUNTY, OHIO, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THERETO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Findlay, Ohio has examined the possibility of constructing a regional training facility for use by professional and volunteer Firefighters of Hancock County, Ohio, and;

WHEREAS, the facility would allow for additional training of many departments and collaboration among City and County agencies, and;

WHEREAS, the concept for a multi-discipline facility has been well received by the community, and;

WHEREAS, the City of Findlay will partially fund the project in hopes that additional support will be given to the project through the County and private sector to bring the project to fruition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Findlay, Ohio, two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1: That the Safety Director of the City of Findlay, Ohio, be and is hereby authorized to manage procurement of matching funds through public, private, and joint sources, and authorize professional services as required for said regional training facility with the City of Findlay, Ohio providing the initial start-up funds of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000,00).

SECTION 2: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Findlay, Ohio, and for the further reason it is immediately necessary to authorize to manage the procurement of matching funds through public, private and joint services, and authorize professional services as required for a regional training facility so that to be utilized by professional and volunteer Firefighters of Hancock County, Ohio,

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
