

OLD BUSINESS

Skate Park Update: Director Thomas reported that he budgeted \$30,000 in the Engineering Department budget to do a comprehensive plan for parks and recreation. In January, we will start to look at proposals. Councilman Russel inquired how the comprehensive plan will mesh with the strategic plan that City Council is currently working through. It was suggested that the companies being considered be brought in for an interview with those members of the board that are interested in participating.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Presentations by Donnell Middle School Students</u>: The City was approached by Findlay City Schools to listen to proposals created by students from Donnell Middle School. OLD BUSINESS

1. Request to review pedestrian safety downtown Findlay.

6/17/2019

Councilman Grant Russel stated that a resident that was struck in a crosswalk recently downtown approached him with ideas to make downtown streets safer for pedestrians. A suggestion is to make all intersections in Downtown Findlay "No Turn on Red." Also, installing left turn lights on all traffic lights Downtown. DeMuth stated that plans are already in place for traffic light upgrades which will include left turn lights on all intersections that have left turn lanes in Downtown. Director Schmelzer stated that we can look at the Capital Plan, and in the interest of pedestrian safety downtown, we can move the request for signal upgrades up on the list to have them completed sooner.

Discussion regarding "No Turn on Red" during certain hours. Have not done research on other downtowns or how this affect the Uniform Traffic code. Used to be No Turn on Red prior to 2003. Director Schmelzer stated that it makes sense for special hours. May back up traffic. What do we want to do in the interest of pedestrian safety. See what introduction to no turn on red would make on stacking. Maybe not on Main Cross and Sandusky intersections, but all other intersections in downtown have the "No Turn On Red" designation. Have DGL take a look at. Demuth stated that if you can't see to turn right on red without entering into the crosswalk to see to turn, then it should be "No Turn On Red." Director Schmelzer stated this should be part of the criteria along with stacking. Director Schmelzer requested the Engineering Department to do a study on the intersections with the criteria and come back with a list of intersections and a map to determine where we want to introduce the No Turn On Red. If we don't have anything conclusive, then look at engaging DGL. Director Thomas will contact DGL for a cost to do the study, if needed.

Motion to review the Capital Plan as it relates to the traffic signal upgrades in Downtown to determine if those projects can be moved up in the schedule; have Engineering Department study each Main Street intersection in the Downtown using the two criteria for right turn on red: 1. Do you have to encroach into the crosswalk to make a decision as to whether or not it safe to move forward in your vehicle, and 2. Stacking, then bring it back for further discussion, by Director Schmelzer, second by Chief Dunbar. Motion passed 4-0.

7/15/2019 Remains tabled.

8/19/2019

Motion to lift from table by Director Thomas, second by Director Schmelzer. Motion passed 5-0. Director Thomas stated that they looked at the intersections downtown, looked at which intersections if you stop at the stop bar you can see and which ones you can't when you turn right. Director Thomas will be checking on pricing with DGL to do a model regarding stacking with data relative to traffic counts that we collected for the Downtown project, provide level of service projections for those intersections if those movements are restricted.

Motion to table request, by Director Schmelzer, second by Chief Dunbar. Motion passed 5-0.

12/16/2019 Remains tabled.

2. Request of John DePuy, 3430 Crosshill Drive, to make the west side of Crosshill Drive from Hillshafer Drive north to dead end of Crosshill Drive.

7/15/2019

Concerns about vehicles parking in front of his mailbox as well as concerns about emergency vehicles being able to access his home.

Motion to table request until signatures of property owners approving the change can be obtained, by Director Thomas, second by Chief Dunbar, Motion passed 3-0.

11/18/2019

Remains tabled.

12/16/2019

Motion to lift from table, by Director Schmelzer, second by Councilman Slough. Motion passed 5-0.

We have requested that the individual making the request supply to the Traffic Commission some support for the request before we start restricting parking in people's neighborhood that affects their property. Director Schmelzer stated that in the absence of this information that he is inclined to deny the request. Mr. DePuy has been informed that he needed to supply this information. Motion to deny request due to Mr. DePuy not supplying requested information of support by property owners of the requested change in parking restrictions, by Director Schmelzer, second by Councilman Slough. Motion passed 5-0.

3. Request of Cathy Weygandt, 204 Greenlawn Avenue, for a traffic signal at Sixth Street and Washington Avenue due to concerns of pedestrian and cyclist trying to cross over Sixth Street.

8/19/2019

Lee Weygandt stated that it is difficult and dangerous to cross Sixth Street at Washington Avenue. Suggests installing a signal similar to the one at South Main Street and Baldwin Street, a traffic tripped light and a button to push for pedestrians. Some children cross there to get to Jefferson School. Would like a study done. Director Thomas stated that there are crosswalks there but no signal. Schmelzer wants to differentiate between how long you have to wait to cross a busy road and something we would put in place to actuate to stop traffic. Would take a look at adding a midblock crossing with signalization if a significant number of students cross there to get to Jefferson School. Would like to see what the changes look like around Jefferson School before making a decision. Will be doing additional monitoring in the area due to changes we are making around Jefferson School and will monitor this area as well.

Motion to table request pending additional investigation and analysis of the proposed changes of traffic patterns around Jefferson School, by Director Schmelzer, second by Councilman Slough. Motion passed 5-0.

9/16/2019

Remains tabled.

10/21/2019

Director Schmelzer requested Chief Dunbar to place the camera trailer near the intersection of Washington Avenue and Sixth Street to monitor the number of cars and pedestrians at this intersection, and bring back results.

11/18/2019

Remains tabled.

12/16/2019

Chief Dunbar stated that the camera trailer has been set at the intersection of Sixth Street and Washington Street to monitor pedestrian and bicycle traffic traveling Washington Street across Sixth Street. The trailer has not been up long enough to gather sufficient information. Will have a report at next month's meeting. Item remains tabled.

4. Request of Sonja Huffman, Center Street Block Watch, to make the intersection of Center Street and Carnahan Street a four-way stop.

9/16/2019

Ms. Huffman stated that Findlay is growing and more people are going to Riverside Park. There are also more activities going on at Riverside Park than there used to be. Ms. Huffman stated that members of the block watch approve the intersection Center Street and Carnahan Street becoming a four-way stop. Director Thomas stated that the City does not install stop signs for speed control. Traffic warrants need to meet requirements for an intersection to become a four-way stop. Motion to obtain traffic counts for Center Street and bring back to Traffic Commission for consideration of a four-way stop at Center Street and Carnahan Street, by Chief Eberle, second by Chief Dunbar. Motion passed 3-0.

10/21/2019

Director Thomas stated that there is some merit to activity of summer vs. non summer traffic. Traffic counts will be taken as soon as able to do so.

12/16/2019

Remains tabled.

The fixed rate term can be set anywhere between 5 and 15 years, providing flexibility in deciding what will work best for your budget. These options provide business owners with an affordable financing opportunity.

The Revolving Loan Fund program was created to promote economic development through:

- Retention of our current economic base and our local businesses
- Assisting with the redevelopment of blighted and vacant areas for future use as industrial or commercial centers
- Stabilization and expansion of Hancock County and Findlay's core economies by focusing on small business development
- Attraction and relocation of existing businesses to Hancock County to provide a diverse business mix

- Land acquisition
- New construction
- Building renovation/improvements
- Machinery & equipment

- Funds to purchase an existing business in Findlay or Hancock County
- Financing options for potential buyers of an existing Findlay or Hancock County business

LOAN GUIDELINES

- Business must be operating as a for-profit entity and registered in the State of Ohio
- Business must be located in Hancock County or the City of Findlay
- Up to half of total project cost not to exceed \$490,000, with a loan minimum of \$5,000
- Must show creation or retention of at least one full-time job per \$25,000 borrowed
- Prevailing wage is required on all construction costs

LOAN TERMS AND POLICY

- The fixed interest rates will be established on a case-by-case basis and will not exceed the current prime lending rate
- Terms of the loan will be based on the useful life of the asset being purchased
- Terms of the Working Capital loan will be based on a fixed interest rate for 5 years
- Personal guaranty of borrower will be required

LOAN PROCESS

HRPC will assist in completing the loan application and compiling the required supporting documents, which includes company and personal information. The completed application is submitted to the local RLF committee for discussion and approval. Upon approval on the local level, the loan packet is then sent to the State of Ohio Department of Development for a final approval. After the State's approval, a loan closing will be scheduled with HRPC.

The estimated time frame from receiving all necessary documents to final State approval and loan closing is about **60 days.**

Microenterprise Loan Program

The Microenterprise Loan program has been established to meet the same goals as the RLF Loan Program. The Microenterprise Loan Program targets smaller loan amounts, under \$35,000, typically used for working capital or business startup expenses. The Microenterprise Loan program has extra flexibility working with applicants that the RLF does not. No private match is required for the Microenterprise Program, and the RLF can fund up to 100% of the project.

ELIGIBLE LOAN ACTIVITIES

- Fixed asset loans for the startup of new businesses
- Expansion of current businesses
- Acquisition/improvement of land and/or buildings
- Machinery & equipment
- New construction & renovation
- Demolition & site preparation

LOAN GUIDELINES

- Relocation is not an eligible activity unless the business demonstrates additional long-term job creation and/or the operation of business cannot be continued in the existing location
- Financing of speculative activities such as land banking are not included activities
- Working capital loans for startup of new businesses will be limited to 30% of the RLF program income the grantee receives in one year
- No private match is required for the Microenterprise Program, and the RLF can fund up to 100% of the project

About the RLF Program

The Revolving Loan Fund was adopted in 1989 and is administered by Hancock Regional Planning Commission. The RLF board is comprised of seven members including bankers, attorneys, local business owners, and citizens. Many successful local businesses have or are utilizing this program. Currently, RLF administers around \$1.9 million in loans to local businesses.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Dan Clinger asked for some clarification on the last page of the minutes. He asked how the water was being diverted and intercepted into "their system". He said he thought it should just say into Lye Creek. Mr. Thomas and Dan Stone agreed. Mr. Clinger made a motion to approve the minutes of the December meeting with that correction to the last sentence. Jackie Schroeder seconded. Motion carried 5-0-0.

ITEMS TABLED AT THE DECEMBER 12, 2019 MEETING

1. PRELIMINARY PLAT APPLICATION #PP-03-2019 filed by Country Club Acres, 655 Fox Run Rd, Findlay OH, for Hunter's Creek 12th, 13th, 14th and 15th Additions.

Jackie Schroeder made a motion to remove this item from the table. Dan DeArment seconded. Motion passed 5-0-0.

Mayor Muryn noted that we had a letter from the applicant requesting that this item be withdrawn from the agenda.

Dan DeArment made a motion to accept the withdrawal of Preliminary Plat Application #PP-03-2019. Dan Clinger seconded. Motion passed 5-0-0.

NEW ITEMS

1. ALLEY/STREET VACATION PETITION #AV-01-2020 filed by Habitat for Humanity, 1200 Commerce Parkway, Findlay to vacate a portion of N. Blanchard Street right-of-way formerly known as Lots 2509-2511 of the Strothers Addition to the City of Findlay.

CPC STAFF

General Information

This property is located on the southwest corner of the bend on N. Blanchard Street. It is not zoned as it is considered part of the street right-way. It is not located within the 100-year flood plain. The City of Findlay Land Use Map designates the area as General Commercial.

Parcel History

The land is a vacant grass parcel that abutted a former mobile home site. A Special Review was before CPC in May 2016 proposing to vacate this section of right-of-way.

Staff Analysis

As stated previously, Habitat submitted a Special Review request in 2016 prior to acquiring the mobile home park to see if the City would be amenable to vacating this area. The Commission was in favor of the vacation with a stipulation that the City would not want driveways onto N. Blanchard Street. An alley at the rear of the properties would provide means of access.

Staff Recommendation

CPC Staff recommends that FCPC recommend approval to Findlay City Council of ALLEY/STREET VACATION PETITION #AV-01-2020 to vacate a portion of N. Blanchard Street right-of-way formerly known as Lots 2509-2511 of the Strothers Addition to the City of Findlay.

ENGINEERING

This application is for a partial vacation of right of way along North Blanchard Street with no public utilities in the location of the proposed vacation area. This recommendation of approval does not approve the location, size, etc. of any proposed future buildings. Any future proposed building will need to provide some information regarding sight distances around the curve in correlation with any future building or structure. We would also like to add some comments regarding future structures so that the applicant can be made aware of them now.

Access- All access for futures structures will need to come off the alley that is located at the rear of the lots. No driveways will be allowed to access North Blanchard Street.

Sidewalks- There are no existing sidewalks located on this side of North Blanchard Street, if future structures are added to the lots sidewalks will need to be constructed as part of any future building project.

FIRE PREVENTION

No comment.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that FCPC recommend approval to Findlay City Council of ALLEY/STREET VACATION PETITION #AV-01-2020 to vacate a portion of N. Blanchard Street right-of-way formerly known as Lots 2509-2511 of the Strothers Addition to the City of Findlay.

DISCUSSION

Dan Stone stated that when this first came up a couple years ago, they had discussed the site line study looking north and south from the alley. If they move forward with development, they will do such based on the buildings they would propose.

Dan DeArment asked how many houses they might be planning to put here. Mr. Stone replied that they were looking at six or seven. Dan Clinger asked it the alleys between the lots might be proposed to be closed when developed. Mr. Stone said he knows one alley has a corridor of utilities in it. Judy Scrimshaw said it appears that the one farthest west is actually vacated. She stated it looks like it was labeled as mobile home park alley, but was just a driveway.

Mr. DeArment asked if some of the large trees would possibly have to be removed to clear a site line. Mr. Stone replied that it would be looked at, but if lower branches can be removed to help, that would be done. Often existing trees don't affect the site lines. Ms. Scrimshaw noted that they might lose some trees when they installed sidewalks. There are currently none along Blanchard here, but they would have to be installed as houses were built.

Dan Clinger asked if this was City property when the mobile home park was there. Mr. Stone replied yes, it has been since the curve was put in on N Blanchard. Ms. Scrimshaw noted that the City just has to mow it now. Mr. Clinger asked if there is any compensation to the City if they vacate it. Ms. Scrimshaw replied that that is not the normal practice. The City just signs it over and they are not responsible for any maintenance on it after that. Ms. Scrimshaw stated that when Jean Dove still had the mobile park and no longer wanted it, she had approached Lydia Mihalik to see if she could donate it the City since it did abut some grass area they had. She thought perhaps they would want to make a park there, but the City was not interested.

Dan DeArment asked if Habitat planned to develop this in 2020. Mr. Gibbs replied no. He stated there is no time frame at this point. At this time, their 2020 and 2021 schedule is full as far as builds. They can only do as much as they have the volunteers for.

MOTION
