Hancock Regional Planning Commission Director Matt Cordonnier - 2015 Revolving Loan Invoice

The Hancock Regional Planning Commission has submitted an invoice for their expenses/staff time for RLF administration for August 2014 through November 12, 2015 (copy attached). The invoice includes \$5,335.66 in billable hours and \$1,221.88 in reimbursable expenses provided by Coward Pinski and Associates for a total invoice of \$6,557.54. The services provide by HRPC on behalf of the City of Findlay and paid out of the Revolving Loan Fund. As of November 15th, the balance of the Findlay Revolving Loan Fund was \$243,309.00. Included with the invoice is a detailed ledger of the billable hours and copies of the paid Coward Pinski and associates invoices. This is now a routine request, and City Council has approved requesting the appropriation without going to committee each time. Authorization to draw from the Revolving Loan Fund account and appropriate funds is requested. Ordinance No. 2015-108 was created.

Law Director Rasmussen added that a special meeting will be held immediately following the public hearing. During that special meeting,, Council will vote on the ordinance. If the ordinance does not get adopted during that special meeting and goes past the end of this year, it will die and have to start over during the new Council term. Councilman Harrington encouraged all Councilmembers, if available, to attend the public hearing and special session City Council meeting.
