REASON: based on current projections the actual income tax collections will be less than the original estimate. The tax is allocated to CIT Capital Improvements and General Fund based on actual collections. In order to make sure that the fund is not over-appropriated prior to the end of the year, this de-appropriation is needed. Ordinance No. 2014-103 was created.

REASON: The City had to appropriate the entire amount of the interest payment for the Energy Bonds for the 2014 debt payments. However, the Series B bonds are federally subsidized and we did receive a portion of our subsidy payment. Due to the federal mandated sequester, we did not receive the entire subsidy. Also, the account that was due on the Series A bonds ended up being less than what was shown on the amortization schedule and was originally budgeted. These transactions return the fronted appropriation to Capital Improvements.

REASON: With the bond proceeds of the refunding of the Various Purpose bonds earlier this year, there were several appropriations and deappropriations that occurred with the transaction in May. This is the final remaining transaction dealing with that refunding.

REASON: A portion of the amount received from the assorted property taxes from the county tax settlements is deposited into Police and Fire Pension Funds by law. The cash balance is then transferred to the General Fund at the end of the year. Although the revenue budgets for 2014 were estimated very closely for the transfer into the General Fund, the transfers out of these funds were budgeted low. The County revises their revenue estimates after adoption of our annual appropriation ordinance, and in order to avoid potentially over-budgeting the fund on the certificate filing, the transfer out is budgeted lower than expected.

Service-Safety Director Paul Schmelzer - vehicle Insurance payment

Councilman Harrington asked if there is any ramification if this ordinance or the CDBG program ordinance is not approved by the end of the year. Law Director Rasmussen replied that it will be the same Council next year, so legislation does not die at the end of the year. He is not aware of the timing issue on this project. They are getting ready to do this project but he is unsure what the lead time for the signalization is. Mayor Mihalik added that the CDBG ordinance does not have to be adopted tonight/before the end of the year.

Councilwoman Spence noted that this is the only time she can recall that funds were de-appropriated for the significant amount that is being requested. She asked for additional information. City Auditor Staschiak replied that income taxes have not come in according to the amount that was expected, but was appropriated as if the entire amount would come in through an appropriation ordinance as capital improvements, general fund, and operating expenses within the income tax fund. This ordinance makes an adjustment so that we do not exceed the statutory limits (income tax coming in short) for appropriations. The money that did not come in is not going to be allocated between the general fund and Capital improvements account, and will not be used for operational expenses. This is a housekeeping item that keeps the City in compliance with the statutory requirements. A full report will be submitted to the County in a few days that will state that the City did not exceed those expenditures beyond our revenues for this fund. It is very important that this be done so that the City is in compliance, otherwise, the City could be cited by the County on behalf of the State.
