#### Zoning amendment request - 525 and 529 Davis St

SRC Group LLC on behalf of Mark Snyder would like to change the zoning of 525 and 529 Davis Street to M2 Multiple Family District, High Density. It currently is zoned as R2 Single Family Low Density. Needs to be referred to City Planning Commission and Planning & Zoning Committee.

#### REPORTS OF MUNICIPAL OFFICERS AND MUNICIPAL DEPARTMENTS:

Findlay Municipal Court Activities Report – July 2020.

#### Director of Public Service Thomas - Hancock Park District annual Community Park Improvement Program Grant

The City of Findlay Public Works Department once again is applying for the annual Community Park Improvement Program Grant through the Hancock Park District (HPD). The first request is for ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for assistance in restoring the band shell at Riverside Park. The band shell was built in the 1940s and is in need of restoration. A local company will do the restoration work. The City will seek any additional funds available through the HPD for this year's projects. If no additional funds are available, the City will request six thousand dollars (\$6,000) for a second project to replace picnic tables. The current wood-style shelterhouse picnic tables will be replaced with green steel tables as part of a multi-year project plan. The HPD grant is offered each year to communities within Hancock County to improve their park systems. This grant is then divided among the communities that request the available funds. These funds are at no cost to the community and do not require matching funds. The City has completed many projects in its parks utilizing these grant dollars. One requirement of the grant is to obtain project approval during a public meeting from its governing body. Legislation authorizing the restoration of the Riverside Park bandshell and the replacement Riverside Park shelterhouse picnic tables through grant funds is requested. Needs Council's verbal approval to fund said projects by grant funds.

#### Mayor Muryn - Hancock Regional Planning Commission Board appointment

Mayor Muryn is appointing Matthew Leddy to the Hancock Regional Planning Commission Board. His appointment will fill the unexpired term of Paul Craun through December 31, 2020. This appointment requires Council confirmation.

Findlay Fire Department Activities Report – July 2020.

#### Chief of Police Ring - Ohio Attorney General Law Enforcement Diversion Program grant

The Findlay Police Department has been approved to receive a fifty thousand dollar (\$50,000) grant from the Ohio Attorney General Law Enforcement Diversion Program. The purpose of this grant is to assist local agencies in their efforts to combat the opioid problem in their communities. The Findlay Police Department has collaborated with the Family Resource Center in operating a team called the Quick Response Team (QRT). This has been in operations since late 2017. Within seventy-two (72) hours of a person experiencing a drug overdose, a Coordinator from the Family Resources Center and a Findlay Police Officer will make contact with that person. The purpose of this contact is to make the person aware of the opportunities available for treatment and recovery. These funds from the Ohio Attorney General will be used to reimburse the Family Resource Center for the salary and expenses of a Coordinator. This is the third (3<sup>rd</sup>) year that the City has been awarded this grant. There is no City match for the grant, but it is a reimbursement grant where the City needs to pay the initial cost. A fifty thousand dollar (\$50,000) appropriation to the PD Quick Response Team Grant FY2021, Project No. 31903500 is requested to receive all three (3) readings during the next City Council meeting. Ordinance No. 2020-094 was created.

#### Chief of Police Ring – Northeast Ohio Medical University grant

The Findlay Police Department has been awarded a forty thousand dollar (\$40,000) grant from the Northeast Ohio Medical University (NEOMED) to supplement the department's Crisis Intervention Team Program. The purpose of this grant is to assist local agencies in their efforts to train Officers in the CIT curriculum, to purchase supplies for the training and to pay trainers to conduct training. There is no City match for the grant, but the City would have to make the initial payment for any costs incurred. NEOMED would then reimburse those costs not to exceed the grant amount. The Findlay Police Department has been involved with the CIT program since 2003. The CIT program gives officers training in de-escalating persons who are in mental crisis. This funding will help expand the program and its training reach. Legislation to appropriate forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to the 2020 Police Department CIT Support and Expansion Project No. 31903700 is requested. Ordinance No. 2020-095 was created.

#### Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – 2020 annual sewer and manhole lining project no. 35600600

By authorization of Ordinance No. 2020-014, a bid opening was held for this project on August 6, 2020. Bids were received from four (4) potential contractors with the base bid amounts ranging from \$267,928.33 to \$324,835.05. There were also five (5) alternates that were part of the bid. Alternate prices ranged from \$36,323.68 to \$109,498.80. The lowest and best bid was received from Miller Pipeline, LLC, of Indianapolis, Indiana. This project is included in the 2020 Capital Improvements Plan with an estimated cost of \$400,000. \$3,500 was previously appropriated for startup, putting together the plans and bidding of the project. Legislation to appropriate funds is requested. Ordinance No. 2020-096 was created.

#### Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – E Front St emergency sewer repair project no. 3560XX00

East Front Street is on the resurfacing list for this year. The curb has been replaced and the asphalt contractor would like to pave the street in a couple of weeks. During the curb replacement, the Engineering Department noticed some damaged area in the pavement. City crews televised the sewer in the street and discovered three (3) locations where the sewer needs to be replaced. Since the sewer is located within the pavement area, the repairs need to be completed before the street is resurfaced. The existing sewer is deeper than what City crews feel comfortable repairing, so a quote is being obtained from a contractor to do the repair work. An appropriation of funds is requested so that the contractor can begin work as soon as possible in order to complete paving work as soon as possible. This project is estimated to be completed for under \$45,000.00. Legislation authorizing the Service Director or City Engineer to enter into contracts for construction and to appropriate funds is requested. Ordinance No. 2020-097 was created.

## Service Director/Acting City Engineer Thomas – MLK Parkway improvements project no. 3XX0XX00; ODOT FY21 resurfacing project no. 32801400

The County is finalizing the plans for the MLK Parkway Improvements. This project will elevate the East Main Cross/East Street/MLK Intersection and the MLK Clinton Court Intersection so that the roadway will remain open in a 100-year flood event. During Capital Plan discussions, it was mentioned that the County is paying all expenses for the design and construction of this project and that the City will bid the project and perform inspection services during construction. Legislation to appropriate funds into this project to enable the Engineer to bid the project when the plans are completed is requested. The Engineering Department is finishing up the plans for the ODOT FY21 resurfacing of Bright Road from SR 568 to Tiffin Avenue. While construction for this project will not be until the 2021 construction season, the Engineering Department would like to bid the project as soon as the plans are completed. Legislation authorizing the Service Director or City Engineer to advertise for bids, enter into contracts for construction, and appropriate and transfer funds is requested. 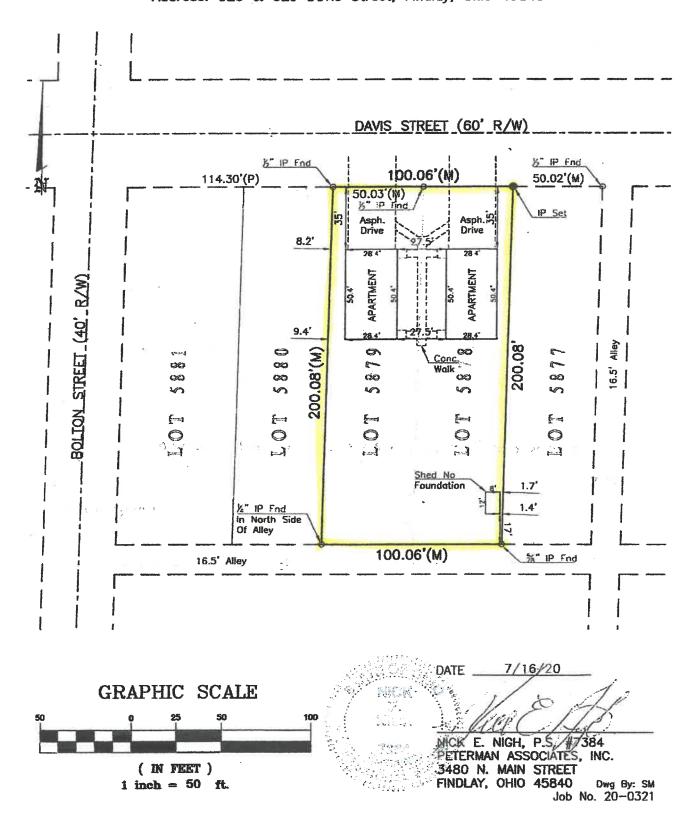

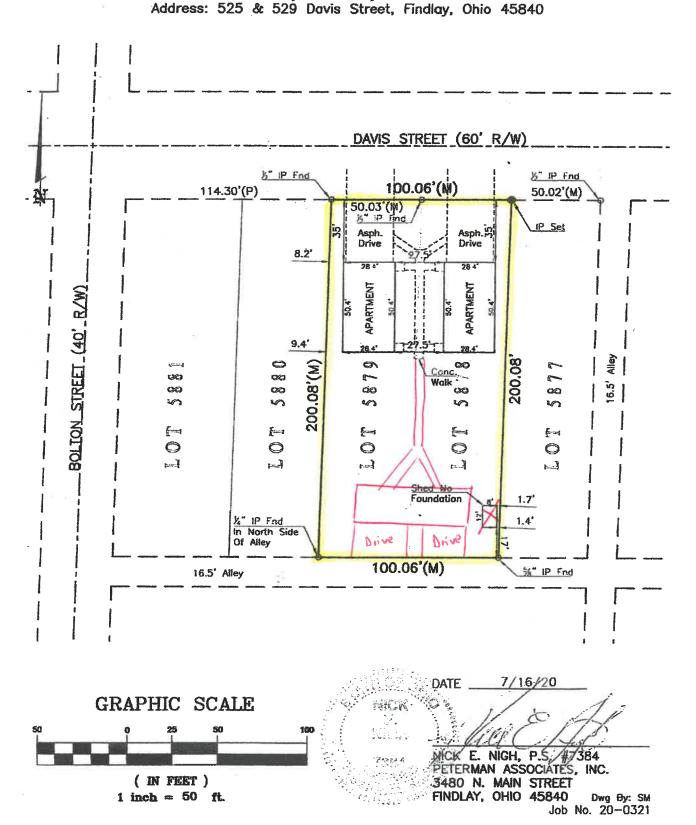

City law requires persons requesting the vacation of a street or alley to file a petition with City Council. Council then refers the request to the City Planning Commission and the Planning & Zoning Committee for their findings. These Committees file their report with Council, who in turn makes the final ruling on the request.

#### **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

Petition forms are available in the Council Clerk's Office. It requires the signature of a majority of the property owners that abut the requested vacation. A plat of the area shall accompany the application indicating the street or alley to be vacated. This plat can be obtained from the City Engineer's Office.

In addition to the petition for an alley vacation being signed by the abutting property owners, which is notice, if said proposed alley vacation is less than the full alley running from street to street, either north and south or east and west as the case may be, then the Clerk will also send notices to the abutting property owners on that portion of the alley extended but not in the request for vacation. For example, if an alley runs from north to south from street A to street B, intersected by a east-west alley, and the request is to vacate the alley running from street A to the intersecting east-west alley, then the abutting property owners on the remaining portion of that north-south alley between street A and street B shall also receive notice of the petition to vacate from the Council Clerk. (Rules of Procedure, as amended, of Findlay City Council).

Ideally, the petition must be signed by all abutting property owners. If not, a Public Notice of Consideration to Vacate has to be advertised in the Courier for six consecutive weeks. The cost of the advertising shall be paid by the petitioner. Anyone wishing to address Council concerning the petition may do so as a result of the publication. This can occur at any of the three readings which Council must give an Ordinance that vacates right-of-way.

#### FEE

At the time of submitting the request to the Council Clerk, a \$75.00 non-refundable fee shall accompany the petition. This is to off-set some of the City's expenses. Upon adoption of legislation, applicable advertising and filing fees will be invoiced to the petitioner.

By law, if there were assessments to the abutting properties for improvements to the street or utilities, the petitioners are to pay the assessment fee for the property being vacated. These assessments, if any, are recorded in the City Engineer's Office. They are requested to be researched for the property upon legislation request. The petitioners will be invoiced for the total expense, and it must be paid before Council will vacate the street or alley.

#### **PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION**

Planning Commission action on vacation petitions will be in the form of a recommendation to City Council. Council may then either concur with the Commission's recommendation or override it. Concurring action may be accomplished with a simple majority vote, while overriding action requires a two-thirds (2/3) vote of Council. Notice of the Planning Commission Meeting will be sent from the Engineer's Office to the filer of the petition advising him/her when the request shall be heard.

#### **COMMITTEE ACTION**

This Committee's action will be in the form of a recommendation to City Council. Council may then either concur with the Committee's recommendation or override it. Action is a simple majority vote to concur or override the Committee report. Notice of the Planning & Zoning Committee Meeting will be sent by the Council Clerk to the petitioners advising them when the request shall be heard.

#### **CITY COUNCIL ACTION**

Once the petition is placed on Council's agenda, it will be referred to the City Planning Commission and the Committee with all documentation submitted. Both the City Planning

Commission and the Planning & Zoning Committee shall review the request. Upon their findings, Council will request legislation and give it three (3) separate readings if the vacation is to proceed.

In order to vacate a public right-of-way, City Council must adopt an ordinance doing so. Normally, legislation is prepared when the Planning & Zoning Committee recommends that an action be taken. However, appropriate legislation can be drawn at the request of any Council member, whether or not the vacation is supported by the Committee. Ordinances require three readings prior to adoption, and this normally occurs over the course of three consecutive meetings of Council.

A majority affirmative vote of at least five (5) members is necessary to enact a vacation ordinance. If Council disagrees with the Planning Commission's recommendation, it will take six (6) affirmative votes of members of Council to enact a vacation ordinance. The ordinance is not effective until at least 30 days after signing by the Mayor.

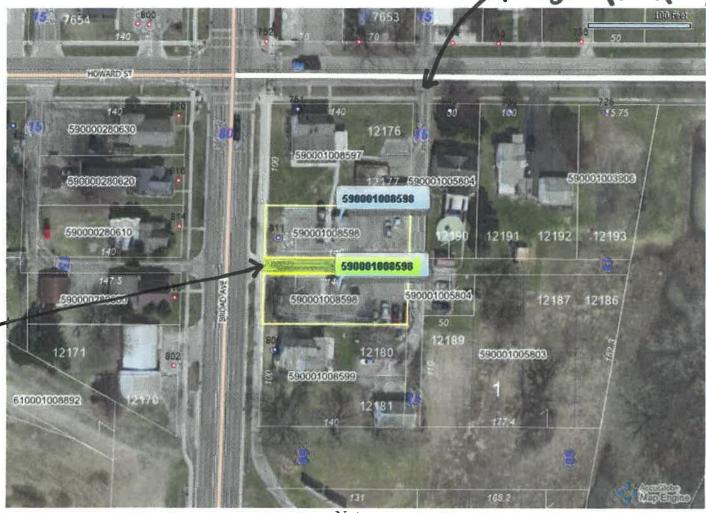

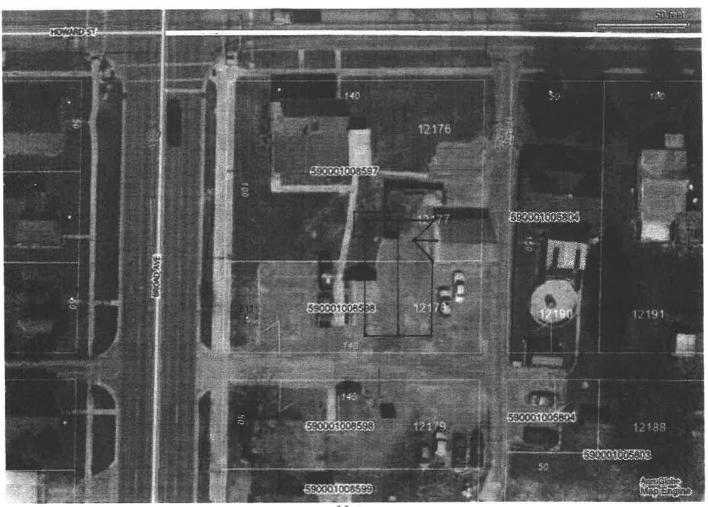

The City of Findlay Public Works Department once again is applying for the annual Community Park Improvement Program Grant through the Hancock Park District (HPD). The first request is for \$10,000.00 for assistance in restoring the bandshell at Riverside Park. The band shell was built in the 1940's and in need of restoration. A local company will be used to perform this project. If there are additional funds that could be acquired for this year's projects from the HPD grant, the City will ask for it to be added to the first request. If additional funds are not available, the City will request \$6,000.00 for a second project to replace picnic tables. The old wood style picnic tables in the shelter houses will be replaced with new green steel tables as part of a multi-year project plan.

The HPD grant is offered each year to communities within Hancock County to improve their park systems. This grant is then divided among the communities that request the available funds. These funds are at no cost to the community and do not require matching funds. The City has completed many projects in our parks using these grant dollars.

One of the requirements of the grant is to "obtain project approval during a public meeting from its governing body." Therefore, I am requesting that Council approve the aforementioned projects to be funded by the grant funds.

The Findlay Police Department has been approved to receive a \$50,000.00 grant from the Ohio Attorney General Law Enforcement Diversion Program. The purpose of this grant is to assist local agencies in their efforts to combat the opioid problem in their communities. The Findlay Police Department has collaborated with Family Resource Center in operating a team called the Quick Response Team (QRT). This has been in operation since late 2017. The Findlay Police Department has been awarded a \$40,000.00 grant from the Northeast Ohio Medical University (NEOMED) to supplement the department's Crisis Intervention Team Program. The purpose of this grant is to assist local agencies in their efforts to train officers in the CIT curriculum, to purchase supplies for the training and to pay trainers to conduct training. There is no match required for the grant, but the City would have to make the initial payment for any costs incurred. NEOMED would then reimburse those costs not to exceed the grant amount.

The Findlay Police Department has been involved with the CIT program since 2003. The CIT program gives officers training in regards to de-escalating persons who are in mental crisis. This funding will help expand the program and its training reach.

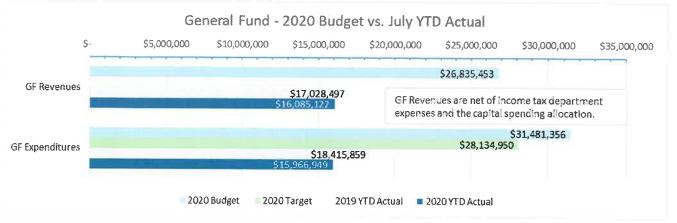

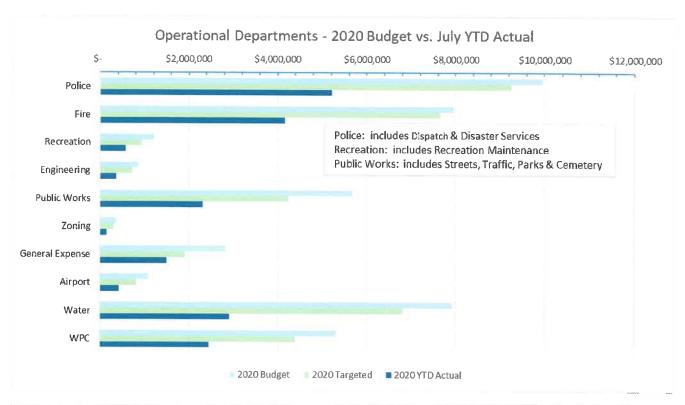
